On 10 April 2013, counsel for the petitioner filed a motion for an emergency stay of the Article 32, UCMJ, investigation scheduled for 12 April 2013 and a Petition for Extraordinary Relief in the Nature of a Writ of Prohibition, asking us to enjoin the government from proceeding with the Article 32, UCMJ, investigation and/or referring his case to a general court-martial.

ORDERED:

That the Article 32, UCMJ, investigation in the case of *United States v. Staff* Sergeant Justin G. Porter is hereby stayed.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

That the United States shall show cause, within ten calendar days of its receipt of this order why the petitioner's request for extraordinary relief should not be granted. A copy of the government's response shall be served on the petitioner, who may file a reply within five calendar days after service.
