Commissioner's Overview



To the Governor of the State of Alabama, members of the State Board of Veterans Affairs, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, it my distinct honor to submit the 2013 Annual Report for the Alabama Department of Veterans Affairs. This report highlights the significant accomplishments of a superb team of dedicated state employees and the unyielding support we receive from our partners at the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, our counterparts in state government, our elected officials, supporters at the city and county level as well as the veterans service organizations and community partners.

2013 was another productive year as ADVA continues to provide veterans counseling and advocacy services throughout the State of Alabama. Your four state veterans homes are at 99 percent occupancy and the relatively new domiciliary at the Col. Robert L. Howard State Veterans Home in Pell City is at 89 percent occupancy. During the past year pharmacy services provisions were developed, staffed and are now being provided by ADVA's long-term care contract provider, Health Management Resources (HMR), following the VAMC's termination of pharmacy operations in state facilities. Each state veterans home now operates its own pharmacy and is staffed with a pharmacist and several technicians to serve in-home veteran residents.

The Alabama GI Dependents' Scholarship Program continues to be a great dependent benefit of eligible disabled veterans. In 2013 the program provided \$43 million in educational benefits to spouses, dependent children and step-children. In 2014 ADVA will recommend a change to the program through legislation that will eliminate the requirement for veterans to have served in wartime for their dependent to qualify for the program. The change will allow dependents of peacetime disabled veterans to be eligible for the program as long as they meet all other previous requirements such as being a resident in Alabama twelve months immediately before entering military service, have served 90 days of more of active service and have a 20% or greater service connected disability. Additional changes to the program will include the following:

The Alabama GI Dependents' Scholarship will only cover undergraduate degrees, associate degrees and certificates of study and will only pay in-state tuition rates for veteran dependent education at any state-supported college, university or technical school.

As a result of ADVA efforts and collaborative partners, VA benefits and services generated some \$2.8 billion into Alabama's economy. These dollars came from VA compensation, pension and education benefits, construction and veterans health care coverage. Return of investment for veterans benefits and services in 2013 averaged \$396 to \$19 ADVA expenditures.

We also know that many Alabamians are not taking advantage of many federal, state and local benefits and services that they have earned. ADVA will strive to continue reducing that gap in the upcoming years. ADVA will continue to focus on counseling, education, dissemination of information as well as conducting outreach events in the community centers where veterans live.

On behalf of the agency, it is our distinct honor and privilege to serve the veterans and their family members of the Great State of Alabama.




Veterans Day events were held throughout the state that honored the service and sacrifice of the men and women who have served in America's Armed Forces.








Growth Index Graph Original and Supplemental Applications

ALABAMA STATE VETERANS HOMES

The State of Alabama Department of Veterans Affairs (ADVA) operates four veterans' homes throughout the state. The Bill Nichols State Veterans Home opened in 1989 and is located in Alexander City. The home is licensed for 150 skilled nursing beds. The Floyd E. "Tut" Fann State Veterans Home opened in 1995 and is located in Huntsville. The home is licensed for 150 skilled nursing beds. The William F. Green State Veterans Home opened in 1995 also and is located in Bay Minette. The home is licensed for 150 skilled nursing beds. The fourth home is the Col. Robert L. Howard State Veterans Home which opened in November 2012 in Pell City. The home is licensed for 174 skilled nursing beds and 80 domiciliary/assisted living beds.

The Alabama Department of Veterans Affairs (ADVA) contracts with a private management company to operate the homes. There is an on-site director at each of the homes for contract oversight on behalf of ADVA. The current healthcare contractor for Bill Nichols, "Tut" Fann and W.F. Green State Veterans Homes is Health Management Resources – Governmental Services, Inc. (HMR). Their contract period began June 30, 2009 and continues through June 30, 2014. The healthcare contractor for Col. Robert L. Howard State Veterans Home is HMR of Alabama. The contract began March 1, 2012 through February 28, 2017.

The eligibility criteria to be admitted into the State Veterans Home Program include the following:

- Must be honorably discharged from military service with a minimum of 90 days of service with at least one day during a wartime period.
- Must meet the qualifications as set forth by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs criteria for skilled nursing care.
- Must have been a resident of Alabama for the immediate past 12 months.
- Applicants may not have medical or nursing care needs that the home is not equipped to provide. This may include diagnosis/behavioral traits that may prove dangerous to the well-being of self or others.
- Peacetime veterans may be admitted on a space available basis, but will not be placed before a wartime veteran.
- Veterans listed on the Sex Offender Registry or in a felony fugitive status shall not be admitted to a State Veterans Home.

Applications are available by contacting the local County Veteran Service Officer, contacting the director at the home, or by downloading from the department's website. (www.va.alabama.gov)

For the period of October 1, 2012 through September 30, 2013, the occupancy rates for the homes are as follows:

Applications are received and reviewed by the Admissions Committee at the home as well as the Federal VA for approval. Applicants are added to the waiting list and admitted in the order they are approved when a bed becomes available. At times, an applicant may be denied admission for several reasons; however, there is an appeals process in place to ensure full consideration is given every veteran.

