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## **Acknowledgements**

Many people support the Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory Livermore Site Ground Water Project. The dedication and diverse skills of all these individuals contribute to the ongoing success of the Environmental Restoration Department activities. ## Summary

In 2013, environmental restoration activities for the Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory (LLNL) Livermore Site Ground Water Project (GWP) included:

- Removal of approximately 43 kilograms (kg) of volatile organic compounds (VOCs) from ground water and 27 kg of VOCs from soil vapor (Table Summ-1).
- Operation and/or maintenance of 28 ground water treatment facilities and nine soil vapor treatment facilities.
- Operation and/or maintenance of a network of 89 ground water extraction wells, two ground water injection wells, 17 dual extraction<sup>1</sup> wells and 32 soil vapor extraction wells.
- On-going hydraulic control and treatment of VOCs in ground water along the western and southern margins of the site where concentrations declined or remained stable during the year.
- Abandonment of three piezometers in the TFC area, and redevelopment of extraction wells at TF406 Northwest and at TFA.
- Implementing treatment facility upgrades and remedial wellfield expansions using the Remediation Evaluation (REVAL) process at TFD Southshore, TFE Southwest and TFE West, as well as planning upgrades using REVAL at TFD South and TFG-1.
- Continuing ESAR treatability tests at TFD Helipad (bioremediation), TFE Hotspot (pneumatic fracturing) and TFE Eastern Landing Mat (thermally-enhanced remediation) and planning a fourth treatability test at TFC Hotspot (mechanical-fracturing and emplaced zero valent iron (ZVI) for *in situ* VOC destruction).
- Conducting activities in support of the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) closure of Building 419 (Figure 2).
- Submittal of the following documents to the regulatory agencies: 2012 Annual Report (Buscheck et al., 2013), four quarterly reports (Yow and Wong, 2013[a-d]) and the Draft and Draft Final ESD for Institutional Controls, July and November 2013, respectively.

Livermore Site restoration activities in 2013, similar to those in 2012, were focused on enhancing and optimizing ongoing operations at treatment facilities. Evaluation of technologies that may accelerate clean up of the Livermore Site source areas (Figure 2) and address areas of co-mingled VOC and low-level tritium plumes, also continued. An ESAR bioremediation treatability test continued throughout the year at the TFD Helipad (Figure 3), as did the ESAR conductive heating treatability test at TFE Eastern Landing Mat (Figure 4). Both are expected to continue through 2014. Data analysis and interpretation of the ESAR pneumatic fracturing treatability test at TFE Hotspot was completed during 2013. Results of the test are summarized in Section 3.2 and will be presented in a 2014 white paper. Findings from the test are being used to finalize the design of the proposed ESAR treatability test using mechanical fracturing and ZVI to initiate *in situ* VOC destruction at TFC Hotspot.

Ground water concentration and hydraulic data indicate subtle but consistent declines in VOC concentrations and areal extent of contaminant plumes in 2013. Hydraulic containment along the western and southern boundaries of the site was fully maintained in 2013, and progress was made toward interior plume and source area clean up.

Since remediation began in 1989, more than 4.9 billion gallons of ground water and about 598 million cubic feet (Mcf) of soil vapor have been treated, removing an estimated 3,117 kilograms (kg) (approximately 3.4 tons) of VOCs from the subsurface (Table Summ-2).

## 1. Introduction

This report summarizes the LLNL Livermore Site Ground Water Project (GWP) field and regulatory compliance activities and remedial action program for calendar year 2013. The Field Activities section describes ground water monitoring and Enhanced Source Area Remediation (ESAR) activities (Section 3). The Remedial Action Program section describes treatment facility operations, treatment facility upgrades implemented through the Environmental Restoration Department (ERD) Remediation Evaluation (REVAL) process (Appendix E), ground water discharges, remediation performance, and decision support analysis (Section 4). The treatment areas, treatment facilities, wells, and locations of principal projects discussed in this report (conducted in 2013 at the Livermore Site), are shown on Figures 1 and 2. Table 1 presents treatment facility abbreviations used in this report, Table 2 presents the types and number of wells at the site, Table 3 summarizes treatment facility discharge sampling locations and Table 4 summarizes extraction well performance during 2013. New this year, Table 5 presents treatment facility operations for 2013. Except for treatment facility abbreviations (Table 1), acronyms and abbreviations used in this report are defined in Section 6.

## 2. Regulatory Compliance

In 2013, the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE)/LLNL submitted all regulatory documents on schedule. These documents included:

- *GWP 2012 Annual Report* (Buscheck et al., 2013);
- *GWP Quarterly Self-Monitoring Reports* (Yow and Wong, 2013[a-d]); and
- *Draft and Draft Final Explanation of Significant Differences for Institutional Controls* (LLNL, 2013a and 2013c, respectively)

In 2013, Livermore Site environmental community relations' activities included:

- A Tri-Valley Communities Against a Radioactive Environment (Tri-Valley CAREs) tour (May 21, 2013);
- An Alliance for Nuclear Accountability tour (November 13, 2013);
- Maintaining the Environmental Community Relations website <<https://www-envirinfo.llnl.gov/>> consisting of project documents and reports, public notices, and other environment-related information;
- Supporting the Environmental Information Repositories and the Administrative Record;
- Disseminating environment-related news releases and internal/external newsletter articles, and responding to journalists' inquiries regarding the Livermore Site environmental cleanup; and
- Conducting tours of site environmental activities upon request.

General community questions and requests for information were addressed via electronic mail, posted mail or telephone with the assistance of LLNL's Public Affairs Office. In addition, DOE/LLNL met with members of Tri-Valley CAREs and their scientific advisor on May 14 and

December 11, 2013, as part of the activities funded by a U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Technical Assistance Grant.

In August 2013, the Remedial Project Managers (RPMs) for the Livermore Site signed a revised consensus statement for environmental restoration of the Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory Site (LLNL, 2013b). All 2013 FFA milestones were completed early or on schedule.

Seven treatment facilities remained off-line in 2013. TFA East remained off-line due to the lack of ground water in extraction well W-254, the sole extraction well for this facility. VTFD Helipad remained off-line in support of the *in situ* bioremediation ESAR treatability test at the TFD Helipad Source area (Section 3.2.2). VTFD Hotspot was not operated during 2013 as evaluation of an alternative approach of cyclic ground water extraction from the TFD Hotspot wells continued (Section 4.1 and Table 5). The four remaining facilities TF5475-1, TF5475-3, VTF5475 and TF518 North remain shutdown due to mixed waste issues (LLNL, 2009). With EPA concurrence, restart of these four facilities has been deferred pending the results of ESAR treatability tests. In the meantime, DOE/LLNL continue to monitor ground water for VOCs and tritium (see Section 4.4).

### 3. Field Activities

This section summarizes 2013 ground water monitoring, ESAR treatability tests and drilling activities, as well as activities at Building 419.

#### 3.1. Ground Water Monitoring

During 2013, ground water monitoring activities were conducted in full compliance with applicable LLNL Standard Operating Procedures (Goodrich and Lorega, 2012).

