SECRETARY BYSIEWICZ URGES RESIDENTS OF THE 32ND SENATORIAL DISTRICT TO VOTE TUESDAY

SPECIAL ELECTION ON JANUARY 15, 2008 TO FILL SEAT VACATED BY FORMER SENATOR DELUCA

Hartford: Secretary of the State Susan Bysiewicz is reminding residents of the 32nd State Senatorial District to vote on Tuesday January 15th in the special election to fill the seat made vacant by the resignation of former State Senator Louis DeLuca.

Polls will be open from 6 AM to 8 PM. Just like in the November election, voters can choose to cast their vote by using either optical scan or vote-by-phone machines at their polling location.

"On January 15th voters in the 32nd Senatorial district will have the opportunity to move forward and select new leadership to represent them in Hartford," said Bysiewicz. "Residents that are not registered to vote have until the close of business on January 14th to register in person at their town hall."

The 32nd Senatorial district includes the towns of Bridgewater, Roxbury, Woodbury, Bethlehem, Watertown, Thomaston, Middlebury, Southbury, Oxford and Seymour. Robert Kane of Watertown (R) and Kenneth Curran of Bethlehem (D) are vying for the seat.

On November 30th Secretary Bysiewicz officially received and signed the writ of special election from Governor M. Jodi Rell to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of State Senator Louis DeLuca. In accordance with Connecticut General Statutes Section 9-215 the special election was scheduled 46 days after the issuance of the writ.
