

Commissioner's Overview



Alabama continues to be a very pro-military and veterans state. 420,000 of our nation's 22 million veterans reside in Alabama. We have about 12,000 active military, 22,000 Reserve and National Guard Members and 85,000 dependents. I am truly honored to work with the numerous veterans' service organizations, state agencies, state legislature and the Governor's Office to ensure that we keep Abraham Lincoln's promise to "care for him who shall have borne the battle and for his widow and orphan."

We also expect that over 20,000 OEF and OIF veterans will return home to Alabama over the next couple of years, and we are looking at ways to

transition them back into society by providing counseling, health care, employment, education as well as compensation and pension benefits.

In 2012, we conducted a number of outreach programs to include a Supermarket of Veterans Benefits that provided information, counseling, access to health care and all other veterans' benefits and services.

With the great collaboration and continuous support and guidance of the SBVA, we completed and opened the Col Robert L. Howard State Veterans Home in Pell City on November 1, 2012, which is Alabama's fourth state veterans' home. This long-term care facility for veterans is the first neighborhood concept home designed and built from the foundation up to have a comfortable environment and a home like atmosphere. The home will care for 254 veterans and has all the amenities of a condominium or ski lodge.

On December 7, 2012, the ADVA dedicated the Alabama State Veterans Memorial Cemetery at Spanish Fort. This is Alabama's first state operated veterans cemetery. The cemetery, completed in twelve months, features an administration building, maintenance facility and a committal shelter. The cemetery also includes the development of four in-ground burial sections that have over two thousand preplaced crypts, a scatter garden and two columbariums for cremains. This is a \$7 million facility that conforms to the National Cemetery Administration standards for providing a dignified and final resting place for Alabama Veterans and their families.

Although the ADVA General Fund was short \$800,000 in 2012, the department continued to provide above average services in our county offices that generated \$1.3 billion in state revenue from veterans' benefits, services, compensation and pension payments. The ADVA was able to make the advancements through the strong support of Governor Robert Bentley, his office and the State Board of Veterans Affairs.

Finally, the hard work and heavy lifting was done where the rubber meets the road - by the veterans' homes health care directors, claims reviewers, cemetery staff, headquarters personnel as well as the veterans service officers and administrative assistants in our county offices.

This department and other state agencies could not provide the required services to our veterans and to the citizens of Alabama without our employees that make it happen. For Team ADVA, it is my distinct honor and privilege to work with you as we together serve our veterans and their family members.

A Year in Review





State of Alabama Department of Veterans Affairs Veterans vs. Employee Workforce Demographics






Student Distribution by School Type





ALABAMA STATE VETERANS HOMES

The State of Alabama Department of Veterans Affairs operates three veterans' homes throughout the state. Each home has a capacity of 150 beds which provides skilled nursing services to eligible veterans. The Bill Nichols State Veterans Home opened in 1989 and is located in Alexander City. The Floyd E. Tut Fann State Veterans Home and the William F. Green State Veterans Home both opened in 1995 and are located in Huntsville and Bay Minette, respectively. The Col. Robert L. Howard State Veterans Home nearing completion of construction and is to open in November 2012. There will be 174 skilled nursing care beds and 80 Domiciliary/Assisted Living beds.

The Alabama Department of Veterans Affairs contracts with a private management company to operate the three homes. There is an on-site Department Director at each of the homes for contract oversight. The current healthcare contractor is Health Management Resources – Governmental Services, Inc. (HMR). Their contract period began June 30, 2009 and continues through June 30, 2014.

In January 2012, a Request for Proposals was advertised for the healthcare contract to operate the Col. Robert L. Howard State Veterans Home. The Board selected HMR of Alabama. The contract was approved by the Legislative Contract Review Committee and signed by Governor Bentley in March. The contract period ends in March 2017. HMR began recruitment of the Administrator and other key staff positions immediately. Other positions are being filled in order to allow sufficient training prior to admitting the first resident. Once the veterans' home is full, there will be approximately 300 employees. There have been 239 applications filed for admission.

The eligibility criteria to be admitted into the State Veterans Home Program include the following:

- Must be honorably discharged from military service with a minimum of 90 days of service with at least one day during a wartime period.
- Must meet the qualifications as set forth by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs criteria for skilled nursing care.
- Must have been a resident of Alabama for the immediate past 12 months.
- Applicants may not have medical or nursing care needs that the home is not equipped to
 provide. This may include diagnosis/behavioral traits that may prove dangerous to the
 well-being of self or others.
- Peace time veterans may be admitted on a space available basis, but will not be placed before a wartime veteran.
- Veterans listed on the Sex Offender Registry or in a felony fugitive status shall not be admitted to a State Veterans Home.

Applications are available by contacting the local Veteran Service Officer, contacting the Department Director at the home, or by downloading from the department's website. (www.va.alabama.gov)

For the period of October 1, 2011 through September 30, 2012, the occupancy rates for the homes are as follows:

Applications are received and reviewed by the Admissions Committee at the home as well as the Federal VA for approval. Applicants are added to the waiting list and admitted in the order they are approved when a bed becomes available. At times, an applicant may be denied admission for several reasons; however, there is an appeals process in place to ensure full consideration is given every veteran.

The Bill Nichols State Veterans Home is beginning its 23rd year of operation. William F. Green and Tut Fann State Veterans Homes are in their 17th year of operation. The residents at each of the homes enjoy a full range of activities both on site and out of the facility. Special programs are dedicated to Veterans Day and Memorial Day.

Some improvements made in the homes this year included: Bill Nichols – purchased a new weight machine and exercise bike for the residents, ice machines, kitchen refrigerator and racks, and new resident room glider chairs. Repairs were made to the Caterpillar Generator, garbage disposal and several sprinkler heads. Floyd E. Tut Fann – purchased a couple of new patient lifts, some bariatric wide beds, and outdoor patio furniture. Repairs were made to several HVAC units and board room chairs were recovered rather than replaced. The Domestic Hot Water improvement project was completed. WF Green – purchased patient lifts, food delivery carts, medication cart, some bariatric wide beds, and resident wardrobes. Repairs were made to fire alarm panel, damper motors, and HVAC units. The Domestic Hot Water improvement project was completed.

In June, the Alabama Building Commission approved Substantial Completion on projects at William F. Green State Veterans Home and Floyd E. Tut Fann State Veterans Home. The projects made improvements to the domestic hot water systems. This corrected fluctuations in the domestic hot water system at both homes. Comfort Systems USA of Loxley performed the work in Bay Minette and Early Services performed the work in Huntsville. Kahn was the architect on the projects. We continue to submit information for the grant request for the Bill Nichols Dayroom Expansion Project that should be approved for funding next year.

Bill Nichols State Veterans Home, Floyd E. Tut Fann State Veterans Home, and William F. Green State Veterans Home are all fully licensed and in compliance with healthcare standards of the Federal VA and the Alabama Department of Public Health. All three homes received "Deficiency Free" Inspections by the VA for this period.


