Welcome to a meeting of the Arizona State Transportation Board. The Transportation Board consists of seven private citizen members appointed by the Governor, representing specific transportation districts. Board members are appointed for terms of six years each, with terms expiring on the third Monday in January of the appropriate year.

## BOARD AUTHORITY

Although the administration of the Department of Transportation is the responsibility of the director, the Transportation Board has been granted certain policy powers in addition to serving in an advisory capacity to the director. In the area of highways the Transportation Board is responsible for establishing a system of state routes. It determines which routes are accepted into the state system and which state routes are to be improved. The Board has final authority on establishing the opening, relocating, altering, vacating or abandoning any portion of a state route of a state highway. The Transportation Board awards construction contracts and monitors the status of construction projects. With respect to aeronautics the Transportation Board distributes monies appropriated to the Aeronautics Division from the State Aviation Fund for planning, design, development, land acquisition, construction and improvement of publicly-owned airport facilities. The Board also approves airport construction. The Transportation Board has the exclusive authority to issue revenue bonds for financing needed transportation improvements throughout the state. As part of the planning process the Board determines priority planning with respect to transportation facilities and annually adopts the five year construction program.

## CITIZEN INPUT

Citizens may appear before the Transportation Board to be heard on any transportation-related issue. Persons wishing to protest any action taken or contemplated by the Board may appear before this open forum. The Board welcomes citizen involvement, although because of Arizona's open meeting laws, no actions may be taken on items which do not appear on the formal agenda. This does not, however, preclude discussion of other issues.

## MEETINGS

The Transportation Board typically meets on the second Friday of each month. Meetings are held in locations throughout the state. In addition to the regular business meetings held each month, the Board also conducts three public hearings each year to receive input regarding the proposed five-year construction program. Meeting dates are established for the following year at the December organization meeting of the Board.

## BOARD MEETING PROCEDURE

Board members receive the agenda and all backup information one week before the meeting is held. They have studied each item on the agenda and have consulted with Department of Transportation staff when necessary. If no additional facts are presented at the meeting, they often act on matters, particularly routine ones, without further discussion. In order to streamline the meetings the Board has adopted the "consent agenda" format, allowing agenda items to be voted on en masse unless discussion is requested by one of the board members or Department of Transportation staff members.

| 11 | public. I'd like to welcome you to Willcox, Cochise |
| 12 | County, the Safford district. It's a neat place. And I'd |
| 13 | also like to thank, likewise, the Chamber of Commerce, |
| 14 | Aridus Winery for this fascinating experience yesterday. |
| 15 | It just goes to show you what the conviction and will |
| 16 | (Inaudible) invest themselves into the community, what - |
| 17 | what that can do. |
| 18 | Okay. Just to go through. We have half a dozen |
| 9 | projects that -- that are probably in progress. There is |
| 20 | (Inaudible) preservation projects in the state system. I |
| 21 | just want to point out that here the decision in Willcox, |
| 2 | we have about $\$ 20$ million worth of work going on right |
| 3 | now, okay, yet to be obligated or advertised or awarded in |
| 4 | this month. We still have several projects near the tail |
| 25 | end of our fiscal year. And it's a variety of spot and |

(Inaudible) and safety work, many which are associated
with legacy enhancement projects, safe routes to school,
things like that.
    We're pointing out this one here, the Campbell
Blue project is just a really neat project. Not very big.
But if there was any project that I saw in my whole
career, the amount of cooperation and partnership that
went behind it. It's -- it's a neat project, and I look
forward to seeing that advance.
    The next fiscal year we have some pavement
preservation projects in the state system, as well as
several clear spot projects. I point out here the
rehabilitation of two rest areas on I-10, in Texas Canyon
and San Simon. The call is not to shut down both rest
areas at the same time.
    And, likewise, next fiscal year, local public
agency projects. There are several that are big events, a
variety of, again, legacy enhancement projects, as well as
projects that are in the (Inaudible) STP funded projects
or -- if we even do that (Inaudible) anymore. I can't
remember which flavor of plumbing it is. I'm trying to go
as fast as I can.
    UNIDENTIFIED VOICE: We're trying to get to the
five-year program.
UNIDENTIFIED VOICE: Let me think about it.
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CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: Which -- which year?
MR. HARMON: Right. And I just (Inaudible) rise a little bit. We have several projects that are programmed in the five-year plan that are a redesign.

I want to point out one of those. That's the US 191 interchange with I-10 that's just west of here at exit 331 where we are reconfiguring the on and off ramps on the westbound side. That seemed like a small thing, but that will remove yet another (Inaudible) point for oversize loads to allow oversize loads to continue on I-10 -- or overheight loads, I should say, as well as come up US 191.

