#### Abstract

Welcome to a meeting of the Arizona State Transportation Board. The Transportation Board consists of seven private citizen members appointed by the Governor, representing specific transportation districts. Board members are appointed for terms of six years each, with terms expiring on the third Monday in January of the appropriate year.


## BOARD AUTHORITY

Although the administration of the Department of Transportation is the responsibility of the director, the Transportation Board has been granted certain policy powers in addition to serving in an advisory capacity to the director.
In the area of highways the Transportation Board is responsible for establishing a system of state routes. It determines which routes are accepted into the state system and which state routes are to be improved. The Board has final authority on establishing the opening, relocating, altering, vacating or abandoning any portion of a state route of a state highway. The Transportation Board awards construction contracts and monitors the status of construction projects.
With respect to aeronautics the Transportation Board distributes monies appropriated to the Aeronautics Division from the State Aviation Fund for planning, design, development, land acquisition, construction and improvement of publicly-owned airport facilities. The Board also approves airport construction.
The Transportation Board has the exclusive authority to issue revenue bonds for financing needed transportation improvements throughout the state. As part of the planning process the Board determines priority planning with respect to transportation facilities and annually adopts the five year construction program.

## CITIZEN INPUT

Citizens may appear before the Transportation Board to be heard on any transportation-related issue. Persons wishing to protest any action taken or contemplated by the Board may appear before this open forum. The Board welcomes citizen involvement, although because of Arizona's open meeting laws, no actions may be taken on items which do not appear on the formal agenda. This does not, however, preclude discussion of other issues.

## MEETINGS

The Transportation Board typically meets on the third Friday of each month. Meetings are held in locations throughout the state. In addition to the regular business meetings held each month, the Board also conducts three public hearings each year to receive input regarding the proposed five-year construction program. Meeting dates are established for the following year at the December organization meeting of the Board.

## BOARD MEETING PROCEDURE

Board members receive the agenda and all backup information one week before the meeting is held. They have studied each item on the agenda and have consulted with Department of Transportation staff when necessary. If no additional facts are presented at the meeting, they often act on matters, particularly routine ones, without further discussion.
In order to streamline the meetings the Board has adopted the "consent agenda" format, allowing agenda items to be voted on en masse unless discussion is requested by one of the board members or Department of Transportation staff members.

## Opening Remarks

Acting Chair Kelly Anderson thanked Mohave County and the City of Kingman for their hospitality for the tour of the Hoover Dam Bridge yesterday. It was spectacular. The dinner last night topped off a great day. He said that flying into Kingman, he saw a mine and found out that it was one of the world's largest molybdenum mines. It is one of the facts that you do not realize about this area of Arizona.

ITEM 1: District Engineer's Report - Mike Kondelis, Kingman District Engineer
Mike gave an update of the first big horn sheep-crossing bridges. The first year's monitoring recorded about 225 sheep crossings and another bridge recorded 150 crossings. This is far beyond their expectations. The proof is that the bridges are working.

He said the US 93 MP 2-17 project has been recognized with six awards. The latest award was AASHTO's 2012 America's Transportation Regional Award, Best Use of Innovation.

They have been working on the US 93 Corridor from I-40 down to Wickenburg for about 15 years. It has been divided up into three segments. The first segment is I-40 to Wikieup; second segment is Wikieup to the Santa Maria River, and then from the Santa Maria south to Wickenburg. The first efforts were in the center section which took about ten years to complete. He said the focus now is I40 to Wikieup. There are eight projects left from the Santa Maria south to Wickenburg and three projects in the program to complete. They are Antelope Wash, Cane Springs, and Carrow Stephens.

Pavement Preservation Projects: SR66 Airway to Mohave Airport Drive is underway. Future projects are the I-40 weigh station to Ash Fork (WB) is scheduled in FY13; the I-40 Rattlesnake Wash to US 93 is scheduled in FY14; and other I-40 FY15 projects.

