

STATE BOARD OF VETERANS AFFAIRS

The State Board of Veterans Affairs consists of the Governor, as chair, and representatives who shall serve for a term of four years from the date of their respective appointments. These representatives shall be selected from the memberships of the Alabama Department of the American Legion, the United Spanish American War Veterans, the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the Disabled American Veterans, the Veterans of WWI of the USA, Incorporated, the Vietnam Veterans of America, AMVETS, the Military Order of the Purple Heart, American Ex-Prisoners of War, Inc., Marine Corps League and Military Officers Association of America as prescribed by Alabama Code §31-5-3.

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Commissioner's Overview

Alabama's veteran population has remained fairly constant at 420,000 veterans during the past year. Although we continue to lose a substantial number of WWII Veterans each day, our veteran population is constantly being infused at a somewhat lower rate through retirements and separations of service members of the Cold War, Gulf War, and Iraq and Afghanistan era. These veterans continue to require the same services and benefits of prior war veterans and some requirements are amplified due to the length and number of combat tours and injuries such as TBI/TBMD and multiple amputees.

Working in tandem with the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, and in concert with State Board of Veterans Affairs and the

State Legislature, the ADVA will continue to provide consistent quality care, benefits and services to Alabama Veterans and eligible family members. In the spring of 2011, ADVA began operational testing of an electronic and computer database system that would reduce paper work, redundancy and create efficiency in the claims filing and tracking process. This system would also provide statewide visibility and access to veterans' information. Additionally, this system will provide a portal to the Veterans Benefits Management System (VBMS), which is the USDVA national database that will ultimately reduce the claims backlog, improve efficiency and decrease the time needed to process veterans benefits claims. The Veterans Benefits Administration will conclude its operational testing of the VBMS system in late 2012.

Although the ADVA annual budget was cut by 10% in 2011, the department was able to condense a statewide annual training conference into three regional district training conferences which allowed our Veterans Service Officers and Administrative Support Assistants the opportunity to receive the bare bones essential training necessary for proficiency. ADVA partnered with the Auburn University, the Department of Mental Health and the Alabama Department of Rehabilitation Services to organize and host the first PTSDISORDER to PTSGROWTH Conference. The conference focused on ways to identify and assist veterans with Post Traumatic Stress Disorders. The conference generated some solid recommendations for Alabama Veterans as well as established a national forum to address resolutions to mental health issues on an annual basis.

In October 2011, ADVA began the construction phase of Alabama's first State Veterans Cemetery by breaking ground at a 103-acre site located at Spanish Fort, AL. Our department also received a \$7 million federal VA grant for the purpose of building the state cemetery. This was a giant step forward in improving veterans' services in the state by providing Alabama Veterans with additional burial benefits.

Our department also received a \$33 million grant award for the construction of a 254-bed veterans' home. The home will have 174 skilled care beds and 80 domiciliary units for assisted living care for Alabama Veterans. This new facility will increase the number of skilled-care beds among the four state veterans' homes from 450 to 624. The additional 80-bed domiciliary will be the first in the state for veterans.

This department continues to provide a much needed service to Alabama Veterans and their families. This service provided a sustained \$1.3 billion, which came into the state via VA pensions, insurance, educations benefits, home loans and disability payments. I would be remiss if I did not acknowledge the great support and guidance provided by members of the State Board of Veterans Affairs. I also want to express my gratitude to our ADVA employees who work tirelessly each day on behalf of this department and our veterans. I am very proud of them and the advocacy work they do.

A Year in Review



The Alabama Department of Veterans Affairs began Fiscal Year 2011 by celebrating the department's 65th Anniversary. Since October 1, 1945, the ADVA has proudly served Alabama Veterans and their families.

Construction of the new state veterans home in Pell City began in January 2011. The 240,000 square facility features a neighborhood setting with 256 private rooms, common living and dining areas, a town center, shops and a sports café.



Each neighborhood in the Col. Robert L. Howard State Veterans Home includes two to three houses with 12-14 residents. The veterans home covers 27 acres and is located across from the new St. Vincent Hospital in Pell City.



The home's exterior offers an appealing design with a combination of stone, shingles and wood accents. The design promotes a residential, rather than an institutional, appearance.




ALABAMA DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS ORGANIZATION CHART





State of Alabama Department of Veterans Affairs Veterans vs. Employee Workforce Demographics







Student Distribution by School Type October 1, 2010 - September 30, 2011




Fiscal Year Expenditures Comparisons Scholarships Awarded In Millions

VA will continue to improve data collection for future GDX reports to better distribute loan expenditures at the state, county and congressional district levels.

