
1998-2004 July 1 Caseload Children in Child Welfare Supervised Foster Care by Placement Type (Group Home)

How do we improve?

- · Recruitment, Training and Support (RTS) will recruit foster homes prepared to meet the needs of adolescents
- Assessment of relatives and Non-Relative Extended Family Members for placement by the Home Assessment Unit
- Utilizing the Team Decision Making (TDM) process, when it is in the child's best interest, to make placements in the lowest level of care possible for that child
- Utilize SB163 services for children who would otherwise be in higher level Group Homes to enable them to maintain in a family home setting, preferably their birth family or a relative.
