

### Introduction

### **Kentucky Center for Education and Workforce Statistics**

The Kentucky Center for Education and Workforce Statistics (KCEWS) is a state office whose purpose is to provide independent, accurate, and timely data about the Commonwealth's education and workforce processes to better inform policy making and practice. The Center produces reports such as the Kentucky High School Feedback Reports, Early Childhood Profiles, and the Kentucky County Profiles. The Center also produces a variety of white papers about teacher preparation and retention, employment outcomes, and various other topics to inform decision makers, practitioners, and the general public. We also develop statewide metrics on education and workforce and conduct research for the state and various organizations.

The Center was created through Executive Order in 2012 then formalized in statute in 2013 to expand upon the work of the Kentucky P-20 Data Collaborative. The Center is attached to the Education and Workforce Development Cabinet Office of the Secretary and is overseen by a Board composed of the agency heads from the Kentucky Department of Education (KDE), the Council on Postsecondary Education (CPE), the Education Professional Standards Board (EPSB), the Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority (KHEAA), and the Kentucky Department for Workforce Investment.

The Center maintains the Kentucky Longitudinal Data System (KLDS) which includes early childhood, K-12, postsecondary, adult education, and workforce data. The KLDS securely links and de-identifies data from various state data systems seamlessly which allows the state to develop a broader understanding about the education to workforce continuum.

By bringing information together across agencies and sectors here are a few examples of the kind of analyses the office has conducted which can only be performed with a system like the KLDS Kentucky has developed:

a. By linking high school and college data we are able to better understand how high school experiences affect college going and success. We are able to provide much richer data about college preparation linked back to high schools so we can improve alignment between the two areas.

- b. Bringing together kindergarten readiness data with information about poverty and child care options in Kentucky's counties allows us to better inform parents and local decision makers about the state of early childhood in communities and provide insights into actions necessary to ensure that all of Kentucky's children enter schools with the skills they need to be successful.
- c. By linking teacher preparation programs to the schools where their graduates teach, we provide important information about the impact these teachers have on local schools and also provide Universities with feedback they can use to adapt their programs to ensure that future teachers enter the classrooms with the skills they need to have the greatest impact on student learning.
- d. Linking education and employment records allows us to know if our graduates are entering the workforce and earning a reasonable wage, how well our colleges are meeting the needs of Kentucky's industries, and what the return on investment is for our education and training programs.








Percentage of Adults with a Bachelor's Degree or Higher, Appalachian and Non-Appalachian Regions





### Percentage of Appalachian Region Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Non-Appalachian Region Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013










### Percentage of Adults with a Bachelor's Degree or Higher in Non-Appalachian Region, 1980-2013


# Percentage of Population Living in Poverty




## Percentage of Adults in Kentucky Counties with a Bachelor's Degree or Higher Compared to the United States



# Percentage of Adults in Kentucky Counties with a Bachelor's Degree or Higher



# Percentage of 2012 Public High School Graduates Attending College in 2012-13





## Percentage of 2014 Public High School Graduates Ready for College and/or Career\* by Graduation



## Percentage of 2014 Public High School Graduates Ready for College\* by Graduation




## Percentage of 2014 Public High School Graduates Ready for Career\* by Graduation











### Percentage of Allen County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Anderson County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Ballard County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013









### Percentage of Barren County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Bath County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Bell County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











### Percentage of Boone County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











### Percentage of Bourbon County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











### Percentage of Boyd County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Boyle County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Bracken County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Breathitt County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013









### Percentage of Breckinridge County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Bullitt County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Butler County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013















### Percentage of Calloway County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Campbell County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Carroll County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Carter County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Casey County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Christian County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Clark County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Clay County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Clinton County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Crittenden County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Cumberland County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Daviess County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013

















#### Percentage of Elliott County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Estill County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Fayette County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











#### Percentage of Fleming County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Floyd County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











#### Percentage of Franklin County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Fulton County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Gallatin County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Garrard County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Grant County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











#### Percentage of Graves County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Grayson County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Green County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











### Percentage of Greenup County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Hancock County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











### Percentage of Hardin County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











### Percentage of Harlan County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Harrison County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Hart County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Henderson County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Henry County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











### Percentage of Hickman County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Hopkins County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013



















### Percentage of Jefferson County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013















### Percentage of Johnson County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











### Percentage of Kenton County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Knott County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











#### Percentage of Knox County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











#### Percentage of Larue County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Laurel County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Lawrence County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Lee County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Leslie County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Letcher County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Lewis County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Lincoln County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013





















#### Percentage of Madison County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Magoffin County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











#### Percentage of Marion County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











#### Percentage of Marshall County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Martin County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Mason County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











### Percentage of McCracken County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013









### Percentage of McCreary County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











### Percentage of McLean County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Meade County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











### Percentage of Menifee County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013









### Percentage of Mercer County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013









### Percentage of Metcalfe County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











### Percentage of Monroe County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Montgomery County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Morgan County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











### Percentage of Muhlenberg County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











### Percentage of Nelson County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Nicholas County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Ohio County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











### Percentage of Oldham County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Owsley County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











#### Percentage of Perry County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Pike County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Powell County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013









#### Percentage of Pulaski County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Robertson County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











#### Percentage of Rockcastle County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Rowan County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Russell County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Scott County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Shelby County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











#### Percentage of Simpson County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











#### Percentage of Spencer County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Taylor County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Todd County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











#### Percentage of Trigg County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











#### Percentage of Trimble County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











#### Percentage of Union County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











#### Percentage of Warren County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Washington County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Wayne County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013















#### Percentage of Whitley County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











#### Percentage of Wolfe County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Woodford County Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013










#### Percentage of Adults with a Bachelor's Degree or Higher in Woodford County, 1980-2013







#### Percentage of Barren River District Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Big Sandy District Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Bluegrass District Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Buffalo Trace District Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Cumberland Valley District Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of FIVCO District Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Gateway District Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Green River District Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Kentucky River District Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of KIPDA District Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













#### Percentage of Lake Cumberland District Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Lincoln Trail District Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Northern Kentucky District Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Pennyrile District Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Purchase District Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











### Percentage of Adults with a Bachelor's Degree or Higher in Purchase District, 1980-2013







### Percentage of Barren River WIA Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Bluegrass WIA Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013









### Percentage of Cumberlands WIA Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of EKCEP WIA Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











### Percentage of Green River WIA Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











### Percentage of Kentuckiana Works WIA Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013











### Percentage of Lincoln Trail WIA Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of Northern Kentucky WIA Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of TENCO WIA Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013













### Percentage of West Kentucky WIA Population Living in Poverty, 1980-2013








