- Typical tasks include interpreting prescription orders, communicating information such
 as uses, side effects and drug interactions, and assisting patients in the selection of
 nonprescription medicines and health products.
- A Pharmacist must enjoy working with people and helping those in need.
- The Pharmacist remains the most accessible health professional to the general public.

- Doctoral or professional degree in Pharmacy

Job Outlook?

Employment of Pharmacists is expected to grow by 17 percent between 2010 and 2022, which is faster than the average for all occupations. The increasing numbers of middle-aged and elderly people - who use more prescription drugs than younger people - will continue to spurdemand for Pharmacists throughout the projection period. In addition, as scientific advances lead to new drug products, and as an increasing number of people obtain prescription drug coverage, the need for these workers will continue to expand.