Bridge Preservation Projects: The I-40 Flat Top Wash Bridge (EB) is pending award today; I-40 East Kingman is scheduled in FY13; I-40 East Ash Fork traffic interchange and RR bridges are scheduled in FY15. The SR 89 Hell Canyon Bridge is a narrow bridge with a lot of heavy truck traffic, due to the
rock products in the area. We are working on more of an emergency type project to actually replace that bridge.

Major Studies: I-40 US 93 West Kingman System Interchange. Mike said that a lot of traffic is going to and from Vegas on the weekends and on holidays. The traffic actually gets backed up on I-40. They are in the design concept report phase right now to connect l-40 to US 93. By this time next year, they should have the solution for a system interchange out there and know what the costs are. The Rancho Santa Fe Parkway interchange formerly known as Rattlesnake Wash is a joint project with the City of Kingman. It has been shelved but they will continue to request funding for that, 70\% ADOT funding and $30 \%$ Kingman funding. It provides not just the interchange on I-40 but a direct connection to the airport which has a lot of industry out there and a lot of truck traffic that now uses SR66.

SR95 Realignment: In the Bullhead City/Mohave Valley area, they have been working on a realignment study for a number of years. It has been stalled waiting on funding for a few years. Hopefully within the next month or two, that project will be back on track. They are looking at a new 42 mile segment that would connect SR68 just above Bullhead City all the way down to I-40 to the SR95 interchange. He said they looked at a realignment of SR95 in Lake Havasu City as well. They completed the feasibility study, yet that is on the shelf and they will request funding for the design concept report when the time is right.

## ITEM 2: Director's Report

No report at this time.
ITEM 2A: Overview and Update (MAP-21) Legislation-Floyd P. Roehrich, Jr., Deputy Director Floyd recognized the Arizona Division administrator for the Federal Highway Administration, Ms. Karla Petty. He said there is a strong relationship the department has with her team and the Arizona Division as well as MPOs and COGs and the transportation stakeholders. That has been instrumental of the successes of every project we have delivered. It is a pleasure that she made the trip up here.

Floyd provided copies of the summary of the Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act for the public and Board Members. He said that on the Federal Highway Administration http://www.fhwa.dot.gov website, there is a link to the MAP-21. This bill is less than two weeks old. It is a very significant benefit for the states and for transportation. It does go through to 2014 and identifies $\$ 105$ billion for that period. He said it extends the ability to collect gas tax through FY2016.

MAP-21 restructures the old core highway formula programs, which are now incorporated into the following new six core formula programs, i.e., National Highway Performance Program, Surface Transportation Program, Highway Safety Improvement Program, Congestion Mitigation Air Quality Improvement Program, Metropolitan Planning, and Transportation Alternatives. The states will receive a lump sum distribution and more flexibility and eligibility of where to spend those funds.

He said the Transportation Infrastructure Financing and Innovation Act (TIFIA) is a subprogram that was previously at about $\$ 1$ billion a year. It is so successful and so many states have asked for it that it has been increased to $\$ 10$ billion a year. It is a lending program different from a grant program where states through public private partnerships or other funding sources can apply and get funding early to start projects then the loans paid back.

He also said that there are changes to tolling. States will have the ability to greater expend the use of tolls, but there are conditions. It is for new capacities or improvements that do not take away the existing number of lanes.

The other major component (of MAP-21) is quite a bit. Performance measures and management systems will be put in place that we will work through it and establish how we make sure to verify the funding and improvements and planning and the programming to move forward to meet these national goals and conditions. There will be penalties if you do not comply. There are a number of timelines that still have yet to be determined. He said it is about a 600-page bill. Our legislative staff has been going through and evaluating and preparing it and see how to move forward. We will continue to brief the Board on conditions and the terms within it. For now we are comfortable knowing we have a program for the next 27 months. He said it will keep the program sound moving forward.

## *ITEM 3: Consent Agenda

Motion to approve the Consent Agenda was made by Joe La Rue and seconded by Bill Feldmeier, in a voice vote, the motion carries.

