- All traps are required to be checked daily and any wildlife caught must be removed.
- A permit does not authorize the relocation, transfer, trade, or sale of any captured live animals.
- Animals captured under the authority of a depredation permit cannot be used commercially (no sales, transfers, or trades in pelts, parts or whole animals).
- By State Law (§ 50-11-2430), you must have written permission from the property owner in your immediate possession in order to trap on property you do not own.
- All applicants are required to report their take of wildlife before additional permits will be issued.

Predator Management Permit for Private Lands

Guidelines for Prospective Permittees

- This permit will allow trapping of all terrestrial furbearers (bobcat, fox, opossum, raccoon, skunk, and weasel) and/or coyotes from March 1-November 30 using all legal traps and shooting during daylight hours.
- In order to be considered for a Predator Management Permit (PMP) for Private Lands, you must send a completed application to:

An application is available by calling (803) 734-3609.

- Trapping under a PMP requires written permission of the landowner (required by § 50-11-2430).
- Permittee must maintain a daily record of harvest on forms provided by DNR. Property and records may be inspected at any time.
- Animals, or parts of animals, trapped under Predator Management Permit may not be sold.
- Previous year's harvest must be reported before any permit will be renewed.
- Trapping during the months of December, January, and February must be conducted under a Commercial Fur Harvest License.
- Local DNR Law Enforcement will be notified of issuance, revocation, or denial of permits.

Anyone trapping under the authority of the PMP must either be the applicant, property owner, or listed as a designee on the permit application. All persons trapping under the authority of a PMP <u>must be listed on the permit</u>.
