



#### Fiscal Year 2012 Missions

During Fiscal Year 2012 (Oct. 1, 2011 through Sep. 30, 2012), JPAC is scheduled to deploy more than 85 investigation and recovery teams on 30 missions to 11 countries. Of those, 60 teams are deploying to support Vietnam War operations, 9 are supporting Korean War operations, and 17 are supporting World War II operations.


## National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific (Punchbowl)