And two other projects that -- that are kind of in the -- in the works. State Route, 80 heavy truck port of entry location study. I got word earlier this week that that project is going to move forward. And that -that is a study to consider segregating heavy truck traffic in the Douglas area. So we'll have our kickoff meeting later this summer.

And as well as to keep on the regular screen, the railroad overpass US 191 south of $I-10$. And, again, it's a 1937 vintage bridge. And I just want to point out that that particular project won't go down in one -- as one project. Because of the poor soils in the Willcox Playa 24 area, that that project has to be phased into at least two 25 phases. And one is just building embankments and putting

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soil along a future alignment. And what the -- the soils
push the water out of the clays and consolidate with poor
soils. That's a project that would (Inaudible). And
we're 60 percent done with design on that right now. And
then further incubation that we will see it move forward.
And I'm just talking about what's happening with the
(Inaudible) word up at Morenci.
We have three projects that are -- will be
privately funded through Freeport McMoRan. The first two,
Shannon and B Hill are routine minor realignments. It
sounds unusual, but we do a lot of that for the mine's
operational needs. Shannon on the calendar 2015, and B
Hill 2016.
    The great -- large realignment to put 191 around
the mine property, that Freeport is still doing their
homework. They're doing geotechnical investigations.
(Inaudible). But it is not at the top of their priority
list yet to -- to permit a significant amount of funds for
construction. So that construction is on a holding
pattern.
    With that I wish you a happy Friday of 13th. Any
questions?
    CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: Mr. Cuthbertson, this is your
district, and you're a district engineer. Do you have any
comments or questions of the district engineer?
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time.
CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: Okay. I have just a quick
question. The Texas Canyon area and to the east, just on
the eastern fringe of your district going almost to the
Tucson district has had significant safety issues of
pretty profound proportions. In addition to that, there's
been dust issues as well.
Can you comment briefly on any focus that the
Department and your district are doing on those?
MR. HARMON: Yes. Yes, Mr. Chair. Taking the
Texas Canyon area. That pass is the highest place on I-10
in Arizona, and it sees a lot of weather issues. And
because of the age of the construction, we do have what we
call clear zone issues, and that we've addressed through
many separate projects in the past.
And we do have another project in the works right
now to treat, spot treat walk-out properties, a warp
barrier, guardrail that -- that in what we call the
Highway Safety Improvement Program, HSIP program. That
work attrition carries a very high benefit cost ratio,
meaning that there are many accidents, collisions, run off
the road type. So we (Inaudible) work on that area.
And we have also completed a design concept
report for a long range project that would carry three
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lanes in each direction through Texas Canyon, because of
the concentration of truck traffic on those grades.
Now, the dust storm issues at Safford. Several
years ago was successful in implementing a federal safety
technology project where we installed dust storm
monitoring and warning equipment that -- that those
censors detect high speed wind that would be sufficient to
bring dust aloft, as well as poor visibility. And it
triggers warning signs.
Now, having said that, consider that is a pilot
project to shake down the technology. I would tell you
and the public that that technology is not ready for prime
time yet. There's a lot of issues that we need to work
through, aside from just basic things like maintainability
and programming things in the future. We still need to
shake out the best place to put those kind of things.
So before we can contemplate putting it elsewhere
in the state, we still need to have some -- some
brilliant, hard, serious conversations about the
technology.
CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: Thank you for your comments.
The only other note I'd just like to make is we kind of
get focused and preoccupied with that corridor between
Phoenix to Tucson and some points south from Tucson to
Nogales right now with our I-11 initiatives in the
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intermountain corridors.
But we can't as a -- as a Board, and I'm sure the
Department would agree as well, ignore or put it on the
back burner the areas east of Tucson on I-10. Those have
as much significance for commerce and travel as any other
corridor in the state. And I think we get kind of
preoccupied with -- with the glamour and all of the
smoke -- not smoke and mirrors, bells and whistles --
bells and whistles that go along with the Phoenix to
Nogales issue. But we -- we need to maintain our focus
on -- on I-10 east.
MR. HARMON: I appreciate that thought,
Mr. Chair.
CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: Any other questions of the
district engineer? Thank you, Mr. Harmon.
Moving on to the director's report, we will hear
from the ADOT director, Mr. John Halikowski.
MR. HALIKOWSKI: Thank you. Thanks,
Mr. Chairman. It's Friday. It's the 13th, and I know
there's a full moon tonight, so I want to be very careful.
Also, I heard Floyd over there say let's get to the
business at hand, the five-year plan. So I -- I would
like to beg your indulgence, and I'll do a more full
report at the next meeting.
But a couple of items I want to touch on this

