### PER CURIAM:

In our review of this case, which was submitted to us on its merits, the appellant has indicated, in a footnote in his assignment of errors, that it is unclear whether the trial defense counsel was permitted to examine the record of trial before authentication in accordance with Rule for Courts-Martial (R.C.M.) 1103(i)(1)(B). However, the addendum to the staff judge advocate's recommendation (SJAR) states that the trial defense counsel was given the record of trial and the SJAR on 28 September 2001, seven days after authentication by the military judge. Additionally, the appellant was served with a copy of the record on 25 September 2001. In his response to the SJAR, the trial defense counsel did not object to the contents of the record of trial. Accordingly, the appellant suffered no prejudice even if his trial defense counsel was not afforded the opportunity to examine the record of trial prior to authentication. *See* Article 38(c), UCMJ, 10 U.S.C. § 838(c); *United States v. Munoz*, 54 M.J. 917 (A.F. Ct. Crim. App. 2001), pet. denied, 55 M. J. 371 (2001).

The findings and sentence are correct in law and fact, and no error prejudicial to the substantial rights of the appellant occurred. Article 66(c), UCMJ; *United States v. Turner*, 25 M.J. 324, 325 (C.M.A. 1987). Accordingly, the approved findings and sentence are

AFFIRMED.
