

#### Be an Optimist




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First, I don't believe we will ever <u>recover</u> these fishes.


Nor do I expect that buffalo will freely roam the great plains.












Razorback sucker believed to be extirpated from Lake Mead by the 1980s and because of the tremendous populations of non-native fishes, recovery of any native Colorado River fish in Lake Mead was un fathomable, unthinkable, impossible!



# OVER THE PAST 15 YEARS BIO-WEST HAS DOCUMENTED PERSISTENT ANNUAL RECRUITMENT OF RAZORBACK SUCKER, CAPTURING OVER 100 SUBADULT RAZORBACK SUCKER FROM LAKE MEAD





W.L. Minckley reported in 1979 that none of the 600 flannelmouth sucker stocked below Davis Dam in 1976 by AGFD had been seen since their introduction, inferring that the stocking failed.

But today we know this action was a great success.




#### 2 - GET OFF YOUR BUTT AND GO LOOK




#### A SCIENTIST IS A TRAINED OBSERVER, SO GO OBSERVE




#### **TODAY YUMA COVE IS USED FOR GROW-OUT**




#### STAY ENGAGED - GIVE TIME TIME
