



The Auburn Police Department was inspected by the Placer County Juvenile Justice Commission on Friday, April 22, 2011. The purpose of the inspection is to insure that the Auburn Police Department is in compliance with the policies outlined in Title 15, Article 14, of the California Code of Regulations. The team was met by Sgt Garlock. Sgt Garlock was very polite, professional and providing.

Juveniles are provided orientation upon arrival, and, depending upon the alleged crime, may, or may not, be handcuffed or restrained.

A juvenile's duration of stay normally does not exceed an hour.

The juveniles are kept under constant supervision.

There are no holding cells. Those to be further detained are taken to the Placer County Juvenile Hall.

Toilet facilities and drinking water are readily available.

If a juvenile is to be released to a parent or guardian, he/she is retained under supervision in the detention room.

The facility was found clean, safe and secure.

The number of juveniles held in this facility for the past twelve (12) months averaged less than four (4) per month, down from the ten (10) per month in the preceding year.

All records were well documented and it was obvious that the Auburn Police Department abides and meets the criteria of Title 15, Article 14, of the California Code of Regulations. All police officers are constantly up-dated and trained on the regulations. It is noted that the Auburn PD is currently utilizing a lot of volunteer staff from the Auburn community.

The Placer County Juvenile Justice Commission finds the Auburn Police Department in compliance with Title 15, Article 14, California Code of Regulations.