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last minute that have been mentioned in here. Mayor
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Rankin mentioned the fact that we need to invest in
transportation infrastructure in the state. And as you
know through our presentations to you and to the Southern
Arizona Leadership Council and other business entities
throughout the state, we've been working very hard for the
past couple of years on this key commerce corridor
8 initiative to invest $\$ 20$ billion over 20 years in the
state transportation infrastructure. That's on our
website, and our plan is there.
But more importantly, next week the
Arizona-Mexico Commission will be meeting. And our
thought is that we would like to present to the
Arizona-Mexico Commission the Transportation and Trade
Corridor Alliance where -- that we've been doing under
Governor Brewer's executive order. And within that effort
to focus on our trade corridors and increase the state's
economy is the key commerce corridor plan. So that will
be available for folks to review. And that is not the end
of the discussion.
ADOT will still keep working and meeting with
folks, as we are with we Build Arizona right now to keep
talking about how we can get investment in the state's
infrastructure through initiatives in the future.

The other thing I -- I wanted to point out is
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that you mentioned dust. And Bill $I$ know has been working on experimental dust issues. And he's got monitors at Bowie and San Simon.

Just the other day we met with some engineers at
Maricopa County who have some new ideas that $I$ just spoke
with the state engineer about on the way down here,
because right now we have difficulty detecting dust at
lower levels, say, around 2,000 feet or less.

And the other thing about the monitors we have is that they're looking at a 10 kilometer or more area. We would like to start to shrink that down to give more accurate information.

And then, of course, finally there's the link from the technology to the motorist. And our discussions are revolving around with $U$ of $A$ how we can make that link through existing databases. But eventually we're going to have to look at putting some fiber into our rights-of-way so that we can communicate with Traffic Operations Center quickly and then back through various alert systems to motorists. So we have not forgotten the dust issue, but work continues on improving that technology.

And then as far as I-10 and not forgetting that
it is one of our key commerce corridors. I called a
meeting almost a month and a half ago now, as I am
president of the Western States Transportation Officials,
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and invited all }18\mathrm{ member states to come to Tempe.
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Sixteen came.

And one of the things we're focused on is how we
improve commercial traffic accessibility throughout our 18
states. And taking the I-95 corridor example that we see
on the east coast, certainly what we would like to do is
the intermountain west states and start to focus on those
8 types of commercial corridors and form our own corridor
coalitions out here in the west. Certainly, I-10 is one
of those. I-80 may be another. I-40 could be another.
So we plan to meet again to further discuss and
come up with some ideas on how we begin to make it a more
seamless transportation system throughout the
intermountain west. So I just wanted to let you know that
for us that is kind of glamorous if we can get a number of
states together and start talking about how we can work on
specific corridors.
So, thanks, Mr. Chairman.
CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: Thank you, Director. We'll
move on to our item 3 of the agenda, our consent agenda.
Does any Board member have any items that they would like
to pull for further discussion or isolation?
BOARD MEMBER ANDERSON: Mr. Chair, I move to
approve the consent agenda as presented by staff.
boARD MEMBER LA RUE: Second.
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CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: There is a motion by
Mr. Anderson and a second by Mr. La Rue to approve the consent agenda as presented. Is there any discussion? If not, all those in favor of approving the consent agenda as presented signify by saying aye. (All Board members say aye.) CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: Opposed? Hearing non opposition -- no opposition, we'll move on with the next agenda item, which is the legislative report, as the consent agenda has been approved.

We'll now here from our Deputy Director of
Policy, Mr. Floyd Roehrich.
MR. ROEHRICH: Thank you, Mr. Chair. And good
morning to you, the Board members, and Mr. Halikowski.
Mr. Biesty sends his regrets. He could not be
here. He had a conflict. We did not have a lot to report at this time.

There's been, obviously, with the state
legislature completing their action and the governor actioning all the -- the bills and at a loss from there, he agreed with those last month, so that's fine.

On the federal level, he did want to just real quickly just state that there's still a lot of dialogue going on in Congress about reauthorization or an extension of map 21. There's no general consensus coming out yet.