##### 3.1.1. Ground Water Level Measurements

In 2013, ground water levels were measured in monitor wells on a quarterly basis. Continuous ground water levels were recorded in pumping wells using real-time data acquisition, and additional ground water levels were measured in conjunction with sampling each well to complement these data. In 2013, a total of 2,548 ground water levels were manually measured in 634 wells. Of these measurements, 1,962 were collected during quarterly water level measurements and 496 were collected just prior to well sampling.

Quarterly water level measurements were collected over a short time period to create ground water elevation maps that represent contemporaneous operating conditions for each extraction wellfield. These data were primarily used to generate quarterly ground water elevation contour maps showing estimated hydraulic capture areas for active extraction wells in Hydrostratigraphic Units (HSUs) 1B through 5 (Figures 7, 9, 11, 13, 15 and 17).

In addition to the routine quarterly measurements, ground water levels were measured to support ERD's REVAL activities. These included manual depth-to-water measurements as well as temporary installation of pressure transducers with data-loggers in selected wells.

##### 3.1.2. Ground Water Sampling

As in previous years, GWP personnel evaluated data quality objectives, analytical results, historical trends, the Cost Effective Sampling (CES) algorithm, and hydraulic data to determine

the sampling frequency, chemical analyses and methods for collecting ground water samples. The samples were analyzed for VOCs, fuel hydrocarbons, polychlorinated biphenyls, metals, radionuclides, or combinations thereof, depending upon the sampling location.

During 2013, 755 well sampling events were conducted (Appendix D). Samplers were unable to complete 104 (14%) sampling events due to various circumstances (dry wells, well maintenance, etc.). The methods and numbers of samples collected were:

- Specific-Depth Grab Sampling (SDGS<sup>2</sup>): 487 events (64%).
- Three-volume purge using a dedicated electric submersible pump: 84 events (11%).
- Low-volume purge primarily using a dedicated electric submersible pump: 53 events (7%).
- Other methods (bailer, portable electronic submersible pump, etc.): 27 events (4%).

Ongoing and significant cost reduction was achieved again in 2013 through the use of SDGS and low-volume purge methods. SDGS is the preferred method for collecting ground water samples, especially at wells where purge water potentially contains both VOCs and tritium. The benefits of these methods includes:

- No need to replace dedicated pumps and related sampling equipment;
- Increased technician efficiency and reduced sampling time;
- Increased personnel safety through the use of low voltage equipment; and
- Virtually eliminating collection, treatment and disposal of purge water from all wells sampled using these methods, particularly where ground water contains both VOCs and tritium.

## 3.2. Enhanced Source Area Remediation Activities

In 2013, ERD continued the ESAR treatability tests at TFD Helipad (*in situ* bioremediation) and at TFE Eastern Landing Mat (thermally enhanced remediation). ERD continued to analyze the results of the TFE Hotspot (pneumatic fracturing) treatability tests completed in 2010 and 2011. At the Trailer 5475 source area, additional sampling was performed to monitor the current subsurface conditions, including changes in tritium activities (see Section 4.4). Preliminary investigation of the TFC Hotspot source area to assess the efficacy of combining pneumatic fracturing with *in situ* chemical reduction using ZVI also continued.

The results of the treatability tests may identify alternative remedial approaches for other Livermore Site source areas. The current ESAR treatability tests are summarized below.

### 3.2.1. Source Area Cleanup Technology Evaluation (SACTE)

As a working conceptual model, the LLNL Livermore Site GWP delineated ground water plumes into distal and source area components. By definition, distal plumes reside in comparatively permeable portions of the subsurface where ambient ground water flow has resulted in down gradient migration and dilution. In contrast, source areas are characterized by relatively elevated concentrations of contaminants that are entrapped to a certain extent in

materials that are of low permeability or are otherwise hydraulically isolated. Back-diffusion from lower permeability zones, leaching of residual contaminants from the overlying vadose zone, and relatively slow advective transport in ground water all potentially contribute to a chronic “slow release” phenomenon of VOC mass transfer from source areas into more permeable, or hydraulically accessible, portions of the subsurface.

Historically, remediation of VOC plumes at the Livermore Site has emphasized control and gradual clean up of distal portions of plumes as a first priority, coupled with containment of VOC mass flux emanating from source areas through conventional treatment technologies such as pump-and-treat, soil vapor extraction, and dual extraction (i.e., LLNL’s “Engineered Plume Collapse” strategy).

In this context, the time frame required for the Livermore Site ground water restoration effort to achieve regulatory closure is closely tied to the persistence of the source areas that transfer mass to the VOC plumes. Therefore, source area remediation constitutes the primary rate-limiting step in the overall ground water cleanup effort, and thus a targeted source area remediation effort warrants serious focus as a means for potentially reducing overall cleanup costs over the course of the restoration effort.

In 2007, the Source Area Cleanup Technology Evaluation (SACTE) approach was developed to identify the most appropriate targeted remediation strategies for the various VOC plume source areas across the site. DOE initiated this evaluation with a goal to identify several technologies that would become treatability studies under the ESAR effort. The SACTE approach is based on:

- (1) Systematic characterization and cataloguing of representative macroscopic features of each source area (e.g., dimensions of the source area footprint, representative hydraulic conductivity, mean ambient hydraulic gradient) as permitted by the available data;
- (2) Development of a compartmental screening model based on those data that capture the salient VOC mass and concentration-controlling parameters among the source areas;
- (3) Utilizing the compartmental model to simulate the potential response of source area VOC distribution to various source area remediation approaches that correspond to changes in key model parameters (e.g., mechanical fracturing to increase average hydraulic conductivity).

The SACTE approach allows comparison of the response of site VOC concentrations and overall mass to a remediation technology that destroys mass *in situ* (e.g., chemical oxidation, bioremediation) in relatively hydraulically accessible materials, with methods that enhance access to VOCs in low permeability materials, either by mechanical means (e.g., mechanical fracturing to improve hydraulic conductivity) or by means that directly enhance the mobility of the solute itself (e.g., thermal remediation, electro-osmosis).

Twenty-one separate source areas have been identified at the Livermore Site based on distributions of VOCs in soil, soil vapor, and ground water samples, analysis of hydrogeologic data in the context of the Livermore Site HSU framework, and information pertaining to historical chlorinated solvent use and disposal practices. The application of the SACTE compartmental model for modeling source area behavior at the Livermore Site entailed defining the physical and chemical characteristics of each source area, and the potential impact of different remediation technologies on the subsurface properties that control flow and transport processes in that particular source area.

As part of the modeling study, overall effects of alternative treatment technologies are compared numerically. The comparison includes increase in mass removal rates, reduction in cleanup time, effect on low-permeability units, areal coverage and capture, capital investment and life-cycle costs. As a result of the SACTE effort, four ESAR technologies were selected for treatability tests in the field and are discussed in greater detail, in the following sections:

- *In situ* Bioremediation at TFD Helipad Source Area;
- Thermally Enhanced Remediation at TFE Eastern Landing Mat Source Area;
- Mechanical Fracturing at TFE Hotspot and TFC Hotspot Source Areas; and
- Dynamic Well-Field Operation at TFE Eastern Landing Mat and Trailer 5475 Source Areas.

