The consensus was that these meetings would clarify the Governor's personal focus. Commissioner Carol Page suggested that they be held before the session and in June. Even if the meetings are very brief they would be greatly appreciated.

The Report to the Legislature will be on November 9th at 11:00 a.m. and will probably be scheduled in the west building in room W25. Final draft of the report will be sent to the Commission. The report has to be to the printer on Friday.

<u>Agenda item #5 – Planning Grant Subcommittee Report: Approve Subcommittee Recommendation regarding planning grant applications</u>

<u>Action taken:</u> After some discussion regarding planning needs in small towns, Dave Allen made the motion to move Joseph Town and Koosharem up to the approved planning grant list submitted by the subcommittee. This was accepted with the understanding that they continue to seek match funding from other sources with GOPB staff assistance if necessary. Commissioner Carol Page seconded the motion and the motion carried. (The motion was held open until Commissioner Blackham phoned in and accepted the motion.)
