Findings: N.C. Agriculture, Health Officials Identify Source of E.coli Outbreak. N.C. DHHS news release, Nov. 10, 2011.

The N.C. Division of Public Health reports that it is still investigating 27 cases related to the E. coli outbreak. Eleven cases are confirmed E. coli cases; 16 cases are still being investigated.

Of the 11 confirmed cases, 10 were confirmed by the State Laboratory of Public Health as being E. coli 0157:H7 with matching PFGE patterns (DNA fingerprinting). The 11th case did not have laboratory confirmation of E.coli 0157:H7, but had hemolytic uremic syndrome, an uncommon, but serious complication of E. coli 0157:H7 infection. The remaining 16 cases were clinically confirmed as connected to the outbreak, meaning they had symptoms consistent with E. coli 0157:H7.
