South Dakota Hot Trends in Healthcare



South Dakota's healthcare industry is a major source of employment and earnings in South Dakota, accounting for more than 15 percent of all workers in privately owned establishments and nearly 20 percent of those employers' payrolls.



South Dakota's healthcare industry added more workers than any other industry from 2004-2014. This industry added more than 8,500 workers during that period, growth of more than 19 percent.



South Dakota's healthcare industry is projected to be

among the largest growth industries through 2022; it will add an estimated 7,305 workers to South Dakota's

economy. The rate of growth is projected to be 13.8 percent,

almost double the 7.0 percent growth projected for all industries.



The healthcare practitioners and technical occupations group is projected to be the fastest-growing occupational group in South Dakota to 2022.



Many healthcare occupations in South Dakota are projected to have higher-than-average demand for workers through 2022.



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The Statistics Behind the Trends

South Dakota's healthcare industry is a major source of employment and earnings in South Dakota, accounting for 51,817 workers (or 15.3 percent of all workers in privately owned establishments) and 19.6 percent of statewide privately owned establishment payroll in 2014 (based on Quarterly Census of Employment & Wages).

The number of workers in South Dakota's healthcare industry increased 19.7 percent from 2004 to 2014, significantly higher than the 12.8 percent increase among all private industries (based on Quarterly Census of Employment & Wages).

South Dakota's healthcare industry is projected to be among the largest growth industries through 2022. The industry is projected to add 7,305 workers to South Dakota's economy (from a level of 52,875 in 2012 to a level of 60,180 in 2022). The rate of growth is projected to be 13.8 percent, nearly double the 7.0 percent growth projected in total employment for all industries.

The healthcare practitioners and technical occupations group is projected to be the fastest-growing occupational group in South Dakota to 2022. Employment in this group (including such occupations as family and general practitioners, registered nurses and physical therapists, to name a few) is projected to increase by more than 3,800 workers and 13.1 percent by 2022.

Several healthcare occupations in South Dakota are projected to have higher-than-average demand for workers in 2022. (The average annual demand for workers across all occupations is projected to be 20 workers.) The table below shows the employment and demand projections for those healthcare occupations projected to have higher-than-average demand for workers.
