

FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT ANNUAL REPORT

October 1, 2006 - September 30, 2007

We prepared our annual Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) report pursuant to the requirements of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552(e), and guidance issued by the Office of Information and Privacy of the U.S. Department of Justice. Our FOIA annual report covers the 2007 fiscal year from October 1, 2006 to September 30, 2007.

II. How to Make a FOIA Request

To make a FOIA request for Finance Board records, you should submit a written request that includes a clear and specific description of the records or information you want, along with your name, address, telephone number, and e-mail address, if any. We may assess a fee to process your request in accordance with our FOIA regulation, which is codified at 12 C.F.R. part 910. You can submit your FOIA request by regular mail to the FOIA Officer, Federal Housing Finance Board, 1625 Eye Street NW, Washington DC 20006. You also may submit your request by fax at 202-408-2580, or electronically at FOIA@fhfb.gov. If you need further assistance you may send an e-mail to FOIA@fhfb.gov or call 202-408-2511.

A. Response-time ranges.

It is our policy to respond promptly to all FOIA requests. We make every effort to respond within the 20 working days time limit provided by the FOIA. We responded to all but 2 of the 43 FOIA requests we processed during the 2007 fiscal year within 20 working days.



- B. Why did we not grant some requests?
- The requested records or information were exempt from disclosure to the public under one or more FOIA exemptions.
- We did not have any records responsive to the request.

III. <u>Definitions of Terms and Acronyms Used in the Annual Report</u>

Finance Board: The independent executive agency established by Congress as the Federal Housing Finance Board.

FY: Fiscal year.

FOIA/PA request: Freedom of Information Act/Privacy Act request. A FOIA request generally is a request for access to records concerning a third party, an organization, or a particular topic of interest. A Privacy Act request is a request for records concerning oneself; such requests also are treated as FOIA requests. (All requests for access to records, regardless of which law is cited by the requester, are included in this report.)

Initial request: A request to a federal agency for access to records under the FOIA.

Appeal: A request to a federal agency asking that it review at a higher administrative level a full denial or partial denial of access to records under the FOIA, or any other FOIA determination such as a matter pertaining to fees.

Processed request or appeal: A request or appeal for which an agency has taken a final action in all respects.

Multi-track processing: A system in which simple requests requiring relatively minimal review are placed in one processing track and more voluminous or complex requests are placed in one or more other tracks. Requests in each track are processed on a first-in/first out basis. A requester who has an urgent need for records may request expedited processing (see below).

Expedited processing: An agency will process a FOIA request on an expedited basis when a requester has shown an exceptional need or urgency for the records that warrants prioritization of the request over other earlier requests.

Simple request: A FOIA request that an agency using multi-track processing places in its fastest (non-expedited) track based on the volume or simplicity of the requested records.

Complex request: A FOIA request that an agency using multi-track processing places in a slower track based on the volume or complexity of requested records.

Grant: An agency decision to disclose all records in full in response to a FOIA request.

Partial grant: An agency decision to disclose a record in part in response to a FOIA request, deleting information determined to be exempt under one or more of the FOIA's exemptions; or a decision to disclose some records in their entirety, but to withhold others in whole or in part.

Denial: An agency decision not to release any part of a record or records in response to a FOIA request because all of the information in the requested records is determined by the agency to be exempt under one or more FOIA exemptions, or for some procedural reason (such as because no record is located in response to a FOIA request).

Time limits: The time period in the FOIA for an agency to respond to a FOIA request (ordinarily 20 working days from proper receipt of a "perfected" FOIA request).

"Perfected" request: A FOIA request for records that adequately describes the records sought, has been received by the agency's FOIA office, and for which there is no remaining question about the payment of applicable fees.

Exemption 3 statute: A federal statute other than the FOIA that prohibits the disclosure of a certain type of information; basis for withholding information under FOIA section (b)(3).

Median number: The middle, not average, number. For example, of 3, 7 and 14, the median number is 7.

Average number: The number obtained by dividing the sum of a group of numbers by the quantity of numbers in the group. For example, of 3, 7 and 14, the average number is 8.

XII. Report on FOIA Executive Order Implementation

- A. We have not supplemented or modified our May 2006 FOIA Improvement Plan.
- B. We completed implementation of our FOIA Improvement Plan in June 2006. At that time, we transmitted to Finance Board staff revised internal FOIA procedures that include an easy to read graphic timeline and agency IT staff completed software installation and staff training for our new high speed, multi-page scanner with redacting capabilities that allows us to respond electronically to more requests and more quickly to requests that we have to process in hard copy.
- C. We met all milestones in our FOIA Improvement Plan.
- D. We have no other executive order-related activities to report.
- E. Generally, exempt information at the Finance Board includes examination records (FOIA Exemption 8); records that if released, would cause an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy (FOIA Exemption 6); confidential proprietary business information (FOIA Exemption 4); internal communications regarding proposed Finance Board and Federal Home Loan Bank policies and initiatives (FOIA Exemption 5); and law enforcement investigative records (FOIA Exemption 7). As a matter of policy, we consider making discretionary disclosures of exempt information whenever possible. The Finance Board strives to achieve maximum responsible information disclosure through this discretionary disclosure policy.

F. We had no FOIA requests pending at the end of FY 2007 or on January 1, 2008. We did not receive or process any consultations and had no consultations pending at the end of FY 2007 or on January 1, 2008.
