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Recap of March 9, 2005 IOWAccess Advisory Council Meeting

The following actions were taken by the lowAccess Advisory Council in the March 9, 2005 meeting:

User Fees for the Cabin and Campground Reservations Online Application

Point(s) of Contact: Tim Erickson, Iowa Interactive; Sherry Arntzen, DNR

Action Taken: The Council approved a \$2 fee for each transaction made through this system. (Note: One transaction may include a single reservation or multiple reservations.) The system will provide reservation services for 72 cabins, 48 campgrounds, 24 day-use lodges, and numerous picnic shelters located in state parks. All the development work will be done upfront at no cost, with lowa Interactive working on the reservation system on a transaction-based fee model. ITE would get paid \$1 per transaction for its work and lowa Interactive would get paid \$1.00 per transaction for its work on this application. The DNR reservation fee would be in addition to the \$2. The anticipated total fee would be \$3-\$6 per reservation in addition to whatever the campground fee or cabin rental would be. This new service would allow people to use a credit cards to pay for these reservations (not previously an option). People could still show up at a campground and reserve in person without paying the transaction fee.

Online Teacher License Renewal Convenience Fee

Point of Contact: Gary Borlaug, Department of Education

Action Taken: The Council approved a \$3 convenience fee for each transaction made online through this system. The service is expected to go live March 30, 2005. The \$3 fee would go to the Board of Educational Examiners to defray the credit card fees.

State of Iowa Purchasing Results Website

Point of Contact: Jim Chrisinger, Department of Management

Action Taken: The Council approved \$50,688.00 to be used to add data and functionality to the existing Purchasing Results Website.



Iowa Supreme Court Commissions Project

Point of Contact: Paul Wieck

Action Taken: The Council approved \$38,875 to be used to pay one-half of the cost to plan a project to develop a website to provide the public online information regarding lawyers, including disciplinary actions; provide online license-related services to lawyers and court reporters; and provide electronic reporting and interest payment services to lawyer's trust account depositories. The planning will include developing an external web interface, converting the existing MS-Access database to Oracle, and developing an internal interface to the Oracle database. The Court Commissions are contributing \$38,875 of their funds toward this planning.

Information Technology Council Update: In their March meeting, the Information Technology Council approved their recommendations for User fees: \$2 for Cabin and Campground Reservations plus a 2.75% credit card fee; and \$3 user fee for the Online Teacher License Renewal application.

Electronic Tax Administration Program - March 23, 2004

Operational support of two important initiatives continues while development of the sales tax module of the e File & Pay application is underway.

Under the state's Individual Income Tax Electronic Filing programs over 600,000 income tax returns have been submitted. This represents an increase of nearly 5 percent over the 2004 activity

Utilization of the Withholding module has gone extremely well as the department has experienced continued and increasing acceptance of the program by those withholding agents who have filed semi-monthly or monthly tax payments. The department has recently completed over 30 presentations to taxpayers throughout the state. Over 1,400 withholding agents have taken advantage of these overview sessions to learn more how the e File & Pay application can make their tax filing more efficient.

Design of the Sales and Use tax component has been completed and application development and test plan development have begun in anticipation of a July 1 implementation. Design of the Motor Vehicle Fuel Tax component of the application is continuing leading to a deployment later in 2005.

eGovernment Policy Research Project - March 23, 2005

For the e-government policy research project, the Public Policy and Administration Program (PPAP) has continued working with the IOWAccess subcommittee and the Center for Survey Statistics and Methodology (Survey Center). We at the PPAP have worked on both the business and citizen surveys simultaneously for the past month.

For e-government business survey:

- Drs. Yu-Che Chen and Kurt Thurmaier at Public Policy and Administration Program (PPAP) have worked with graduate students to conduct extensive data analysis. The analysis looks into the Internet use of lowa businesses, the online transactions and payment methods these businesses prefer, and their willingness to pay.
- The PPAP team has been preparing a draft report for the ITE's review. If everything goes well, a first draft should be ready for the ITE by first week of April.

> For e-government citizen survey:

- o IOWAccess council's subcommittee provided the PPAP program with invaluable comments on the final draft of survey by March 2nd.
- The PPAP program worked extensively with the Survey Center to develop and finalize survey questions and sampling. As part of the effort, pilot interviews were conducted to test survey length and question flow.
- The revised citizen survey was programmed using Blaise software at the Survey Center. Extensive testing was done to check text, routing, and question parameters.
- In preparation for interviewing citizens, a random sample of 1000 lowa telephone numbers (plus replicate of 200) was purchased from Survey Sampling International.
- Four additional interviewers were hired and trained in basic interviewing techniques to supplement the existing interviewing staff. Project training materials were developed. Training will be held on Wednesday, March 23, 2005.

In the coming month, the ISU team will finalize the first draft of the e-government business survey report for the review of the ITE. Moreover, the Survey center will officially launch e-government citizen survey to begin interviewing.

28E Project - March 24, 2005

Please find below the March update on the 28E project.

- ✓ Our major activity in March has been preparation for the March 18 workshop, Olive Trees and 28Es, presented in cooperation with ISAC, the League, and our other partners in the project. Work included generating maps for the law enforcement service 28Es and analyzing the initial survey returns from cities and counties.
- ✓ The March 18 workshop presentation was preceded by a brief presentation to the lowAccess Council on March 9th. That discussion was valuable preparation for the March 18 workshop and we appreciate the council's willingness to allocate some time for us.
- ✓ The March 18th workshop was a great success, with about 200 attending from cities, counties, councils of government, and state agencies. We also had two legislators attending, Representative Schickle and Senator Quirmbach, both on the governor's Governance Restructuring Committee. The conversation following the presentation was lively and continued into the afternoon. We received important feedback on the project. More importantly, we were able to plea for more survey responses, and several county representatives stood up and urged others to complete and return the surveys. Quite a few people came to us after the presentation to request another packet be sent so that they could participate.
- ✓ We have conducted numerous field interviews of selected 28E agreements for the 28E management reports. We are now reviewing the draft reports and revising as needed.
- ✓ Early in March we held discussions with Harry Davis in the Secretary of State's (SOS) office, John Gillispie and Mark Uhrin to review the materials for the council and workshop presentations and to discuss general progress and problems with the project.
- ✓ We continue working to clean and correct the data base as we discover issues and problems. This is important to the development of the information system with ITE. We held several meetings with ITE and SOS to develop the information system for the website. Most of the programming work is now underway at ITE.
- ✓ We have spent many hours preparing the data for the GIS maps and experimented with developing the GIS maps for various types of 28E services. These were premiered at the March IOWAccess Council meeting and then presented to the general public at the March 18 workshop. We are now developing the complete set of maps for publication on the 28E webpage with the database.