### 3.2.2. TFD Helipad Source Area

The ESAR treatability test at the TFD Helipad source area (Figures 2 and 3) is designed to: (1) assess the feasibility of *in situ* bioremediation involving the application of sodium lactate which was later switched to ethyl lactate in 2013, and bioaugmentation using the dechlorinating microorganism, KB-1; and (2) define optimal design parameters to apply the technology at other LLNL source areas.

In 2013, the TFD Helipad *in situ* bioremediation facility (ISB01) operated throughout the year except for periodic maintenance. The ISB01 system began operating in November 2010 and includes four extraction wells, W-1650, W-1653, W-1655 and W-1657, and one central injection well, W-1552. There are four main performance-monitor wells: W-1651, W-1652, W-1654 and W-1656. Downgradient and cross-gradient monitor wells completed in the HSU-3A/3B *in situ* bioremediation zone are also monitored. In addition, there are several HSU-4 wells in the area to monitor for potential vertical migration.

The extraction and injection well pattern is designed to create a circulation cell that is vertically contained within HSU-3A/3B and horizontally contained within the TFD Helipad source area. In August 2012, the extraction pattern was modified from a four-well extraction system to a two-well extraction system, to increase the amount of sodium lactate circulation in a portion of treatability zone where most of the hydraulic circulation is occurring. Ground water continues to be extracted in a cyclic mode from wells W-1650 and W-1653 and injected into the central well W-1552. The suspension of extraction from W-1655 and W-1657 did not negatively impact the total facility flow rate or hydraulic circulation in the subsurface.

From 2010 to 2013, sodium lactate at 4% by volume, was injected into well W-1552. The sodium lactate dose and injection rate were limited due to the viscosity of the product and reduction of hydraulic conductivity near the injection well due to biofouling. During this period, the average dissolved oxygen in the circulation cell was reduced from 2.2 mg/L to 0.9 mg/L. The oxidation-reduction potential (ORP) remains dependent on the continual injection of the carbon source and has been reduced from values from +150 to -150 millivolts. The average nitrate concentration in the circulation cell has been reduced from 60 mg/L to 40 mg/L over the past two years. Although the parameters above are indicative of the subsurface conditions becoming increasingly anaerobic, the one remaining parameter, average sulfate concentration, has remained around 100 mg/L.

In May 2013, DOE-LLNL requested a switch from sodium lactate to ethyl lactate, a less viscous and more effective carbon source. Following regulatory approval, ethyl lactate injection



(at 10% by volume) began in August 2013. To date, more than 60 gallons of ethyl lactate have been injected into the circulation system and the field parameters (e.g., dissolved oxygen, ORP) indicate that the system is more responsive to addition of ethyl lactate versus sodium lactate.

While the results thus far from the treatability test show good progress toward the creation of anaerobic subsurface conditions favorable to the introduction of KB-1, sulfate concentrations remain too high to begin bioaugmentation. The bioaugmentation will occur when sulfate concentrations indicate a reducing trend and drop below 50 mg/L. Once KB-1 is introduced, the system will be continually operated to determine whether VOC levels can be reduced below regulatory limits.

### 3.2.3. TFE Eastern Landing Mat Source Area

During early 2011, TFE Eastern Landing Mat source area wells W-1903, W-1909 and W-2305 were modified for ESAR treatability testing (Figures 2 and 4). The TFE Eastern Landing Mat treatability test is designed to evaluate thermally enhanced remediation in the saturated and unsaturated zones by injecting heated air and by electrically heating ground water in certain wells, while extracting both soil vapor and ground water in others. The treatability test system consists of the VTFE Eastern Landing Mat soil vapor and TFE East ground water treatment facilities, and an ambient air injection blower. Well W-1903 is the primary dual extraction well, and wells W-1909 and W-2305 are air injection and heating wells. In addition, well W-2305 can be used for dual extraction and well W-1909 can be used as a soil vapor extraction well. This operational flexibility enables utilization of another ESAR methodology, dynamic well-field operation, at this source area (Berg, 2008a, and Berg, 2008b). Wells W-1909 and W-2305 contain heating elements that are installed both above and below the static water level to facilitate heating of injected air and *in situ* ground water. All three wells are equipped with thermocouples to monitor subsurface temperatures, and well SIP-543-101, situated at the center of the three wells, serves as the primary performance monitoring well for the test.

Treatability testing began in October 2011 and continued throughout 2012 and 2013. Overall, the ESAR system was fully operational during 2013, except when taken offline for maintenance and freeze protection. Observation well SIP-543-101 has shown significant responses to water level changes and pressure changes due to vapor extraction/injection.

During 2013, increased temperatures were not observed at wells SIP-543-101 and W-1903 in response to heating in wells W-1909 and W-2305. However, the mass removal rates from the main dual extraction well W-1903 have remained higher than when the system was operating in an extraction-only configuration without heat. A significant reduction in vapor phase mass removal rates has not occurred due to introduction of ambient air from the injection wells. The relatively constant vapor phase mass removal is presumed to be due to heating of the injected air, and potentially due to a new vapor circulation pattern established in the subsurface (dynamic well-field operations). The system will be operated in its current mode until the influent concentrations decline below detection limits. The system will then be re-configured to extract from another well.

### 3.2.4. TFE Hotspot Source Area

At the TFE Hotspot source area, where an ESAR pneumatic fracturing treatability test was conducted in October 2010, no field activities were performed in 2013. The treatability test implementation and previous post-pneumatic fracturing performance monitoring tests are

described in Section 3.2.3 of the 2011 Annual Report (Buscheck et al., 2012) and in Section 3.2.4 of the 2012 Annual Report (Buscheck et al., 2013).

The primary objective of the treatability test was to evaluate pneumatic fracturing as a means of shortening clean up times by accelerating contaminant mass transfer out of fine-grained, lower-permeability source area sediments in the saturated zone and lower vadose zone (greater than 90 ft below ground surface (bgs)). In the upper vadose zone (less than 90 ft bgs), where permeabilities are higher, the main objective of the test was to determine whether fracturing would alter flow pathways in a manner that would allow access to previously isolated, contaminated regions of the source area. Additional objectives included evaluating design parameters for future applications and identifying any adverse impacts of fracturing.

The preliminary results of the treatability test were presented at the May 2012 Battelle Conference titled "*Remediation of Chlorinated and Recalcitrant Compounds*". A draft white paper summarizing the results has been completed and will be finalized during 2014. Some of the conclusions reached in this report rely heavily on approximately three years of post-implementation analytic and flow data collected from the test area between November 2010 and September 2013. Findings presented in the white paper include:

- Approximately 39,000 lbs of proppant sand were successfully emplaced at one of the deepest target interval applications of pneumatic fracturing for environmental remediation to date. Measurements taken with tiltmeters and standard surveying equipment indicated only negligible surface heave resulted from the test (less than 0.006 inches).
- Fluorescent dye tracer proved to be an effective tool for visualizing the distribution of propagated fractures in confirmatory borehole cores with and without proppant sand. An analysis of the dye tracer and emplaced sand indicates that most sand was emplaced within 15 ft of a fracture and emplacement boreholes. This suggests that during future applications of the technology at the Livermore Site, fracture borehole spacing should be less than 30 ft to maximize the potential for development of an interconnected fracture network and an effective emplacement of proppant during implementation.
- Distribution of the dye tracer also suggests that the sequence in which fracturing is implemented will strongly influence the final geometry and interconnectedness of the resulting fracture network. Sequencing of fracture borehole locations should therefore be taken into consideration when planning future deployments of the technology. The aforementioned white paper will include details.
- Quantifying post-fracturing changes in hydraulic conductivity, sustainable yield and air permeability through hydraulic and pneumatic testing proved to be more challenging than expected. In the saturated zone, this was most likely due to: a) limited recharge rate of source area sediments beyond the zone of fracturing, b) the increasingly-dewatered (over-drafted) condition of the aquifer, and 3) changes to ground water viscosity and the aquifer due to emplaced guar and its biodegradation initially reducing hydraulic conductivity. In the vadose zone, this was most likely due to the emplacement of the sand, guar and water slurry into more permeable sequences of open-framework sands and gravels, initially reducing permeability.

