Study Overview

- Established in 1996 under RCW82.33A to provide information to the legislature as to the <u>competitiveness of Washington's</u> <u>economic climate relative to the other states</u>.
- Indicators chosen by advisory committee with representatives from government, business, and labor
 - Consistent across states
 - Timely
 - Valid and accurate

Overall, Washington declined

- 45 Total Indicators and Benchmarks
 - 40 Updated
- 37 indicators with ranks relative to other states:
 - 12 improved
 - 15 worsened
 - 10 unchanged
- 37 indicators which measure year-overyear performance:
 - 18 improved
 - 17 worsened
 - 2 unchanged

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Study Indicators

Benchmarks Separated into four categories:

- Innovation Drivers
 - 16 Indicators
 - Average Rank: 19
- Business Performance
 - 9 Indicators
 - Average Rank: 19
- Economic Growth and Competitiveness
 - 10 Indicators
 - Average Rank: 23
- Quality of Life
 - 10 Indicators
 - Average Rank: 17

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


Composite Rank

- Three new indicators
 - Patents Issued Per 100,000 Population
 - Public Transit Trips Per Capita
 - Relative value of \$100
- Business Performance broken into two subcategories
 - Business Prosperity
 - Cost of Doing Business

Other

- Arrest Rate changed to Arrest Rate Per Violent Crime
- Electricity costs, tax collections, unemployment insurance costs, and workers comp costs moved from Infrastructure to Cost of Doing Business

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


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Washington is outperforming the nation in employment growth





Washington's earnings growth declined in 2013







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


The homicide rate has continued to trend downward

- Overall, Washington's Economic Climate Study indicated a decline compared to other states.
- The newly developed composite rank declined one place from 18th best to 19th best in the nation.
- No Category showed substantial improvement or decline.
 - Innovation Drivers improved from 20th to 19th.
 - Business Performance declined from 18th to 19th.
 - Economic Growth and Competiveness declined from 19th to 23rd.
 - Quality of Life declined from 16th to 17th.
