MHAT-AFRICA: OUTBRIEF

The Mental Health Advisory Team (MHAT) – Africa study results were outbriefed this quarter. MHAT-Africa benchmarked behavioral health and behavioral health resourcing in the deployed force. The brief was based on data from 696 service members who



completed the paper or on-line version of the survey. Study lead LTC Sipos and Dr. Adler outbriefed Combined Joint Task Force – Horn of Africa (CJTF-HPO) and Camp Lemonnier leadership in Djibouti (8-10 JUL 12). Outbriefs were also conducted with the AFRICOM Surgeon (12 JUL 12; Stuttgart) and USARAF Surgeon (13 JUL 12; teleconference).

ARMYSMART AND CSF-PREP TESTED IN GROUP RANDOMIZED TRIAL

The combined USAMRU-E and Military Psychiatry Branch research team conducted a group randomized trial in Fairbanks, Alaska with a Brigade returning from a year-long

deployment to Afghanistan (overall dates 17 JUL-14 AUG 12). Fifty-four platoons were randomly assigned to one of three training conditions: behavioral health training (ArmySMART), performance psychology training (Comprehensive Soldier Fitness-Performance and Resilience Enhancement Program (CSF-PREP), and a survey only comparison group. In all, more than 1,000 Soldiers were enrolled in the study.

The goal is to develop two effective methods of facilitating the transition home for high-combat units. Platoons in the training conditions received 9 hours of training across a threeday period. The ArmySMART material was developed by WRAIR and delivered by providers from WRAIR, The Office of the Surgeon General (OTSG), Defense Centers for Excellence (DCoE), 274th CSC Reservists, and the Heidelberg Health Clinic. The CSF-PREP material, developed by CSF master trainers, was delivered by CSF-PREP performance enhancement specialists from several different sites across the US.

A team of researchers from WRAIR conducted the study, including a baseline survey, immediate training follow-up survey, and on-site data processing. Coordination briefs were conducted with LTC Kleager, S-3 of the SBCT (27 JUL 12) and COL LeMaster, Commander, Bassett Army Community Hospital (30 JUL 12). An initial outbrief was provided to COL Reed, Commander, 1-25 SBCT, CSM Lewis, CPT Dillon, Brigade Surgeon, and staff (13 AUG 12). A follow-up survey is scheduled for OCT 2012.

SSG Martinez, unit NCOIC, deployed to Afghanistan as a member of the Joint-Mental Health Advisory Team-8 (J-MHAT 8; 18 MAY 12 to 8 JUL 12). J-MHAT 8 assessed the behavioral health of the deployed force and behavioral health resourcing. The team, led by former USAMRU-E Commander LTC McGurk, included representatives from the Navy, Air Force, and UK. Several hundred surveys were collected and processed, and many focus groups were conducted with platoons across a range of maneuver units.