- No significant permanent changes in ground water or soil vapor sustainable yield were measured during the test and the post-test period. In the vadose zone, an initial decrease in air permeability and sustainable yield had largely recovered over a period of 14 months, based on repeated pneumatic tests, suggesting that the guar and water used during proppant emplacement may have been the primary cause of this fluctuation.
- While no appreciable increase in sustainable yields was observed based on a comparison of pre- and post-fracturing tests, analytical data and flow data from the pre- and post-fracturing periods (through September 2013) indicate a subtle but quantifiable increase in TVOC mass removal per unit volume from both ground water and soil vapor. This suggests that the flow network within the test area vadose and saturated zones were altered due to fracturing, allowing access to previously isolated areas within the TFE Hotspot source area. However, it remains unclear the extent to which pneumatic fracturing and sand proppant emplacement will accelerate mass removal and reduce the estimated time to clean up and regulatory closure. VOC, flow rate, and mass removal data will continue to be evaluated for long-term changes.

### 3.2.5. Trailer 5475 Source Area

No ESAR activities were conducted in the Trailer 5475 source area (Figure 2) during 2013. However, additional sampling of the wells in the area, beyond the routine ground water sampling requirements, was conducted to evaluate current VOC and tritium levels. The results of this sampling are summarized in Section 4.4.

### 3.2.6. TFC Hotspot Source Area

Based on the findings of the TFE Hotspot source area treatability test (see Section 3.2.4), an ESAR treatability test using mechanical fracturing to emplace ZVI within the TFC Hotspot Source Area to promote rapid *in situ* destruction of the VOCs is planned for 2014. A preliminary design of the TFC Hotspot ESAR test, based on the direct-push cone penetrometer testing survey conducted in 2011 (Buscheck et al., 2012), was finalized during 2013.

During 2013, pre-implementation performance monitoring field activities were conducted, in preparation for the test. These included video logging of monitor wells, hydraulic testing (a step flow rate test) of extraction well W-2201 (Attachment A), and baseline sampling of area wells. Pre-implementation performance monitoring field activities will continue into spring 2014, with implementation planned later in the year, contingent on available funding from DOE.

## 3.3. Drilling Activities

During 2013, no new wells were installed at the Livermore Site. However, the following drilling-related activities were conducted. Three TFC area piezometers, SIP-191-003, SIP-191-004 and SIP-191-101, were properly abandoned (Appendix A). All three were found to have compromised well casings. The piezometers were over-drilled to remove all completion materials and the resulting borehole was filled with cement grout to the surface.

Additionally, two existing extraction wells were redeveloped. TF406 Northwest HSU-3A extraction well W-1801 (Figure 12) was chemically treated in April 2013 to remove biofouling from the well screen and downhole equipment, and to restore its sustainable yield to more than

6 gpm. In January 2013, mechanical redevelopment was used to successfully restore the sustainable yield of TFA HSU-3A extraction well W-712 to approximately 6 gpm.

### 3.4. Building 419 Closure-Related Activities

During 2013, ERD assisted with documentation and data analysis to support the Building 419 RCRA Closure Project. On November 18, 2013, LLNL received a letter from the California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) that included the ‘*Conditional Acknowledgement of Closure Certification for the 419 Hazardous Water Treatment Facility*’. The letter states that the corrective action and post-closure care of ground water in the areas of former Building 419, as proposed by LLNL, is accepted by DTSC and meets the requirements of DTSC’s RCRA-equivalent hazardous waste management program. The conditions of the letter are:

1. All future work pertaining to ground water, including review of the existing leaching analysis, shall be conducted under the authority of the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA).
2. LLNL shall implement the recommendations regarding continued delineation of the source and implementation of clean up measures, contained in the Fourth Five-Year Review Report for the LLNL Livermore Site (McKereghan, 2012).
3. LLNL shall perform additional shallow soil gas sampling at Building 419 prior to ending soil vapor extraction.

All of these conditions were proposed by LLNL and will be met under ERD’s CERCLA Ground Water Cleanup Program.

## 4. Summary of Remedial Action Program

This section summarizes the 2013 CERCLA remedial action program activities at the Livermore Site. In 2013, DOE/LLNL operated and/or maintained 28 ground water treatment facilities (Figure 1 and Table 1). During the year, ground water extraction and dual extraction wells produced approximately 299 million gallons (Mgal) of ground water, and the treatment facilities removed an estimated 43 kg of VOCs (Table Summ-1 and Table 4). Since remediation began in 1989, nearly 5 billion gallons of ground water have been treated, resulting in the removal of an estimated 1,585 kg of VOCs (Table Summ-2).

In 2013, DOE/LLNL also operated and/or maintained nine soil vapor treatment facilities in the TFD, TFE and TFH areas (Figure 1 and Table 1). The soil vapor extraction and dual extraction wells produced approximately 60 million cubic feet (Mcf) of soil vapor, and the vapor treatment facilities removed approximately 27 kg of VOCs (Table Summ-1 and Table 4). Since startup, more than 598 Mcf of soil vapor has been extracted and treated, removing an estimated 1,532 kg of VOCs (Table Summ-2).

In total, an estimated 3,117 kg (approximately 3.4 tons) of VOCs have been removed from the subsurface beneath the Livermore Site and surrounding area since 1989 (Table Summ-2). However, less VOC mass was removed from both the unsaturated zone (i.e., soil vapor) and ground water during 2013 as compared to 2012. In 2012, approximately 47 kg of VOCs were removed from ground water and 29 kg of VOCs were removed from soil vapor (Buscheck et al., 2013). The decrease in VOC mass removal rates is primarily due to decreasing VOC

concentrations in the subsurface and an overall decrease in the amount of mass remaining in both ground water and the unsaturated zone beneath the Livermore Site due to active remediation since 1989 (Figures 5 and 6).

Effectiveness of ground water remediation at the Livermore Site is evaluated using multiple data sets. Depth to ground water measurements recorded during the third quarter 2013 were used to construct HSU-specific ground water elevation contour maps and estimate hydraulic capture areas due to ground water pumping (Figures 7, 9, 11, 13, 15 and 17). HSU-specific isoconcentration contour maps showing total VOC concentrations above the maximum contaminant levels (MCLs) during the third quarter 2013 are shown on Figures 8, 10, 12, 14, 16 and 18. The estimated hydraulic capture areas for each HSU have been superimposed on the isoconcentration contour maps to highlight where hydraulic containment of contaminant plumes was achieved during this period. Contaminant concentration trends (Section 4.3) were also used to evaluate hydraulic capture and treatment facility performance.