ALABAMA STATE VETERANS HOMES

The State of Alabama Department of Veterans Affairs operates three veterans' homes throughout the state. Each home has a capacity of 150 beds which provides skilled nursing services to eligible veterans. The Bill Nichols State Veterans Home opened in 1989 and is located in Alexander City. The Floyd E. Tut Fann State Veterans Home and the William F. Green State Veterans Home both opened in 1995 and are located in Huntsville and Bay Minette, respectively.

The Alabama Department of Veterans Affairs contracts with a private management company to operate the three homes. There is an on-site Department Representative at each of the homes for contract oversight. The current healthcare contractor is Health Management Resources – Governmental Services, Inc. (HMR). Their contract period began June 30, 2009 and continues through June 30, 2014.

The eligibility criteria to be admitted into the State Veterans Home Program include the following:

- Must be honorably discharged from military service with a minimum of 90 days of service with at least one day during a wartime period.
- Must meet the qualifications as set forth by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs criteria for skilled nursing care.
- Must have been a resident of Alabama for the immediate past 12 months.
- Applicants may not have medical or nursing care needs that the home is not equipped to provide. This may include diagnosis/behavioral traits that may prove dangerous to the well-being of self or others.
- Peace time veterans may be admitted on a space available basis, but will not be placed before a wartime veteran.
- Veterans listed on the Sex Offender Registry or in a felony fugitive status shall not be admitted to a State Veterans Home.

Applications are available by contacting the local Veteran Service Officer, contacting the Department Representative at the home, or by downloading from the department's website. (www.va.alabama.gov)

For the period of October 1, 2010 through September 30, 2011, the occupancy rates for the homes are as follows:

Applications are received and reviewed by the Admissions Committee at the home as well as the Federal VA for approval. Applicants are added to the waiting list and admitted in the order they are approved when a bed becomes available. At times, an applicant may be denied admission for several reasons; however, there is an appeals process in place to ensure full consideration is given every veteran.

The Bill Nichols State Veterans Home is beginning its 22nd year of operation. William F. Green and Tut Fann State Veterans Homes are in their 16th year of operation. The residents at each of the homes enjoy a full range of activities both on site and out of the facility. Special programs are dedicated to Veterans Day and Memorial Day.

Some improvements made in the homes this year included: Bill Nichols – purchased new patient lifts, two bariatric electric high/low beds, new tilting skillet and proofer holding cabinet for the kitchen. Tut Fann – replaced a washer and dryer, a new steamer with kettles, and ice maker, replaced the fire suppression system in the kitchen, rewired entire building for improvement to television service for residents, and replaced multiple air units. WF Green – replaced gas boiler for steamer and kettles in the kitchen, purchased new patient sit to stand lift, purchased treatment cart, fryer, double convection oven, and replaced resident wardrobes, night stands, and chairs for 60 residents.

We have completed work on the Exterior Improvement Projects at William F. Green State Veterans Home and Tut Fann State Veterans Home. William F. Green received a new roof, new gutters and soffit, exterior paint, cleaning of brick, replacement of exterior lights and a new makeup air unit and ventilation system in the service area. Tut Fann had all of the EIFS painted as well as gutters and downspouts, replacement of soffit, cleaning of brick, replacement of exterior lights and a new makeup air unit and ventilation system in the service area. The project greatly improved the appearance of the buildings as when they opened in 1995.

Plans are underway for improvements to the domestic hot water systems at William F. Green State Veterans Home and Tut Fann State Veterans Home in 2012. Our architects are working with their engineers to finalize plans so the project can be placed out for bid. This will

improve fluctuations in the current hot water system. Bill Nichols State Veterans Home's hot water system was revamped in the prior year.

The Ground Breaking Ceremony for the Col. Robert L. Howard State Veterans Home was held November 30, 2010. The contract for construction was placed out for bid and awarded to Doster Construction of Birmingham. Clearing of the site began in January 2011. We participated in Owner, Architect, and Contractor (OAC) Meetings every 2 weeks to review the progress of the work performed. By the end of September 2011, we were at the 50% completion point. When complete, the home will provide 174 skilled nursing beds and 80 Domiciliary/Assisted Living Veterans for Alabama's Veterans.

The Bill Nichols State Veterans Home, Tut Fann State Veterans Home, and William F. Green State Veterans Home are all fully licensed and in compliance with healthcare standards of the Federal VA and the Alabama Department of Public Health.




