



LINE-BY-LINE INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE MAIL-IN VOTER REGISTRATION APPLICATION

2.	(Mr., Mrs., Miss., Ms.) Name of Applicant - Person's name: Last Name, First Name, Middle Name or Initial.
3.	Date of birth - Person's D.O.B The applicant must be 17 years or older to register. A 17 year old <u>must</u> turn 18 on or before the date of the election or primary. Note: The registration will automatically become effective on the applicant's eighteenth birthday.
4.	CT Driver's License Number (If none, last 4 digits of Soc. Sec. No.
5.	Address where you Live - Applicant's address. (No., Street, Apt. #) Town, Zip (Connecticut)
6.	Address where you get your Mail - (may be blank) - If different from the address given in #5, such as P. O. Box.
7.	Telephone No. (OPTIONAL) - may be blank - Person's telephone number.
8.	Gender: [] Male [] Female
9.	Do you wish to enroll in a political party? If applicant checks yes, they must also check the appropriate party they wish to enroll in This refers to parties such as "Republican", "Democratic",

(major parties); or Other may include any other party designations-"Green", Libertarian etc. Enrolling in a party allows the applicant to

vote in that party's primary. If box is left blank, the person will be listed as an "Unaffiliated" voter. They will be unable to vote in any party primaries. Volunteers cannot and should not suggest which party to choose. The applicant is not required to select a party and can check "NO", I do not wish to enroll in a party at this time.

10. Name and Address Change. Previous Voting Address (if none, write "NONE") may be blank - If the applicant has moved since s/he registered to vote, this is an easy way to notify the registrars of the change of address. If the applicant has not moved, s/he should write "NONE".

Name Under Which Registered - may be blank - If the applicant has changed her/his name since s/he registered to vote, through marriage or divorce, s/he should write the previous name here.

- 11. I swear or affirm that: The form MUST be signed and dated. The applicant agrees that s/he meets the requirements to register to vote. (Note: the applicant exposes h/self to a fine or imprisonment if s/he signs an untrue statement).
- **12.** Would you like to work at the Polls on Election Day: Please check yes or no. If "yes" you will be contacted by the local Registrars of Voters.

Completed card(s) must be mailed, or returned in person to the Registrars of Voters' Office located in your local town hall <u>immediately</u> upon completion.

VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINES

*March 7, 2006 (Town Committee Primary)

**August 8, 2006 (Primary)

***November 7, 2006 (State Election)

*To be eligible to vote in the Primary to be held on March 7, 2006, the voter registration cut-off date is Thursday, March 2, 2006. All mail-in registration cards must be postmarked or received by this date by Registrars of Voters; or received by a "voter registration agency", or DMV by this date--they must be received by Registrars of Voters by 12:00 noon on Monday, March 6 2006.

- **To be eligible to vote in the Primary to be held on August 8, 2006, the voter registration cut-off date is Thursday, August 3, 2006. All mail-in registration cards must be postmarked or received by this date by the Registrars of Voters; or received by a "voter registration agency", or DMV by this date—they must be received by the Registrars of Voters by 12:00 noon on Monday, August 7, 2006.
- *** To be eligible to vote in the <u>state election</u>, to be held on November 7, 2006, the voter registration cut-off date is fourteen days before the Election for all mail-in applications. They must be postmarked by the October 24, 2006, deadline. In person applicants can register in the town hall until October 31, 2006. Applicants who turn 18 years of age, new residents of the municipality and new citizens of the United States can appear in person in the town hall during regular business hours from October 25, 2006 until 8:00 p.m. on October 31, 2006, and until the close of the limited session from 9:00 a.m. until 12:00 noon on November 6, 2006.