Beginning in March, ADVA changed the admission review process. The veteran applicant will receive a letter acknowledging receipt only of the application rather than an approval letter. The letter states a veteran will be contacted for updated information when his or her name nears the top of the waiting list. The Admissions Committee will not conduct the review assessment for approval until the veteran's name is within 30 days of a bed becoming available.

The Bill Nichols State Veterans Home began its 24th year of operation. William F. Green and "Tut" Fann State Veterans Homes were in their 18th year of operation. The residents at each of the homes enjoyed a full range of activities both on-site and away from the facility. Special programs were dedicated to Veterans Day and Memorial Day.

Some improvements made in the homes this year included: Purchase of two-way radios at each veterans home. This is to reduce the amount of overhead paging in the homes. The Bill Nichols Veterans Home purchased kitchen equipment, lobby furniture and made improvements to the main dining room. "Tut" Fann purchased dayroom seating, chapel chairs, new library shelving and furniture, replaced the nurses' stations and replaced pantry cabinetry. Repairs were made to several HVAC units, garbage disposal and exterior sprinklers. W.F. Green purchased extra wide patient beds, over the bed tables, kitchen equipment to include plate warmers and two new steam tables. W.F. Green made repairs to systems due to a lightning strike in June 2013 with an update to the lightning suppression system. The fire alarm panel is also being replaced. The Col. Howard Veterans Home purchased blinds/shades in various areas and additional outdoor furniture. Much of the year was spent working with Doster Construction on warranty items associated with new construction.


Williams Blackstock was hired in May 2013 as the architect for the Bill Nichols State Veterans Home Dayroom Expansion Project. Preliminary drawings have been submitted to the VA Grant Program for approval as well as Alabama Building Commission and Alabama Department of Public Health. The project will add over 2,000 square feet of dayroom space per floor. The VA grant has allocated federal dollars of \$3,058,084 for this project.

Significant changes occurred this year to Pharmacy Services at Bill Nichols State Veterans Home, "Tut" Fann State Veterans Home, and William F. Green State Veterans Home. The Federal VA did not renew its Sharing Agreement for Pharmacy Services which ended on October 20, 2012. The VA no longer provides an option for veterans who are not considered in the groups to be med eligible and would no longer provide in-house VA operated pharmacies. The directors at the homes assisted in getting veterans signed up for Medicare Part D Pharmacy plans or verified any existing pharmacy plans they had. Home directors continue to verify those

veterans who may still receive medications at no charge from the VA. When VA operated pharmacies closed at each home, HMR hired pharmacists to operate the in-house pharmacies as approved by the Alabama State Board of Veterans Affairs.

The Dedication Ceremony for the Col. Robert L. Howard State Veterans Home was held on November 1, 2012 with Governor Bentley as the keynote speaker. Approximately 500 attended the event which included a program, reception, and tours. The first two veterans were admitted with a great deal of fanfare on December 19, 2012. The Federal VA conducted a recognition survey of the Col. Howard Veterans Home on January 15-16, 2013. The home was officially recognized by the VA on January 16, 2013, which allowed for Federal VA per diem payment for veterans care. The home's staff came together and excelled with the challenge of opening a new veterans home. All four State Veterans Homes are fully licensed and in compliance with healthcare standards of the Federal VA and the Alabama Department of Public Health.






Col. Robert L. Howard State Veterans Home Skilled Nursing Facilty Cost per Day - \$206.50

The Alabama State Veterans Memorial Ceremony at Spanish Fort was dedicated on December 7, 2012. The dedication, held on Pearl Harbor Day, served as a reminder of the sacrifices made by Americans while defending the nation's freedom. A combination of many years of site searches and discussion by local leaders; unwavering support from Veterans as well as detailed planning by state and federal officials with approval by the State Board of Veterans Affairs (SBVA) led to a hallowed resting place for Alabama Veterans and their families. In 2008, the SBVA approved the department's request to conduct a thorough review regarding the feasibility, support, sustainability and strategy for a state veterans cemetery.

The following year the SBVA unanimously agreed to pursue legislation that would establish a state veterans cemetery. After the bill was signed into law on May 22, 2009, the state VA awarded Walcott Adams Verneuille Architects of Fairhope the contract for designing the cemetery's 103-acre site plan. The plan became an essential part of the state VA's application for a \$7 million federal VA construction grant.

The first phase of the cemetery covers 22.8 acres that includes an administration building, maintenance facility, committal shelter and a memorial walk. There are a total of 2,776 graves with in ground crypts, traditional graves, columbarium niches and a scatter garden.

On April 17 the cemetery held a Consecration Service with clergy representing different religions that blessed and conducted rituals appropriate to their faiths. The cemetery conducted the first Veteran burial service on April 19, 2012.