#### **4.1. Summary of Treatment Facility Operations**

During 2013 at the Livermore Site, 24 ground water and six soil vapor treatment facilities were operated in compliance with applicable permits. These facilities were shut down occasionally for routine maintenance during the year. In addition, ERD's REVAL process (Appendix E) was implemented for three treatment facilities: TFD Southshore, TFE Southwest and TFE West (Figure 2). REVAL assessments and treatment facility modification designs were also completed for TFD South and TFG-1. The TFD South REVAL also includes a wellfield expansion to extract and treat ground water from HSU-5 well W-2601. Four treatment facilities, TF5475-1, TF5475-3, VTF5475 and TF518 North remain shut down due to mixed waste issues (LLNL, 2009). VTFD Helipad was not operated during the year due to an ongoing ESAR treatability test in the area (Section 3.2.2). VTFD Hotspot was not operated to evaluate an alternative approach of cyclic ground water extraction from the TFD Hotspot wells. With RPM agreement, the VTFD Hotspot vapor unit was permanently removed from service (Table 5, Yow and Wong, 2013c). TFA East remained shut down due to the lack of ground water in W-254, the only extraction well for this facility. Table 5 summarizes the treatment facility operations and facility highlights for 2013.

#### **4.2. Ground Water Discharges**

In 2013, LLNL discharged approximately 298 Mgal of treated ground water to the ground surface. Approximately 149 Mgal were discharged to Arroyo Las Positas, 87 Mgal to the West Perimeter Drainage Channel, 62 Mgal to Arroyo Seco, and 0.002 Mgal to the Building 133 cooling tower (Figure 1). In addition, approximately 12,000 gallons of ground water were recirculated through ISB01 at the TFD Helipad as part of the *in situ* bioremediation treatability test.

#### **4.3. Remediation Performance Evaluation**

In 2013, VOC concentrations declined or remained unchanged in most Livermore Site ground water plumes. The decreases in VOC concentrations discussed below are primarily attributable to active remediation at Livermore Site treatment facilities (Section 4.1). The changes described below are consistent with longer-term trends that show steady onsite and

offsite mass removal and cleanup as described in the 2012 Fourth Five-Year Review for the LLNL Livermore Site (McKereghan et al., 2012) and the 2012 Annual Report (Buscheck et al., 2013).

Ground water elevation contour maps for each HSU for third quarter 2013 are presented on Figures 7, 9, 11, 13, 15 and 17. HSU-specific isoconcentration contour maps of total VOC concentrations above MCLs for third quarter 2013 are presented on Figures 8, 10, 12, 14, 16 and 18. Estimated hydraulic capture areas due to ground water pumping are also shown on these figures. These capture areas are depicted very conservatively, and the capture areas of individual extraction wells are very likely larger than shown. Treatment facility locations are shown on Figure 1. Notable VOC concentration trends and results observed during the past year (third quarter 2012 through the third quarter 2013) are discussed below. Where available and relevant, VOC concentration data more recent than third quarter 2013 are also discussed below.

The ground water data are presented in Attachment B. However, it is important to note that the concentrations plotted on the isoconcentration maps are a running average and do not represent a single analytical result. An explanation of the algorithm-based methodology used for generating the isoconcentration maps, known as Optimized Environmental Restoration Analysis (OPERA) and the rules governing how these analytical results are used, is described in Appendix F.

#### 4.3.1. Hydrostratigraphic Unit 1B

During 2013, offsite TFA area VOC concentrations remained below MCLs in all wells except one. At monitor well W-1425, tetrachloroethene (PCE) rebounded slightly from 2.5 ppb (September 2012) to 5.1 ppb (October 2013). This increase may have been due to non-operation of offsite HSU-1B extraction well W-408 from June through late August, due to a pump failure. PCE concentrations at W-1425 are expected to decline below the 5 ppb MCL during 2014 in response to resumed pumping at well W-408.

In 2013, concentrations at onsite TFA HSU-1B wells remained relatively unchanged. At extraction well W-254, PCE concentrations fell from 39 ppb (July 2012) to 20 ppb (April 2013) despite the fact that the well could no longer be pumped due to declining water levels. In the TFA source area, concentrations of PCE rose from 190 ppb (October 2012) to 220 ppb (July 2013) in monitor well W-1217, and in monitor well W-116 from 100 ppb (July 2012) to 270 ppb (October 2013). However, large concentration fluctuations have been observed at W-116 since its construction in 1985, and the most recent increase is likely more of the same. A long term hydraulic test using monitor well W-1214 as an extraction well for TFA-W is planned for 2014 to determine whether pumping there will decrease concentrations in the TFA source area.

Trichloroethylene (TCE) concentrations at TFB, TFC, TFC-E, TFC-SE, and in the TFG area were essentially unchanged, and no evidence of westward migration of the contaminant plumes was observed. At the TFC Hotspot source area, TCE remained elevated in monitor well W-1212 (280 ppb, July 2012 versus 270 ppb, July 2013). An ESAR treatability test involving mechanical fracturing and emplacement of ZVI to destroy VOCs *in situ* is planned for TFC Hotspot in 2014.

As shown on Figures 7 and 8, the HSU-1B contaminant plumes along the western LLNL margin were under full hydraulic containment in the TFA, TFB, TFC and TFC Southeast areas during third quarter 2013. To the east, contaminant plumes were also hydraulically contained at TFC East, TFG-1 and TFG North.

### 4.3.2. Hydrostratigraphic Unit 2

In the offsite TFA area, rapid declines in PCE concentrations were observed during 2013, suggesting that the wellfield optimization scheme implemented in late 2012 (including the shut-in of extraction well W-109, activation of the TFA West Pipeline extension, and pumping of extraction well W-404) is accelerating cleanup of the offsite plume. At extraction well W-404, PCE fell from 7.8 ppb (October 2012) to 4.7 ppb (October 2013); concentrations remained below the 5 ppb MCL at this well during both the third and fourth quarters of 2013. Only two remaining offsite wells had PCE concentrations above the MCL: at monitor well W-1424, concentrations fell from 13 ppb (January 2012) to 6.1 ppb (July 2013) while at monitor well W-379, PCE rose from less than 0.5 ppb (April 2012) to 6.7 ppb (July 2013). Well W-379 will be monitored carefully in 2014 to determine whether additional adjustments to the offsite extraction well flow field are needed to ensure cleanup in the area (e.g., resumed pumping at well W-109).

PCE concentrations at downgradient guard well W-151 (Figure 10) continued to be at or just above the 0.5 ppb reporting limit in 2013 (0.54 ppb, October 2012 to 0.53 ppb, December 2013), and will likely fall below 0.5 ppb once again with continued pumping at well W-404.

In the onsite area of TFA, HSU-2 VOC concentrations remained essentially unchanged during 2013.

