Employing more than 400 joint military and civilian personnel, JPAC has spanned the globe in search of missing Americans since its inception in 2003. Working alongside other U.S. and foreign specialists, JPAC personnel investigate, recover and identify remains of Americans unaccounted-for from World War II, the Korean War, the Vietnam War and the Cold War.

FORENSIC SCIENCE ACADEMY



In 2008, the JPAC's Central Identification Laboratory opened the Forensic Science Academy, an advanced forensic anthropology program

consisting of five courses, taught under the auspices of the Department of Defense.

Students (Fellows) receive training in a variety of areas, including identifying and reconstructing fragmentary and complete human skeletons, establishing a biological profile, skeletal pathology and trauma, photography, terrestrial and underwater archaeological equipment and methods, Geographic Information Systems and remote sensing and DNA sampling.

Fellows are assigned skeletal cases and are required to submit forensic anthropology reports detailing their findings. After extensive classroom instruction, Fellows deploy on a military search and recovery team in Southeast Asia and assist in the archaeological excavation of a crash site or burial. Fellows also study at Khon Kaen University, Thailand, honing their skills in human variation, bone disease and innovative methods

Applications are accepted throughout the year but must be submitted for each fall program before April 15. Students accepted for the fall program will be notified in May. Selection is based on academic performance and recommendation of faculty members.

Fellows receive a one-time \$12,000 stipend and can arrange to receive up to 15 semester hours of credit through their university.

There are several unique fellowship opportunities at JPAC available through the Oak Ridge Institute for Science and Education. Fellowships are one year and can be renewed for up to three years for post-baccalaureate and master's degree Fellows and up to five years for postdoctoral Fellows.
