

SJI Board Approves Grants for Third Quarter

The SJI Board of Directors met in Alexandria, Virginia, on May 10-11, 2007, to review applications for the third quarter of fiscal year 2007. Four Project grants were approved with approval pending for a fifth one. Three Partner grants have been approved pending finalization of the required partnerships, in addition to four Technical Assistance (TA) and two Curriculum Adaptation & Training (CAT) grants, for a total of \$394,665. The pending Partner grants will add considerably to this total. **Plan to get those applications to SJI by August 1, 2007. They will be considered at the Board meeting in September.** 

Included in the Project grants for immediate funding are projects to support the National Judicial Conference on Self-represented Litigation, to be held in November 2007 at Harvard Law School, and funding to establish and support In-State Annual Court Media Programs.

Four TA applications were approved by the Board. These will support two strategic planning projects, one in the Northern Mariana Islands and the other in Spokane County, Washington. Another TA award will be going to the National Center for State Courts to support the development of Performance Measures for the Teen Courts operating in Colorado. The final TA funded this quarter will support a compensation study for the Franklin County Court of Common Pleas in Ohio.

The two approved CAT grants will support training programs for the Georgia Council of Court Administrators and the 20th Judicial Circuit, Ottawa County Probate Court in Michigan. Both of these programs are based on the National Association for Court Management's (NACM) Core Competency Curriculum Guidelines.

There are Partnership grants being developed now, and while the total funding for these grants has not yet been determined, it will be reported as the budgets are finalized. SJI is very pleased that the grant applications are coming in on a regular basis. We are continuing to address court issues to a greater extent than before.e-SJI