At TFB, VOCs continued to decline along the western margin near Vasco Road in response to pumping at recently activated extraction well W-2501. TCE at monitor well W-422 fell from 9.4 ppb (October 2012) to 7.2 ppb (May 2013). After increasing during in 2012, TCE concentrations have started to consistently decline at W-1420 (11 ppb, October 2012 to 6.2 ppb, September 2013). The decline appears to be in response to a TFB wellfield pumping rate optimization scheme implemented in 2013, including an increase in the pumping rate of extraction well W-2502 from 5 to 7.5 gpm.

An apparent increase in TCE was observed at monitor well W-365 (14 ppb, October 2012 to 18 ppb, July 2013). However the long-term trend at this location demonstrates very stable concentrations over the last 13 years, so this may be a natural fluctuation in concentrations rather than the beginning of an increasing concentration trend. Elsewhere at TFB, concentrations in the area remained essentially unchanged during 2013.

At TFD, HSU-2 VOC concentrations were stable or declined somewhat in response to ground water extraction in the area. In the eastern TFD area, TCE concentrations fell from 140 ppb (August 2012) to 62 ppb (August 2013) in monitor well W-1804-1 while PCE fell from 450 ppb (August 2012) to 340 ppb (September 2013) in dual extraction well SIP-ETC-201. Both concentration declines are interpreted to be a response to pumping at TFD-SE extraction well W-1308. In northern TFD, TCE concentrations at monitor well W-569 declined from 11 ppb (February 2012) to below 0.5 ppb (September 2013), likely a response to pumping at TFD-W extraction wells W-1215 and W-1216.

Concentration declines were also noted in the TFE area during 2013. While TCE fell at extraction well W-1415 (290 ppb, July 2012 to 47 ppb, October 2013), concentrations are known to fluctuate considerably in the T5475 source area, so whether this constitutes the beginning of an actual trend is uncertain at this point. To the west at TFE-E, TCE concentrations fell at heated air injection well W-2305 from 280 ppb (July 2012) to 58 ppb (October 2013), most likely due to ground water extraction at W-1109 and W-1903. It is unclear whether the ground water and air

heating and injection associated with the ESAR thermally-enhanced treatability test being conducted at TFE-E contributed to the observed decline.

No significant concentration changes were observed in HSU-2, in the TFH or TFG areas during 2013.

As shown on Figure 10, the HSU-2 contaminant plumes in the TFA and TFB areas were entirely within the estimated capture areas, with the possible exception of the portion of the plume immediately south of TFB monitor well W-1420. Although this area of the plume is very likely within the stagnation zone of extraction well W-2502, any contaminants migrating away from the W-1420 area would ultimately be captured downgradient by TFA Arroyo Seco extraction wells W-904, W-457 and W-903 (Figures 9 and 10). Further adjustments to the TFB extraction well flow field will be evaluated to determine whether this area of the plume can be brought fully within the capture area of W-2502 in 2014.

### 4.3.3. Hydrostratigraphic Unit 3A

During 2013, very little change was observed in the size, geometry and location of the contaminant plumes in HSU-3A (Figure 12). While increases in VOC concentrations within some existing plumes in the eastern TFD area were evident, their significance is uncertain at this time. At monitor well W-1304, TCE concentrations rose from 440 ppb (August 2012) to 1400 ppb (September 2013). However, concentrations there have shown similar fluctuations (1400 ppb, September 2011). At extraction well W-1301, TCE rose from 66 ppb (October 2012) to 250 ppb (October 2013) while at monitor well W-1804-2, TCE concentrations rose from 180 ppb (September 2012) to 310 ppb (August 2013). Although long-term concentration trends for both of these wells show an overall decline (from 1500 ppb, November 1997 at W-1301 and from 530 ppb, July 2004 at W-1804-2), the recent increases may be associated with source area concentration rebound due to cessation of pumping during the 2012 TFD-E and TFD-SE REVAL upgrade activities. If so, it is possible these short-term increases will be reversed in the 2014, now that continuous operations have resumed at both facilities.

To the south in the TF406 area, TCE concentrations west of Building 419 at extraction well W-1801 remained constant at 22 ppb (July 2012 and October 2013) but rose at adjacent monitor well W-1705-2 (from 9 ppb, September 2012 to 100 ppb, August 2013). The increase is consistent with other recent large concentration fluctuations observed at W-1705-2 (130 ppb in November 2012 and 3.9 ppb in June 2013) and may not indicate an increasing concentration trend.

Figures 11 and 12 show the estimated hydraulic capture areas in HSU-3A during the third quarter of 2013. In the western TFE and eastern TFG areas, the plume monitored by monitor well W-276 remains outside of the hydraulic capture area. However TCE concentrations at well W-2603, located at the downgradient edge of the plume, have remained consistently below the 5 ppb TCE MCL (1.5 ppb, March 2013), indicating that additional hydraulic containment is currently not needed in this area.

### 4.3.4. Hydrostratigraphic Unit 3B

During 2013, the size, geometry, and location of HSU-3B plumes were essentially unchanged and only relatively minor changes in concentration were noted within the plumes.

Although VOC ground water concentrations in the Building 419 area have remained stable over the last several years (concentrations at monitor well W-2205 were 910 ppb in May 2006



and 990 ppb in November 2013) they continue to increase downgradient to the west, at monitor well W-2617. Concentrations at W-2617 rose from 850 ppb in August 2012 to 1100 ppb in August 2013. The increase may represent VOCs migrating from the source area toward the large pumping-induced ground water depression located to the north (Figures 13 and 14). Following completion of REVAL-related upgrades at TFE-SW in December 2013 (see Section 4.1 and Table 5) the distal portion of this plume is being intercepted and treated at extraction well W-1522.

In the TFD-E area, TCE concentrations at monitor well W-2006 rose from 220 ppb (July 2012) to 550 ppb (September 2013). However, TCE in this well shows an overall decreasing trend (1500 ppb, December 2004), and the current TCE value may reflect natural fluctuations in source area concentrations rather than a true increasing trend.

In the third quarter of 2013, all HSU-3B ground water contaminant plumes were either under hydraulic control of extraction wells associated with TFD, TFE and TFH treatment facilities or hydraulically contained within the pumping-induced ground water depression shown on Figures 13 and 14.

#### 4.3.5 Hydrostratigraphic Unit 4

Although the position and size of the HSU-4 VOC plumes (Figure 16) remained essentially unchanged in 2013, several notable concentration trends were observed. In the northeastern TFD area, TCE concentrations in the HSU-4 Helipad and northern East Traffic Circle Landfill source areas remained elevated, despite pumping at extraction wells W-1254 and W-1307. TCE in monitor well W-1250 declined slightly from 2800 ppb (October 2012) to 2300 ppb (September 2013), and rose in extraction well W-1253 from 880 ppb (August 2012) to 2000 ppb (September 2013). The latter increase is considered within the normal range of concentration fluctuations observed for W-1253, and not indicative of a consistent concentration trend.

