Whereas, the LCR MSCP has been funding Work Task E1 Beal Lake Riparian Restoration for Restoration Research;

Whereas, the Final Implementation Report, Fiscal Year 2010 Work Plan and Budget, Fiscal Year 2008 Accomplishment Report, Work Task E1 states that a technical report will be prepared to evaluate the potential for the Beal Lake Riparian site to be included within the LCR MSCP;

Whereas, a technical report has been prepared documenting that the Beal Lake Riparian Restoration Project will provide at least 107 acres of habitat for covered species currently found utilizing the site;

Whereas, additional acreage may be incorporated into the Beal Lake Riparian project in the future and additional covered species habitat may be developed through adaptive management at the Beal Lake Site;

Whereas, this site is strategically located with Reach 3, in close proximity to existing covered species habitat, especially currently occupied southwestern willow flycatcher breeding habitat:

Whereas the Program Manager is recommending that the Beal Lake Restoration Project be included with in the LCR MSCP; now, therefore, be it

Resolved that the Steering Committee concurs with the recommendation to include the Beal Lake Restoration Project into the Lower Colorado River Multi-Species Conservation Program
