**INFORMATION:**

Koinonia Group Home #3 is an Adolescent Residential Substance Abuse Treatment Program. Koinonia Foster Homes Inc began 26 years ago and was founded by Miriam Golden. The current treatment program was instituted approximately 17 years ago. The residents range in age from 13 through 17 all male minors, ( 18yrs of age with CCL exemption). Approximately 70% of these minors fulfill their probationary commitments.

This facility appears to be well run by dedicated staff. Residents come from different parts of California, to reside in the Koinonia Group Home facility to rehabilitate with the efforts to over come substance abuse and other associated issues. The staff is dedicated, and works well with the minors.

The home is nicely furnished, clean, and well organized. Rooms were neat and adequate. The home is structured to meet the needs of the youth residents. The residence has weight equipment in the garage that is offered to the residences both as part of their Physical Education Program as well as part of their merit system to reward residents for good behavior. An exception to that is the heavy bag that youth are allowed to use to vent frustrations when necessary. The home also has a clean swimming pool, a half court basketball court, pool table and a well furnished BBQ area. Outside/day trip activities are well planned

and offer the residences unique exposure to the positive aspects for altering their previous life styles.

The staff maintains the proper ration of staff to resident at 2 staff for every 6 residents during the day while awake and 1 staff for every 6 residents at night when residents are asleep.

All Minors that reside at Koinonia attend school, and receive an appropriate program that is set for their individual needs. Koinonia contracts with Placer County Office of Education to provide Educational Services at the Koinonia Day School.

Certificates/Licenses are posted as is the houses disaster plan. Fire drills are conducted monthly. All

The program offers a great opportunity for the youth with a balance of education, recreation while maintaining a structured rehabilitation program.