To the west at TFD main, TCE concentrations at extraction well W-351 remained essentially unchanged at 550 ppb (July 2012) and 530 ppb (October 2013) following the large concentration increase observed there last year (Buscheck et al., 2013). The resumption of ground water extraction at W-1254, following a year-long hiatus in pumping (January 2011 through February 2012) associated with operations at the TFD Helipad *in situ* bioremediation ESAR treatability test, appears to have inhibited farther migration of contaminants out of the TFD Helipad area (see Buscheck et al., 2013). Farther downgradient to the west at monitor well W-1803-1, TCE increased slightly from 120 ppb (September 2012) to 160 ppb (August 2013). Because of the very large, pumping-induced ground water depression that has developed due to over-drafting of HSU-4, concentrations in the vicinity of W-1803-1 are expected to remain trapped within the confines of this potentiometric low and not migrate farther westward (Figures 15 and 16). A hydraulic test evaluating the hydraulic response of W-1803-1 to ground water pumping at TFD extraction wells W-1206 and W-351 is planned for early 2014, and will be used to optimize the TFD extraction well flow field for capture and treatment of this TCE plume.

To the south in the TFE area, TCE declined at extraction well W-1520 from 340 ppb (October 2012) to 220 ppb (July 2013) with the resumption of ground water extraction in March 2013. Operations were halted temporarily in the fall of 2013 while REVAL-related activities at TFE-SW were completed (Section 4.1 and Table 5). At monitor well W-354, located north of TFE-SW, TCE fell from 440 ppb (January 2013) to 220 ppb (July 2013) in response to

pumping at W-1520. With the resumption of pumping, TCE concentrations are expected to continue a downward trend in the area during 2014.

Figures 15 and 16 show the estimated hydraulic capture areas in HSU-4 during the third quarter 2013. The pumping-induced ground water depression associated with extraction at TFD, TFD South, TFD Southshore and TFE Northwest provided additional hydraulic containment in large portions of the TFD, TFE and TFH areas during 2013.

#### **4.3.6 Hydrostratigraphic Unit 5**

The general configuration and location of HSU-5 VOC plumes in 2013 (Figures 17 and 18) remained essentially unchanged from 2012. In addition, no significant changes in concentrations were observed. To the south in the TFH area, all VOC plumes beneath the property operated by Sandia National Laboratories, Livermore, remained below MCLs in response to ground water extraction from TF406 well W-1310 (Figure 18). In addition, concentrations also remained at or below MCLs at the leading edge of the plume west of TF406, where monitor well W-1519 is located. TCE at well W-1519 remained very close to the MCL during 2013 (4.8 ppb in March 2013, 5.3 ppb in August 2013, and 6.4 ppb in December 2013) suggesting that pumping at W-1310 continues to control the westward migration of the HSU-5 contaminant plume. Pumping at recently activated HSU-5 extraction well W-1516 (TFE-SW) is expected to extend hydraulic capture even farther to the west of W-1519.

To the east at TFE-SE, TCE at extraction well W-359 declined somewhat during 2013, from 230 ppb (July 2012) to 180 ppb (October 2013). However, concentrations to the south beneath B511, remained relatively unchanged. TCE concentrations in angled monitor well W-2606 were 220 ppb in November 2012 and 200 ppb in August 2013, while at angled monitor well W-2607 TCE concentrations were 220 ppb in August 2012 and 190 ppb in October 2013.

Elevated VOC concentrations persisted in the southeastern TFD, where TCE concentrations in well W-2601 were 100 ppb in September 2012 and 88 ppb in September 2013. W-2601 will be connected to TFD South and pumped as an extraction well in 2014. Concentrations within this currently unconstrained and untreated TCE plume are expected to begin to decline once pumping begins.

Figures 17 and 18 show the estimated hydraulic capture areas in HSU-5 during the third quarter 2013. As shown, most areas with elevated VOC concentrations in HSU-5 are being hydraulically contained. An area immediately west of TFD extraction well W-907-2 is not within the estimated capture zone of this well, but is likely to be within the well's stagnation zone. The same applies to an area of higher-concentration VOCs northwest of extraction well W-566 that is currently outside the capture area of that well. Regardless, full hydraulic containment in this area is expected once TFD South HSU-5 extraction well W-2601 is activated and begins pumping in 2014.

### **4.4. Tritium**

During 2013, tritium activities in ground water remained below the 20,000 picocuries per liter (pCi/L) MCL at all Livermore Site wells, including those in the Building 292, former Building 419, and the Trailer 5475 areas (Figure 1), due to continued radioactive decay.

In 2012, activities at two Trailer 5475 area extraction wells, W-2302 and W-2211 (Figures 10 and 12), rose above the tritium MCL (Buscheck et al., 2013). In 2013, activity at W-2303 was

17,700 pCi/L (June 2013), and W-2211 could no longer be sampled because it was dry (all four T5475 wells discussed in the 2012 Annual Report, W-1415, W-2303, W-2211 and SIP-ETS-209, could not be sampled due to a lack of water as of July 2013). The wells are located immediately adjacent to or within the previously excavated disposal pit located beneath Trailer 5475 (Figure 19). Based on the rise and then decline in tritium activities observed in extraction well W-1415 and W-2303 during 2012 and the current activity level at W-2303, it appears that this may have been only a temporary increase.

A tritium sampling event conducted in late 2012 and early 2013 to provide an updated comprehensive “snap shot” of current activities in the southeastern quadrant of the Livermore Site confirmed that elevated tritium is only present in wells proximal to the Trailer 5475 disposal pit and in one well immediately west of the pit. HSU-3A monitor well W-1222, located in the center of the Trailer 5475 area HSU-3A ground water depression, had an activity of 8,880 pCi/L in March 2013 (Figures 11 and 12). W-1225, located farther west on the margin of the ground water depression, has been below 300 pCi/L in all 16 sampling events conducted since 2001 (273 pCi/L, May 2013). The recent tritium activity data suggest that the low permeability of HSU-3A and HSU-2 sediments in the Trailer 5475 area, combined with the de-watered condition of HSU-2 and large portions of HSU-3A and the Trailer 5475 HSU-3A ground water depression (Figures 11 and 12) are preventing elevated tritium activities from migrating out of the area.

North of TFE Southwest, tritium activities in HSU-4 monitor well W-354 (Figure 16) remained low in 2013 (358 pCi/L, November 2012 to 734 pCi/L, May 2013). The temporary rise and subsequent fall in activities in W-354 observed during last year (Buscheck et al., 2013, Section 4.4) is interpreted to have been the result of the northward migration of tritium from the TF518 North area toward a pumping-induced ground water depression at TFE Northwest or TFD South (Figure 15). The reactivation of pumping at HSU-4 extraction well W-1520 (Figure 16) following 2013 REVAL activities at TFE-SW should help inhibit farther northward migration of tritium in HSU-4.

In early 2013, a comprehensive review of historical tritium use and handling practices was conducted in the southeastern part of the Livermore Site to determine if there were any previously unidentified tritium sources that might be adversely impacting the TF518 North and TFE-SW areas. The review focused on Buildings 412, 411, 419, 511 and 514, and included an exhaustive records and document review as well as interviews of former and current laboratory employees with detailed knowledge of the buildings and past practices associated with them. Soil and ground water investigations conducted in these areas, including soil vapor surveys and direct push surveys, were used to delineate the distribution of tritium in the southeast corner, and to provide an updated understanding of the hydrogeologic conditions in the area.

