



Teleconferencing and Public Hearing Protocol:

- ☐ Public hearing teleconferences are electronic extensions of the committee process, and are usually limited to a specific subject or bill.
- ☐ Hearing protocol is selected by the committee chairperson.
- ☐ The chair may request that the testimony be limited to a certain length of time, and will decide the order of participation in the teleconference.
- Before beginning your testimony, state your name and whom you represent, if applicable.
- Remember to identify yourself each time you speak.
- ☐ Indicate to the chair when you have concluded your testimony.
- ☐ Teleconference protocol during formal committee meetings shall be designed to serve the agenda of the committee and accommodate the conventions of a legislative hearing.
- Anytime during the hearing, <u>if you decided not</u> <u>to testify</u> or if your testimony is longer than the allotted time, our office will provide your written materials to the hearing committee.


