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## Yonkers City Court Judge Resigns, Ending Inquiry into Misconduct Allegations

The New York State Commission on Judicial Conduct has completed formal proceedings against Robert C. Cerrato, a Judge of the Yonkers City Court, Westchester County, who agreed in a stipulation with the Commission's Administrator to vacate his judicial office.<sup>1</sup>

Judge Cerrato agreed that on October 1, 2015, he would notify the Office of Court Administration and the New York State and Local Retirement System that he would relinquish his judicial office effective January 1, 2016. Judge Cerrato also stipulated that he would neither seek nor accept judicial office at any time in the future.

Under the terms of the stipulation, Judge Cerrato waived the statutory provision of confidentiality applicable to Commission proceedings, to the limited extent that the stipulation and Commission's decision and order would be made public.

Judge Cerrato, has served as a Judge of the Yonkers City Court since 2001, and his current term expires on December 31, 2020.

The stipulation states that Judge Cerrato was served with a Formal Written Complaint dated February 20, 2015, containing two charges, which alleged, *inter alia*, that the judge:

- Invoked his judicial title on several occasions when he called third parties on behalf of his daughter regarding incidents arising from the matrimonial dispute between his daughter and her then-husband;
- Charged a flat fee of \$200 to officiate at weddings that took place outside the City of Yonkers, notwithstanding General Municipal Law \$805-b, which limits the fees for the solemnization of marriage to \$100.

Judge Cerrato entered into the stipulation in lieu of filing an Answer.

## Statistics Relating to Prior Commission Decisions

The Commission has accepted 53 such stipulations since the procedure was instituted in 2003.

Since 1978, the Commission has issued 258 determinations of admonition against judges in New York State, 313 determinations of censure and 168 determinations of removal.

The Court of Appeals has reviewed 95 Commission determinations. The Court accepted the Commission's sanctions in 79 cases (70 of which were removals, six were censures and three were admonitions). Of the remaining 16 cases, two sanctions were increased from censure to removal, and 13 were reduced: nine removal determinations were modified to censure, one removal was modified to admonition, two censures were modified to admonition, and one censure was rejected and the charges dismissed. The Court remitted one matter to the Commission for further proceedings.

#### Statement by Commission Administrator

Commission Administrator Robert H. Tembeckjian made the following statement.

"The public interest has been served by the result in this judicial disciplinary matter and the open manner in which it was resolved."
