PCC SUPPORTS "MADE IN RURAL AMERICA" INITIATIVE

In July the White House Rural Council announced a new export and investment initiative called "Made in Rural America" (MIRA), which brings together federal resources to help rural businesses and community leaders take advantage of new investment opportunities and reach new customers and markets abroad.
