

Linking U.S. Agriculture to the World The Foreign Agricultural Service (FAS) of the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) works to improve foreign market access for U.S. products, build new markets, improve the competitive position of U.S. agriculture in the global marketplace, and provide food aid and technical assistance to foreign countries. FAS has the primary responsibility for USDA's international activities—market development, trade agreements and negotiations, and the collection and analysis of statistics and market information. It also administers USDA's ex-

port credit guarantee and food aid programs, and helps increase income and food availability in developing nations by mobilizing expertise for agriculturally led economic growth. FAS enhances U.S. agriculture's competitiveness by providing linkages to global resources and international organizations.

By reading and completing the activities in this booklet, your child or students will know more about how the United States shares food and other agricultural products with the world. For more information about FAS, please visit:






Here are some important terms and definitions used when sharing agricultural products and food with other countries:



A many for is 2,204.6 pounds! Many for is the unit most commonly used to measure the mass of imported and exported agricultural products.




A GROP is any product such as a grain, fruit, or vegetable. After a GROP is grown, it is either exported or distributed in the United States. Total cropland in the United States is 455 million acres.



The WTO makes rules for trading agricultural products and food among countries. The WTO makes sure that all agricultural products and food are traded fairly and smoothly.



In 2004, the United States exported 885,000 metric tons of fresh, frozen, processed, and seed **policipes** to other countries.



In 2004, the United States shipped 48.8 million metric tons of @MD to different countries.



In 2004, the United States exported more than 3.1 million metric tons of COGOD all around the world. COGOD is used every day to make fabrics for clothes and furniture.



The United States is the second largest OPODED JURG producer in the world!



In 2004, the United States exported more than 2 billion @???? around the world. The average hen lays 270 @???? per year.



The United States provides over half of the world's food and to people in needy countries through food and programs. In 2004, the United States gave over \$1.1 billion in food aid.



The United States has a **food for Chredien** program that gives food to less fortunate children around the world so they can learn and be healthy.



In 2005, the United States exported 28.5 million metric tons of WBBB to other countries. WBBB is used to make food products, such as bread, cereal, pasta, and even licorice!




California produces 89 percent of all the SPAPES grown in the United States. These SPAPES are used for fresh fruit, raisins, juice, jam, jelly, and wine.




Here are some types of food you might eat at someone's home in Egypt. They are some of the foods that the United States exports to Egypt.



Circle the food that does not belong.




Put a state around all dairy products and a free around fruits and vegetables.
