FTS CODE CHANGES JULY 1

Effective July 1, 1971, NAL's FTS identification code will be changed as follows:

OLD	ID	CODE
JK-8	39-5	59

NEW	ID	CODE

An employee placing a call to an off-net telephone number should give the FTS Operator his name, ID Code and the telephone number being called. An employee in travel status should so advise the FTS Operator when placing calls from off-net to on-net locations.

As a reminder, all long distance calls (excluding the 312 Area Code) should be made on the FTS network. Refer to your FTS Directory.