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The administration has put a bill together. The House is
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putting a bill together. The Senate has put a bill
together. And -- and -- and they all have enough
differences in them that -- that they've not reached a
consensus where they think there's going to be action any
6 time soon. So we're still monitoring that. Hopefully, by
next month we'll -- we'll see some action. Because as he
8 has reported previously, with the current funding and --
9 and -- that map 21 provided for the Highway Trust Fund, we
are looking at -- or the USDOT. And then the (Inaudible)
is looking at -- at a -- possibly a -- hitting below their
$\$ 4$ billion threshold of money in the -- in the account
probably sometime in the August/September time frame,
which could require them to adjust some of the payments
back to the states.
At this point we've not seen that or analyzed any
impact to our current year's program, the 2014 program.
But it would affect moving forward 2015 if they would have
to take actions regarding reimbursement or if they do not
do an extension or something to put money into a -- a
highway bill for fiscal year 15 and beyond. We're
continuing to monitor that. Hopefully, we'll have
something more to present by next month. But that's where
the legislative report stands at this time.
And Mr. Biesty said he would be available next
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month to give more comprehensive review and get us updated
on any actions that are happening.
    CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: Mr. Roehrich, you used the
term, it could cause adjustments to the payments from the
federal government to the Department.
    Could that also be it could cause a complete
stoppage of payments?
    MR. ROEHRICH: Mr. Chair, at some point in time
that is correct. The -- the first action would be to --
to reduce payments and defer payments for projects that
are ongoing. But without a new bill, an extension that --
that would put money in for us to move forward with fiscal
year }15\mathrm{ projects, we would have to sit down and -- and
decide can we move forward with }15\mathrm{ projects, especially if
we as a state have the cash flow with our funds, given
Kristine's concerns about cash flow opportunity. It could
affect future projects, absolutely.
    CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: So the fourth quarter is -- is
when we're going to be monitoring very significantly?
    UNIDENTIFIED VOICE: Well, Mr. Chairman, to that
point, we actually began monitoring this several months
ago.
    UNIDENTIFIED VOICE: Absolutely.
    UNIDENTIFIED VOICE: Reports were coming out that
in fiscal year 14 the Highway Trust Fund was declining at
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seen because I don't think they've decided yet what
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they're going to do. But, certainly, Congress is aware
that states, if they don't do something for 15 , are -- are
going to be looking at pulling projects back.
CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: Yeah, I think the take away
from all this is that we've been struggling with reduced
revenues coming in. Now we're facing no revenues at all,
potentially.
And I've been noticing that a number of states
10 and their Transportations have taken the stance that they
11 just can't rely on the federal government and that they're
12 going to have to call their own shots and create their own
revenue sources and fund their own projects as possible
and that the partnership that existed with Washington is
no longer a viable one and it's -- I know that the
Department has been monitoring it, as you say. But it's
probably a wake up call for not only the state of Arizona
but all states that we can't rely on what happens in
Washington and we need to find our own revenue sources and
promote our own projects without relying on Washington.
Any questions on the legislative report to
Mr. Roehrich?
If not, Mr. Roehrich, would you please proceed on
behalf of Kristine Ward, the financial report.
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MR. ROEHRICH: Yes, sir, Mr. Chair. And she does
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express her regrets that -- that she was not able to make

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express her regrets that -- that she was not able to make

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2 this.
She does -- her and her staff are in the middle
4 of closing out of state fiscal year 2014, so they're --
they're reconciling all the books for that, as well as
looking at that -- that fourth quarter fiscal year 2015,
which goes until the end of September, and reviewing all
looking at that -- that fourth quarter fiscal year 2015,
which goes until the end of September, and reviewing all
8 that.
She will have a comprehensive presentation next
month that will allow her to let the Board know how -- how
we're closing out 2014 state fiscal year and then rolling
out for the end of the federal fiscal for 2014, as well.
So she will have that all available.
But the one issue she did want to say is the
five-year program that is presented to you today which has
incorporated the comments from the study session and is
brought current has been fully analyzed from her financial
perspective, and it is fully fiscally constrained. So it
meets all conditions. And I have notification that it's
meets all conditions. And I have notification that it's
gone to the FHWA, as well as now presented to the Board.
So adoption of the five-year program meets fiscal
constraint.
Any adjustments to the five-year program would
then require her to review that, which could possibly
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$\frac{\text { delay the Board taking action on that. She just wanted to }}{\text { WWW.ARIZONACOURTREPORTERS.COM }}$
delay the Board taking action on that. She just wanted to
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make sure that I had made that point.

