



Disaster FoodShare Benefits for Flood Victims

The U.S. Department of Agriculture and the Department of Health and Family Services (DHFS) have approved a plan to issue emergency food assistance to residents in counties who were affected by the flood. (See page 2 for a list of these agencies.)

These benefits will be available through FoodShare Wisconsin to help flood victims who are having money problems. The benefits will be put in an account and can be used to buy food with the Wisconsin QUEST debit card at any grocery store accepting the QUEST card.

Area residents who would not be able to get benefits under the regular FoodShare rules may be able to get Disaster FoodShare benefits if:

- Their home, belongings, or place of employment was damaged or destroyed, or
- They have disaster-related expenses, or
- They have lost income, food or money as a result of the floods.

The amount of benefits will vary depending on family size. A family of three might be able to get as much as \$426 in Disaster FoodShare benefits.

Flood victims who currently get FoodShare benefits may also be able to get supplemental benefits.

Local county or tribal agencies will determine if victims of the flooding are able to get Disaster FoodShare benefits.

NOTE: When applying, you should bring proof of your identity and residency, if possible.
