Money Market Added with Other Changes to TIAA-CREF

Important changes to TIAA-CREF became effective on April 1, 1988. A CREF Money Market Account was added as a new investment option. The telephone service was expanded and all funds accumulating in TIAA, the CREF Stock Account, and the CREF Money Market Account will be credited daily. Going into the Hospital

This is a reminder to participants in the Connecticut General (CG) medical plan. Should you or a member of your family require admittance to a hospital for an over-night stay, a special procedure must be followed. The hospital stay must be pre-certified. You can do this by completing the pre-certification form available from the Benefits Office, and in emergency situations you can call the pre-certification number on your CG identification card within 24 hours of admittance. Failure to follow the procedure will result in a reduction of the hospital reimbursement by 50%.

Check your CG I.D. card for the pre-certification number (INTRACORP - 1-800-633-9900). A replacement card is available from the Benefits Office (WH 15E) if you need one. A detailed description of the pre-certification procedure and penalty is in your Connecticut General Group Insurance Plan booklet (pages 9-10) and in your Fermilab Pension & Group Insurance Programs handbook (page 19). Please take the time to review the information. A mistake can be costly.

Pool membership is open to Fermilab employees, visiting researchers, employees of DOE at Fermilab, Security Personnel at Fermilab, their families and accompanied paid guests.
