<u>Goal</u>: To establish an electronic, online business portal that provides timely, accurate, and comprehensive access to expert resources, information, and online applications for licensing and permits necessary to conduct business in lowa.

Project Purpose: To plan and implement enhancements to the on-line Business License Information Center (BLIC) to enable:

- 1. The business user and entrepreneur to accurately and quickly search and identify their business compliance requirements and resources across the state government enterprise, successfully navigate and link to regulatory agency web sites, and complete and submit required business documents electronically.
- 2. BLIC to provide 24/7 access to information that is accurate, timely, and comprehensive.

Background:

lowa Code section 15E.17 provides that the lowa Department of Economic Development (IDED) is responsible for providing resources to enable a person interested in establishing a commercial facility or engaging in a commercial activity to obtain information about of any registration, license, or other approval of a state regulatory agency that is required for the activity under lowa law. In turn, agencies which administer these regulatory requirements are required to keep IDED informed of them and to update that information as needed.

Since 1997, the Business License Information has served as the lowa gateway to information on the numerous licensing, certification, and permitting requirements that apply to business activities in the State of lowa. When it was developed, BLIC represented a major innovation in the application of technology to enhance access to information which often is elusive and confusing to persons doing business in lowa. However, by today's standards, BLIC's interface and organization are confusing and difficult to use, as they do not reflect innovations which have been developed in electronic, web-based delivery of information since BLIC's design was implemented. If BLIC is to realize its full potential to simplify and shorten the task of locating licensing and permitting information for users, it is time to incorporate new technologies.

Expected Results in this Project:

- ► Make Iowa more competitive
- ► Enhance service to existing and prospective business
- ► Reduce unnecessary regulatory delays
- ► Reduce costs of compliance
- ▶ Increase business focus on core activities rather than compliance
- ► Increase compliance rates

Improving accessibility of regulatory information will enhance the ability of business to operate efficiently in lowa, but the services provided by BLIC may be especially important to small and medium sized businesses, whose resources to independently develop information about the complexities of regulatory compliance are limited. The Small Business Administration (SBA) reports that "entrepreneurs, innovators, and small business are key players in the economy in lowa. They make up most of the employer firms in the state and their contribution is indispensable," and they are an expanding sector in lowa: According to 2004 U.S. Census data reports that lowa small business payroll was \$17.7 billion; a five percent increase from the prior year. The Business License Information Center responds to about 300 calls a months from business seeking assistance and direction. Providing ready access to

regulatory information frees up business resources to concentrate on their core business activities. This access is also likely to enhance regulatory compliance as both requirements and resources are identified early in the business and project planning cycle.

Request: \$20,000 to support the Scope Analysis of requirements to improve services delivered through BLIC and the development of a sequential plan to modernize BLIC's operations through the application of available web enabled technologies.
