# SJI BOARD AWARDS FINAL GRANTS FOR FY 2007

The SJI Board of Directors held its final meeting for the fiscal year on September 21, 2007, in Alexandria, Virginia. During this meeting, the Board awarded approximately \$400,000 in new grants. These will fund a wide range of activities, including two grants to the Vermont Supreme Court to improve court interpreter services and document conversion, weighted caseloads for probation officers in Colorado, the development of a guide to the D.C. Juvenile Justice System, and the design and implementation of a court performance measurement system for the Montana courts.


#### **Grant Applications are Increasing**

The total amount awarded (excluding Partnership Grants) in FY 2007 for Project Grants, Technical Assistance Grants, Curriculum & Adaptation Training

Grants, and Scholarships was \$2.06 million. However, total grant applications requested (excluding Partnership Grants) for FY 2007 was \$3.95 million, an increase in requests of \$1.46 million (58%) over FY 2006, and \$2.73 million (223%) over FY 2005 (see chart below).

In FY 2006, Congress directed SJI to require cash match for its grants. The availability of match funding from grantees has been amazing. In FY 2005, the requests for funding included only \$392,892 as cash match, and most of this was for small grant programs. In comparison, for the FY 2007 applications, there was over \$3.66 million available for cash match, most of which was for larger project grants. This clearly demonstrates that Congress' intent to leverage match funding to support court projects is working.

# TEEN COURTS IN COLORADO

9 teen courts associated with municipal courts, and the proposed project will enable those courts to develop measures most appropriate for each. The project recently began, and 10 teen court coordinators have participated so far. NCSC is now collecting data on the performance measures that

have been identified. It was reported to SJI that this grant has reinforced the teen court coor-

dinators' dedication to serving the teen population and improving their individual courts. Now the coordinators are working to find a new way to continue their efforts and maintain communication with each other. They have considered starting a state association of teen court coordinators. The performance measures will be distributed to all the teen courts in Colorado in the near future.

# CHANGES TO THE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM FOR FY 2008

SJI will be maintaining all five types of grant programs in FY 2008; Project Grants, Partner Grants, Technical Assistance Grants, Curriculum Adaptation & Training Grants, and Scholarships. The new Guideline for FY 2008 will be published in the Federal Register within the next couple of weeks, and it will contain some changes to the Scholarship program. Here are some of the changes for FY 2008:

- 1) The Board of Directors discussed the importance of Scholarships during the September 21, 2007, Board meeting. Specifically, the Board highlighted the continued need and voted to continue the program in FY 2008, although at a reduced level due to other funding priorities. Therefore, the amount available for scholarships has been reduced from \$250,000 to \$175,000 for FY 2008.
- 2) Scholarship funding may not be used for attendance at annual conferences or meetings. Funds may only be used for attendance at an educational program designed specifically for judges and court managers, and that addresses issues essential to judicial and court administrative personnel.

3) Scholarship applications will be reviewed on a "first come/first considered" basis. No longer will an applicant need to wait for the quarter preceding the education program to submit a scholarship application to SJI. The applications will be reviewed on a quarterly basis, and we will distribute available funding as evenly as possible across the fiscal year. However, applicants are strongly urged to apply as soon as a program has been identified, since applications may be submitted at any time. Those received by the first day of the second month of a fiscal quarter will be reviewed, and awards will be made by the end of each fiscal quarter. This means the next due date is November 1, 2007, and scholarship applications must be received by that date; it is no longer a mail due date. The remaining due dates in FY 2008 are February 1, May 1, and August 1. Please be aware there are new application forms for this program available on the SJI website.
