Homeowner Road Home Accomplishments to date: March 31st, 2016

- 130,060 homeowners have had their benefits calculated and of those, 130,042 (99.99%) homeowners have closed on their Road Home grant with disbursements totaling \$9,010,207,142. The average award is \$69,287.
- 119,233 (92%) of these homeowners have decided to stay and rebuild in Louisiana. Rebuilding resources provided to Option 1 homeowners totaling \$8,087,078,068. The average award is \$67,826.
- 61,655 additional disbursements have been closed for a total of \$1,717,688,032. The average additional disbursement is \$27,860.
- 54% of all Road Home dollars (\$4,878,288,173) have been provided to 56,128 low to moderate income households. The average award is \$86,914.
- 46,144 homeowners have received \$2,126,649,134 in Additional Compensation Grants (ACG) to supplement their recovery needs.
- 30,030 elderly applicants have closed for a total of \$2,404,768,068. The average award is \$80,079.
- 17,591 disabled (self-reporting) applicants have closed for a total of \$1,307,265,550. The average award is \$74,314.
- BRGA funding has been provided to 488 homeowners totaling \$16,083,467.
- IMM funding has been provided to 25,729 homeowners totaling \$192,734,391.
- 62% of the 116,743 applicants monitored through this period have been dispositioned Compliant. 35 of the 38 work-in-progress parishes have greater than 40% compliancy.
