OPINION OF THE COURT UPON FURTHER REVIEW

PECINOVSKY, Judge:

On 15 August 2001, we affirmed the appellant's findings and sentence following a factual and legal sufficiency review. On 12 March 2002, our superior court set aside our decision and remanded the case for further review consistent with *United States v. Sills*, 56 M.J. 239, 241 (2002).

Upon further review, we again affirm the approved findings and sentence, adopting the rationale of our 15 August 2001 decision. In that decision, although we noted *United States v. Washington*, 54 M.J. 936 (A.F. Ct. Crim. App. 2001), we applied the "beyond a reasonable doubt" standard for factual sufficiency as set forth in *United*

States v. Turner, 25 M.J. 324, 325 (C.M.A. 1987). In fact, we have applied the *Turner* standard in every case, except *United States v. Nazario*, 56 M.J. 572 (A.F. Ct. Crim. App. 2001). The only reason we did not apply the *Turner* standard in that case was to preserve the issue for review by our superior court. *Nazario*, 56 M.J. at 575.

The approved findings and sentence are correct in law and fact, and no error prejudicial to the substantial rights of the appellant occurred. Article 66(c), UCMJ; *United States v. Turner*, 25 M.J. 324, 325 (C.M.A. 1987). Accordingly, the approved findings and sentence are

AFFIRMED.