So the five-year program as reviewed with the
Board is fiscally constrained and ready to go. And that's
all I have for a financial report.
CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: Any questions regarding the
financial report of Mr. Roehrich?
Can I ask you a question regarding the item 6,
which is now before us, which is the final approval of the
statewide transportation.
Is there a staff presentation that is in the
ready here?
MR. ROEHRICH: Mr. Chair, Mr. Omer will come up
and present that item. And then if we -- the Board has
further discussions and comments on that, we can --
CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: Okay.
MR. ROEHRICH: We can have them.
CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: So we'll proceed then with the
presentation by the assistant director for multimodal
planning, Mr. Scott Omer, who will present the final
statewide transportation facilities construction program.
UNIDENTIFIED VOICE: Mr. Chairman, I'd like to
note that Mr. Omer had a tie on this morning when I met
him, but he saw $I$ wasn't wearing one, so.
CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: So noted.
MR. OMER: If you remember Heartbreak Ridge,
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there's a reason why I took my tie off. So thank you
Mr. Chairman, members of the Board.
    I am actually really happy to -- this is my
favorite meeting of the year. Well, except for last year.
(Inaudible) approval of the five-year program. So
hopefully this is my favorite meeting of the year.
    So, again, I -- I would like to say that, you
know, we appreciate all the hard work and effort that the
Transportation Board has gone through, really, the last
four or five years. This has not been an easy process.
For the members that are newer on the Board, this isn't
the first time we've had to make multiple adjustments in
our program because of finances (Inaudible).
    This Board has also been really good about
listening to the staff and making sure that we're hearing
your input, we're hearing the -- you know, our
constituents and your -- and their input and all our
stakeholders. So we do appreciate that.
    And then I'd like to thank my staff, of course,
because they really do hit really hard for the last six
months or so of the year to make sure that we can prepare
the program. So we appreciate everyone's efforts.
    As you know, as part of our process we do conduct
three public hearings throughout the state of Arizona. We
do those in Phoenix. This year it was in Marana and also
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in Flagstaff. We have the public who make comments. We
have our web page, in person, written. As of in -- as of
May 20th, which was our public work study session, and we
also had with the Board at that time, which was the end of
the comment period, we'd only received }81\mathrm{ comments this
year, which was in big contrast to last year when we
received -- I think it was like 800.
    So, but again, we did hear -- have good comments
on the program. We make sure that we take those into
consideration as we move forward. And we do listen to the
comments, whether in writing or people coming to the -- to
the meetings or via the web page or even people coming up
and stopping to say, how about this.
    So some of the staff recommendations of the major
project changes that we talked about in May with the Board
at the study session are outlined here. And we haven't
made any other changes other than what we talked about at
the study session, and I'll show you those.
    But the recommendations that we provide today is
the SR 189 Nogales to I-19 project. The total project
cost is about $69 million. Staff's recommendation is to
22 have $2 million put aside for the environmental process in
23 FY 16, $4 million set aside for the design of the project
24 in FY 18, and then the -- the construction of the project
25 is $63 million of that project is actually we're showing
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it in FY 21, which is not -- and I'll just make it clear.
It's not in this five-year program. It is in the
Department's development program.
    The SR 347 project, the railroad pass in
Maricopa. The total cost of the project is currently
estimated at $55 million. Staff's recommendation is to
have $6 million for the design of the project in FY 15,
$5.5 million for right-of-way the project -- right-of-way
for the project in 16, another $7.3 million for
right-of-way for the project in FY 17, and the
construction of the project is about $36.2 million. And
we have that shown in FY 20, which is the first year of
the development program.
    CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: Mr. Omer, let me interrupt you
real briefly on this particular project. How does this
all configure with what the jurisdictions are inputting as
far as contributions toward the project?
    MR. OMER: So, Mr. Chairman, that's a great
question. And I think by now you know that I'm pretty
conservative. And we have not shown any local funding in
this program because we don't have an agreement in place.
    CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: And what --
    MR. OMER: As we move forward and -- and in good
faith, the City of Maricopa and any other stakeholders
that move forward to assist in funding of the project,
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we'll amend our program at that time showing the funding.
And if there was an opportunity to move forward, it would
be because of that funding that would be coming in.
    Does that answer your question?
    CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: That answers my question.
    MR. OMER: And last, the other project we talked
about in May was the US 60 Show Low to Little Mormon Lake
project. We show $6 million for the construction of that
project in FY 18. As you remember, the staff recommended
to not include it. The Board asked us to include it. So
we have done that in this -- in the program.
    Next, see, this is the same chart that we've been
showing for the last couple of years now about how we
divide up our funding, with the green being preservation
of our program -- of our transportation system, the
burgundy or red color being modernization of the system,
the purple being project development costs, the gold being
planning, and then blue being expansion of the system.
    As you can see, the expansion projects that we
have in each one of the years of the five-year program, at
least the major projects that we'd like to highlight is in
FY 15. We have the US 60 Silver King project at a total
Of $45 million in the program. US 95 Fortune Wash Bridge
project at $13.5 million in the program. We went and
showed the SR 347 Maricopa Road overpass design as $6
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million -- or $6 million for design of the project in FY
15.
    SR 260 Thousand Trails is a $62 million project
in FY 16. SR 347, the first year of right-of-way for the
project at $5.5 million. And the SR 189 Nogales 919
project, the environmental document for $2 million in FY
16.
    Moving on to FY 17, the SR 89 Junction 89A to
Deep Well Ranch Road is $15 million in FY 17. With the
design of the I-15 -- I-15 bridge number one project for
$2.5 million in FY 17, and SR 347, the other section --
segment of the right-of-way at $7.3 million in FY 17.
    Moving on to FY 18, SR 189 design at $4 million.
The SR 60 Show Low to Little Mormon Lake is shown at
$6 million in FY 18. And that's the only two major
projects that we have in the program in that year.
    And then in FY 19 we would have the design of the
260 Lion Springs project, and the construction of the I-15
Virgin River Bridge project is $33 million in FY 19.
    We move on to the development program. We did
balance the program to make sure that we're still trying
to get to that point where we would keep preservation as a
key component in the -- in the -- for the Department we
have to make sure we're preserving our actual
transportation system.
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So as I had mentioned earlier, we put SR 347 construction in the project at $\$ 35.2$ million to $\$ 36.2$ million -- sorry -- in FY 20. SR 189 construction of the project in Nogales at $\$ 63$ million in $F Y$ 21. I-10 SR 87
Picacho Peak project is scheduled at $\$ 85$ million in $F Y 22$.
And I-10 Early to I-8 is $\$ 40$ million $F Y 23$.

