POSITION OVERVIEW

This position reports directly to the Honorable Barbara J. Houser, Chief U.S. Bankruptcy Judge. Duties include some administrative matters, assisting the Judge with docket preparation, researching a variety of legal issues, drafting orders and opinions, proofreading and verifying citations, communicating with counsel regarding procedural requirements, and assisting the Judge during courtroom proceedings. Additionally, the incumbent acts as advisor to the Judge, making recommendations based on the law. This opportunity is available immediately.

REQUIREMENTS

Graduate of accredited law school and at least one year of legal work experience after graduation. Superior writing and research skills. Ability to analyze complex legal questions. Ability to comprehend a wide range of legal concepts, principles and practices. Ability to communicate persuasively both orally and in writing. Thorough knowledge of the Bankruptcy Code and Rules of Procedure preferred. Experience in the practice of law or as a research attorney, prior clerkship experience, and bar membership are a substantial plus, but are not required. Bar membership required for appointment at JSP 12 level.

BENEFITS:
