The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's (NOAA) Office of Ocean and Coastal Resource Management (OCRM) provides national leadership and strategic direction to key partnership programs for coastal and ocean management. OCRM partners with various levels of government, regional and international organizations, academic and private organizations, and industries to combine federal expertise and resources with local knowledge and management practices. OCRM programs work collectively to provide a broad range of expertise and assistance to our partners.

PRIORITY ACTIONS

Based on the OCRM Strategic Plan, this Action Agenda highlights the priority products and services that OCRM will focus on from 2007 to 2009. OCRM will strengthen existing partnerships and foster new collaborations to achieve these priority outcomes to support the following OCRM strategic goals:

Goal 1: Protect and restore coastal and ocean resources to sustain ecological functions, cultural heritage, and economic benefits.

Goal 2: Build resilient coastal communities that value and sustain healthy oceans and coasts.

Goal 3: Improve people's ability and willingness to take actions that benefit coastal communities and ecosystems.

ONGOING CORE ACTIVITIES

OCRM remains dedicated to our partnerships and open to new opportunities to achieve the priority actions while improving our core functions. These core activities include:

- Ensuring accountability for use of federal funds
- Evaluating national policies that influence coastal and ocean management
- Establishing partnerships to implement joint programs with other federal agencies
- Resolving conflicts between state and federal agencies over uses affecting the coastal zone

- Improving environmental literacy and implementing education programs
- Training managers and future scientists
- Supporting coastal and estuarine land conservation
- Assessing effectiveness through evaluations, performance measures, and program reviews
- Strengthening programs by updating management plans and reviewing program changes
- Providing opportunities for public input into decision-making
- Communicating key messages to stakeholders

- Increase delivery and use of real-time data and NOAAgenerated science

- Raise public awareness through National Estuaries Day, Estuaries Live, Coastweek, and International Year of the Reef

- Designate new reserves in Wisconsin and Connecticut
- Establish Illinois CZM Program
- Develop and begin implementing National MPA System

- Identify common coral reef protection goals through Local Action Strategies