And we did not include any other expansion

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projects in the development program. We really felt that
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it was important for us to be able to fund preservation
and still be able to keep our system preserves. We didn't
add any expansion -- or, yeah, any expansion (Inaudible).
We're trying to preserve our system.
Individual project updates that we've done in the
regions. We did have, you know, conversations with PAG,
and we made sure that we covered all the changes that need
to be made. Slight changes on I-10 Ina Road TI. And I
spoke to you about this at the study session. We
decreased the amount of RTA funds by $\$ 1.5$ million in FY
16, so it changed it from $\$ 34.2$ million to $\$ 32.7$ million.
On the same project we added PAG STP funds in FY 16 for a
total of $\$ 600,000$. And PAG Regional Council approved us
on March 27 th.

The SR 87 Town of Sells project, we advanced the construction of that project from $F Y 15$ to $F Y$ 14. So you would not see it in this new program. It's actually moved

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up to this year.
    The SR 86 Valencia to Kenney project. This
project really did cause us to make numerous adjustments
to the transportation five-year program in general,
because we had to delay this project from FY 14 to FY 15.
It's $43.4 million. And we did have to make other
adjustments to make sure that we could find a place for it
The other projects that were moved because of
this project were the I-14 Walnut Canyon, the Twin Airs
project, SR 89 milepost -- I'm sorry. It's the Slide
project south of Page at $25 million. And SR 86 Town of
Sells to Fresnal project, which I just mentioned. All
these projects were moved to other -- to other fiscal
years than FY 14 in order to fund this project in FY 15.
    UNIDENTIFIED VOICE: (Inaudible). It's in 14,
right?
    MR. OMER: The other proposed changes in the MAG
region. We did look at the freeway management system in
the MAG region, and MAG -- freeway management system
program is updated to align with delays. Revenue
production projections. The MAG Regional Council did
approve this on May 28th.
    The I-IO Fairway Drive to El Mirage TI, we have
design for the project in FY }15\mathrm{ and right-of-way for the
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1 project FY 15, as well, for a total between those two of
$1.9 million.
    A little bit more detail about the }189\mathrm{ project.
As I reported to you at the study session, the project is
ongoing. The DCR and the planning environmental linkage's
project was developing (Inaudible) alternatives if we
complete it a little bit later on. The current cost
estimate is $69 million. We're showing you how we're
going to put those into the program.
    We didn't feel like the delivery project --
delivery of the project would be a high risk. It's more
of a medium risk because of the lack of the identification
of the final funding for the project. Even though we have
it in our development program, it's not -- that part isn't
(Inaudible) physically constrained. And the NPA document
is on hold until the funding source can be committed to
implement the recommendations of the final project itself.
    And the SR 347 project. As I just talked about,
this project will be -- the DCR is going to be complete at
the end of this calendar year, so in fiscal year 15.
    Let's talk a little bit about how we put the
project into the program. And when this project is
completed with phases of the project in the program, we
think we can go ahead and sign off -- or the Federal
Highway Administration can sign off on the environmental
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(Inaudible) because it has specific segments of the

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(Inaudible) because it has specific segments of the

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project funded.

US 60 to Little Mormon Lake project. We have it
on hold. We'll start the project up again as soon as
the -- if the Board chooses -- approves this project
today. We have it at $\$ 6$ million, and that's pretty much
it. We were asked to put this project back into the
8 program.
So, Mr. Chair, that's the end of my presentation.
I'd gladly ask any other -- or answer any questions.