## ITEMS 4: Financial Report - Kristine Ward

Kristine provided the HURF report comparing September 2006 forecasts to the pre-fiscal crisis of November 2011 and the impact of the economic crisis on the funds available to the Department and all HURF beneficiaries. The difference between the 2006 forecast and the 2011 actuals represents a loss of $\$ 5.6$ billion in funds. The impacts to the Department and Construction program were $\$ 2.8$ billion and the loss to the cities was $\$ 1.7$ billion, and to the counties was $\$ 1.1$ billion. The Aviation fund overall revenues are $\$ 22.5$ million for the year and is $10.3 \%$ below FY2011.

ITEM 5: Financing Program - Kristine Ward
Nothing to report at this time.

## ITEM 6: Multimodal Planning Division Report - Michael Kies

Mike updated the Board on the Proposed I-11 Corridor Profile Study between Las Vegas and Phoenix. Mike said that the MAP-21 legislation did designate US 93 from Las Vegas through Kingman to Wickenburg as the future Interstate 11. Arizona and NDOT have partnered on a study to look at the corridor. The legislation does not bring any new funding to the state for this corridor. With this higher priority on the corridor, we do think in the future we will be able to compete for some of the discretionary funding that Floyd mentioned as part of the new legislation. Mike said he has been working closely with NDOT to finalize the scope of work for the feasibility study from Nevada to Arizona along the potential interstate corridor. The consultant team is on board. The contract and the scope of work are on the agenda for the Nevada Board of Directors meeting for this Monday, July 23rd. Assuming that the Nevada Board of Directors passes that contract, the consultant team will start immediately on the project. They will be given notice to proceed the next day. There will be four key meetings on schedule. There will be two public meetings, one in Nevada and one in Arizona where the public will be invited to attend. The public meetings will show what the designation of I-11 means and what the study is intending to accomplish. The public will have the opportunity to give input. The other two meetings that will be scheduled in the next couple of months are stakeholders chartering meetings. These are meetings for all the interested stakeholders along the corridor, i.e., cities, counties, landowners, and interested business owners that have an interest along the corridor. Those chartering meetings are open to anyone interested in attending. The meetings include the overview of the study, what the designation means, and more important, how all these entities can become involved in the project, and what level they want to be involved in the project. The intention is to create advisory committees and focus groups so that stakeholders can be involved at any level they choose to in the study. He said, hopefully, the Nevada Board of Directors is passing the contract
on Monday then soon we will be on our way with the study.

The Intermodal Transportation Division has made a thorough investigation concerning the establishment and improvement of Interstate 19 within the above referenced project.

The existing alignment of Interstate Route 19 was previously established as a state route and state highway, designated U.S. 89, by the Arizona Highway Commission Resolution dated September 9, 1927 on page 26 of the Official Minutes. A Resolution dated July 10, 1945 on page 157 of the Official Minutes included this portion of U.S. 89 in the supplemental designation of Interstate Routes. Thereafter, various Resolutions of public record have established additional right of way as a state route and state highway for improvements thereof. The Project will study and analyze the impact of Amtrack stops on traffic flow and operation of the existing traffic signal systems along SR347 from the traffic signal at West Alterra Pkwy (MP 172.76) to Just north of the traffic signal at the intersection with SR238 (MP 174.67) in the City of Maricopa.

## 26. JUSTIFICATION:

The purpose of this project is to evaluate the anticipated disruption to SR 347 as a result of Amtrak stops and determine strategies or alternatives for dealing with the resulting impacts to traffic.
The Union Pacific Railroad operates two parallel tracks through the Town of Maricopa, crossing SR 347 near the southern end of town. An Amtrak station exists on the SE corner of the signalized intersection of SR 347 and Maricopa - Casa Grande Highway. When the Amtrak train arrives it keeps the crossing gates down and the traffic signal remains pre-empted until such time the train leaves the station and releases the circuit.
During that time, traffic queue builds on SR 347 due to the crossing gates being in the down position. Upon gate release, queues that have accumulated are released, causing significant impacts to traffic signal operations and local traffic until recovery stabilizes flows.
