
During the past 21 years, the Utah Office of Crime Victim Reparations has reached out to thousands of victims who have suffered financial loss, physical injuries and emotional trauma as a result of violent crime. The assistance provided by this program helps victims recover and rebuild their lives. Approximately \$136 million have been awarded through compensation and victim assistance since the program's inception. No tax dollars are used to fund the compensation and victim assistance programs. These programs are funded through state and federal surcharges on fines, penalties and forfeitures.


Crime Victim Compensation Program

Purpose: To compensate victims of violent crime who have suffered physical and psychological injury as well as family members of victims.

Source of Funding: Surcharge on fines.


Range of Awards: The maximum award for homicides, attempted homicides, aggravated assaults and DUIs is \$50,000. No more than \$25,000 may be spent on non-medical benefits. The maximum award for all other crimes is \$25,000.

FY 2007 Victim Assistance Program

Victim Notification

Utah participates in an automated victim notification system (VINE) which makes it easy for crime victims to obtain timely information about criminal cases and the custody status of offenders held in Utah jails or prisons. Victims can be notified through telephone calls or through internet searches.

The use of the VINE system has grown as more victims become aware of the service. In FY'06, the VINE system reported 134,318 contacts with victims. In FY'07, this had grown to 563,508, an increase of more than 4 times. Increases in the numbers of requests result in better informed victims.

Victim of Crime Act Assistance Grants

Purpose: VOCA grants provide funding that enables the state, local governments and private nonprofit organizations to enhance and expand services to crime victims, promoting development of comprehensive services to crime victims throughout the state.

Source of Funding: Surcharge on Federal Fines.

Range of Awards: \$4,571 to \$109,195

Statistics: 71 VOCA funded programs across the state provided services to a total of 60,828 crime victims. Of that number 42,564 were primary victims who were harmed by a chargeable crime and 18,264 were secondary victims such as the spouse, children, parents or siblings of the primary victim.

STOP Violence Against Women Act Grants

Purpose: VAWA grants encourage the development and implementation of effective law enforcement and prosecution strategies to combat violent crimes against women and the development and enhancement of victim services in cases involving crimes against women.

Source of Funding: Federal Funds

Range of Awards: \$6,800 to \$79,627