you mean the development program?
BOARD MEMBER BEAVER: No. The development
program is in here. I see that. But I don't see the
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programs that you just -- the slides you just had up
there, I don't see those in here.
    MR. OMER: Okay. Sorry. Mr. Chair, Ms. Beaver,
while the slides may not be in there, the actual physical
projects --
    BOARD MEMBER BEAVER: Projects.
    MR. OMER: -- are in the program, so.
    BOARD MEMBER BEAVER: Okay. Well, I was looking
for those two --
    MR. OMER: Correct.
    BOARD MEMBER BEAVER: -- and I was struggling
to -- to Iocate them.
    MR. OMER: Which two? Are you looking for two
specific projects?
    BOARD MEMBER BEAVER: Yes. The Mormon.
    CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: The Show Low project?
    BOARD MEMBER BEAVER: Yeah, the Show Low Mormon
Lake project, specifically. And --
    CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: SR 347 or --
    MR. OMER: It's going to be on Page 33 in the
program. It sounds like I'm speaking -- I'm in church.
It's on Page 33 of your program. We can all sing now.
The third project up from the bottom.
    BOARD MEMBER BEAVER: Okay.
    CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: Any further questions of
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Mr. Omer?
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BOARD MEMBER LA RUE: Mr. Chair, I think she had
one other --
BOARD MEMBER BEAVER: And 347.
CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: I'm sorry.

by saying aye.
(All Board members say aye.)
CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: Opposed? Hearing none, the
five-year program plan is approved.
Our next agenda item is a report on our
9 multimodal planning division. And once again we'll hear
from our assistant director of multimodal planning,
Mr. Scott Omer.
MR. OMER: Thank you, Mr. Chair. So as usual I'm
here to give an update on the I-11 Intermountain west
Corridor study. And kind of like the program, we're
winding this thing up as well, and you won't have to be
hearing about this very much longer.
So kind of where we're at on the project is -- is
we've said all along that this study was scheduled to be
wrapped up in July. And I'm holding -- holding firm that
we're going to wrap this up in July.
What we have next is we have the final public
meetings are scheduled in the Tucson area on June 18, in
Phoenix on June 25 th, and then there's some virtual public
meetings that have been going on throughout the last --
throughout this month and into next month. And in
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culmination of that, it ends up being that we'll be
confirming what the study recommendations are and
proposing an implementation plan, both near-term and
long-term steps and presenting the business case that will
basically -- what it says is that we feel that the
corridor is viable. It does have business case that
supports it. And we would at that point put the project
on hold and -- well, actually, not put it on hold, but
we'd adopt this project as complete at that time. We will
bring back the final recommendations to the Board,
probably ask if you would like to see those in a study
session or in this meeting. We could do a final
presentation of exactly what the recommendations are.
    But, Mr. Chair, that's the completion of my I-11
update for this month.
    CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: So you're still -- as you say,
you're still holding firm on the July timetable for the
study completion?
    MR. OMER: I am. I'm not holding the contract,
but I do believe that that's what we're (Inaudible) for
wrapping this up in July. That's -- we have not had
any -- any indications that that wasn't going to happen.
    CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: Okay. Any questions regarding
the I-11 corridor study or project from the Board?
    Hearing going none, Mr. Omer, you're still on the
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(Inaudible) here for the item 8, the priority planning
advisory committee report.
    MR. OMER: Mr. Chair, we do have -- actually, we
have two separate sections to go today. The first is the
May 28 PPAC meeting. We do have projects 8 A, as in
alpha, through 8 X, as in x-ray, that were project
modifications.
    The Department would recommend approval of these

individually, we can pull those. If not, we'd recommend
all these projects at one time.

would like to have those projects pulled?

rail bank protection, the Department just underestimated
that item. All bids from all bidders were higher than the
Department estimate for that item. So based on that
information and review of the bid tabs, it is recommended
the contract be awarded to Southwest Concrete Paving.
CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: District 5 is Hank's, isn't
it? So seeing he's not here, is there any questions of
the state engineer regarding this contract?
Hearing no questions, the Chair would entertain a
motion to accept and approve the staff's recommendation to
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award the contract for item 10 A to Southwest Concrete
Paving Company.
    BOARD MEMBER BEAVER: So moved.
    BOARD MEMBER SELLERS: Second.
    CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: There's a motion by Ms. Beaver
and a second by Mr. Sellers to accept and approve staff's
recommendation to award the contract for item 10 A to
Southwest Concrete Paving Company.
    Discussion? All those in favor of the motion

work must be done in kind of piecemeal fashion. They're
also done at night, resulting in lower production rates
than what the Department estimated. So it is recommended
that the contract be awarded to AJP Electric.
    CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: Who represents District 4?
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    The reason for the differences on this project is

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move for approval.
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that waste material could be buried on-site. But the
depth could not be sufficient to allow that, so it results
in a higher haul cost for the disposal of that. In
addition, we thought that the structural concrete could be
dumped directly into the forms, and we actually are going
to need to use a conveyor to move the -- the concrete,
which results in a higher cost, as well. So based on the
analysis and the bid tabs, it is recommended the contract

MR. OMER: Thank you, Mr. Chair. So Arizona
State Transportation Board policy No. 39 provides the transportation board the ability to fund airport
development loan projects to airports for revenue generating projects which are not eligible for development grants. The Boards sets aside \(\$ 2\) miliion for that annually. At least there was in 2014, there was \(\$ 2\) million set aside.

Our guidelines require when we consider these
loans a review and a recommendation by an Airport
Development Loan Committee. We make a recommendation to the Board. That committee consists of the airport route manager, my client, who is here today. Kristine ward is our chief financial officer. The Chairman, Mr. Christy, is on the committee, as well as myself.

So we reviewed the loan applications and make a
recommendation of yes or no. So the City of Williams as
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the Mr. -- as the Chairman has said did apply for a grant
of \$500,000 to construct new aircraft storage hangars at
the City owned and operated HA Clark Airport.
We found the submission, the application was
complete. We reviewed it and the Airport Development Loan
Committee makes the recommendation to the Board to approve
this loan application by the City of Williams. So we
would ask the Board to approve the loan of \$500,000 to the
City of Williams for construction of new airport --
aircraft storage hanger at the HA Clark Airport in
Williams, Arizona.
CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: Any questions regarding this
agenda item of Mr. Omer from the Board?
Hearing no requests for questions, the Chair
would entertain a motion to approve the airport
development plan loan in the amount of \$500,000 to the
City of Williams for construction of new aircraft storage
hangers at the City owned and operated HA Clark Airport in

Mr. Sellers to approve.

The second item we were asked to -- to coordinate
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was for the Mexican Consulate in Tucson, Council Ricardo

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Pineda Albarran, to come here and talk about the
relationship, the background and development opportunities
of Mexico in relationship with -- with Arizona.
    I reached out to his executive assistant. He is
working with the Council to find a date. This month did
not work. I kind of -- on behalf of your -- extend -- on
behalf of yourself, Mr. Chair, extended it as open that
invitation for any time this year. I've given him the
full list of -- of the planned meetings and locations, and
I'm waiting to hear back from him. I'll follow up maybe
in a week or two if I don't hear from him as far as when
we can get that scheduled.
    CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: Great.
    MR. ROEHRICH: So those are the two items that we
have that we're moving forward with for future agenda
topics.
    CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: Great. And one other item,
just to keep it in the record, as well as on the front
burner is according to Mr. Omer, we are still on -- on
course for the July results of the studies for the I-11
corridor. And I just want to make sure that that report
23 will be agendized. I'm sure it will fall under the
24 standing agenda item regarding the \(I-11\) under multimodal
5 planning.
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MR. ROEHRICH: Mr. Chris -- Mr. Chair, I think what we'll do is because that's a more comprehensive
report than just the update, we'll put that as an agenda
item. So we'll be able to review any aspect of that
report or any final recommendations or (Inaudible).

CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: For the July meeting?
MR. OMER: Probably not. It won't be completed.
MR. ROEHRICH: I think if it will -- completed in
July, in my opinion, and \(I\) think -- Scott, you tell me
different -- August will probably be the first time that
we'll be able to come in and comprehensively discuss it.

CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: Okay.
MR. ROEHRICH: We need time to prepare and -- and
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pull together what all the final recommendations are

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and -- and elements of the report.

CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: Very good. Does any Board
member have any suggestions for future agenda items?

Hearing none, the Chair would gratefully
entertain a motion to adjourn

BOARD MEMBER ANDERSON: So moved.
CHAIRMAN CHRISTY: There's a motion by
Mr. Anderson. Is there a second?

\section*{REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION}

TO THE HONORABLE ARIZONA TRANSPORTATION BOARD:
The Intermodal Transportation Division has made a thorough investigation concerning the disposal of portion of right of way easement previously used for rest area purposes, originally acquired for use within the above referenced projects.

\section*{REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION}

TO THE HONORABLE ARIZONA TRANSPORTATION BOARD:
The Intermodal Transportation Division has made a thorough investigation concerning the establishment and improvement of State Route 260 within the above referenced project.

TO THE HONORABLE ARIZONA TRANSPORTATION BOARD:
The Intermodal Transportation Division has made a thorough investigation concerning the establishment of new right of way as a state route and state highway for the improvement of State Route 260 within the above referenced project.

The existing alignment, originally known as the Payson Heber Road, was established as a state route by Resolution 62-63 of the Arizona State Highway Commission, dated January 02, 1962, designated State Route 160; and was established as a state highway through Resolution 62-111, dated July 16, 1962. The route was placed on the Federal Aid Primary System by Resolution 65-28, dated April 02, 1965. Additional right of way for improvements was established as a state highway by Resolution 6787, dated December 05, 1967. The highway became known as the Payson - Heber - Show Low State Highway, and was renumbered and designated as State Route 260 by Resolution 69-114, dated December 04, 1969.