The review concluded that tritium handling and use is known to have occurred at former Building 419 and in the Building 514 area but not at Buildings 411, 412 or 511. While no large, previously unknown sources were identified, multiple small tritium sources with activities well below the MCL do appear to be present in the southeast corner. However, the complex hydrogeology in the southeastern corner of the Livermore Site, including HSU pinch-outs, heterogeneous alluvial sediments, and perched ground water zones, present significant challenges for understanding the flow and transport of contaminants there, particularly tritium. These findings were summarized in a presentation given to the regulators at the February 27, 2013 RPM meeting.

## 4.5. Decision Support Analysis

A variety of decision support tools are utilized to analyze data and evaluate the performance of the Livermore Site remediation systems. These tools improve the quality, efficiency and consistency of routine tasks and result in significant cost savings for ERD. Decision support tools were also used extensively during REVAL (Appendix E) for each treatment facility and for ESAR activities. These decision support activities and associated tools are grouped into four categories:

- Taurus Environmental Information Management System (TEIMS);
- Automated Data Review and Mapping Tools;
- Predictive Analysis Tools;
- Treatment Facility Real-Time (TFRT) data acquisition system and the Standard Treatment Facility Control System (STFCS).

The TEIMS database and associated data entry and review tools are routinely used for work tasks ranging from data management to report preparation. For example, the treatment facility self-monitoring reporting tool allows facility operators to enter data using a web-based interface, and to automatically generate reports that are included in the quarterly self-monitoring reports (Yow and Wong, 2013[a-d]).

The next level of decision-support tools consists of sophisticated graphical, statistical and numerical data analysis tools used for remedial performance evaluations. This suite of tools includes the CES algorithm (Appendix C) that enables ERD personnel to quickly review concentration trends in wells and set sampling frequencies on a quarterly basis. Another frequently used tool is the OPERA tool (Appendix F). This web tool enables ERD personnel to quickly view HSU-specific plume maps for each contaminant and compare current conditions with historical distributions. Plume and ground water elevation maps and animations that span the entire Livermore Site GWP history are updated each quarter within a matter of hours using the OPERA tool. The plume map library was updated quarterly in 2013 with the most recent sampling information available. The HSU conceptual model constitutes the basic framework for all decision support tools. The conceptual model is continually updated using information from recently installed wells and hydraulic tests.

ERD's environmental database and the data analysis tools significantly reduce the effort required to develop analytical or numerical models for predictive analyses. Regional-scale flow and transport models are used to evaluate the effectiveness and startup order of wells in extraction wellfields. The results of these analyses allow ERD personnel to prioritize the maintenance and operation of critical facilities to ensure hydraulic containment.

In 2013, the TFRT data acquisition system continued to provide significant value to the Livermore Site cleanup project. TFRT data are used to optimize and maintain treatment facilities, and to quickly provide important information for diagnosing facility-related issues. The TFRT data acquisition system is part of the STFCS. In addition to providing data acquisition, STFCS also expanded our capability for controlling the operation of extraction wells. For example, we converted the operational mode of multiple wells in the eastern portion of the site (lower yields) from constant flow rate to water-level-controlled extraction. In this operational mode, the water level in the well is maintained at a desired elevation while STFCS automatically adjusts the flow rate of the pump. This decision support capability resulted in two

significant improvements: 1) extraction wells operate continuously and require less technician oversight and 2) plume capture is maintained at all times without over-drafting the aquifer.

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- Figure 19. Trailer 5475 area wells with elevated tritium activities in 2013.



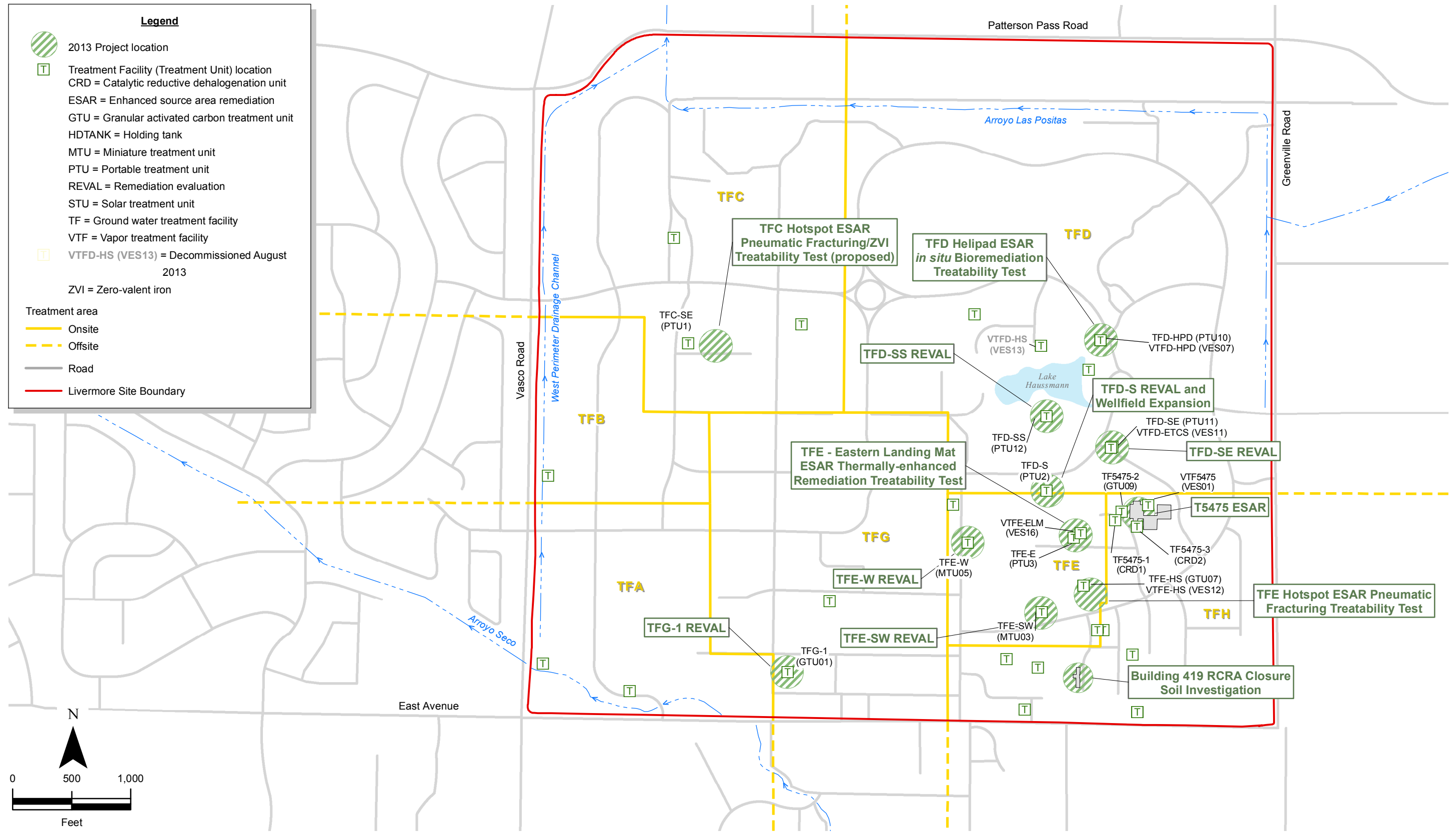
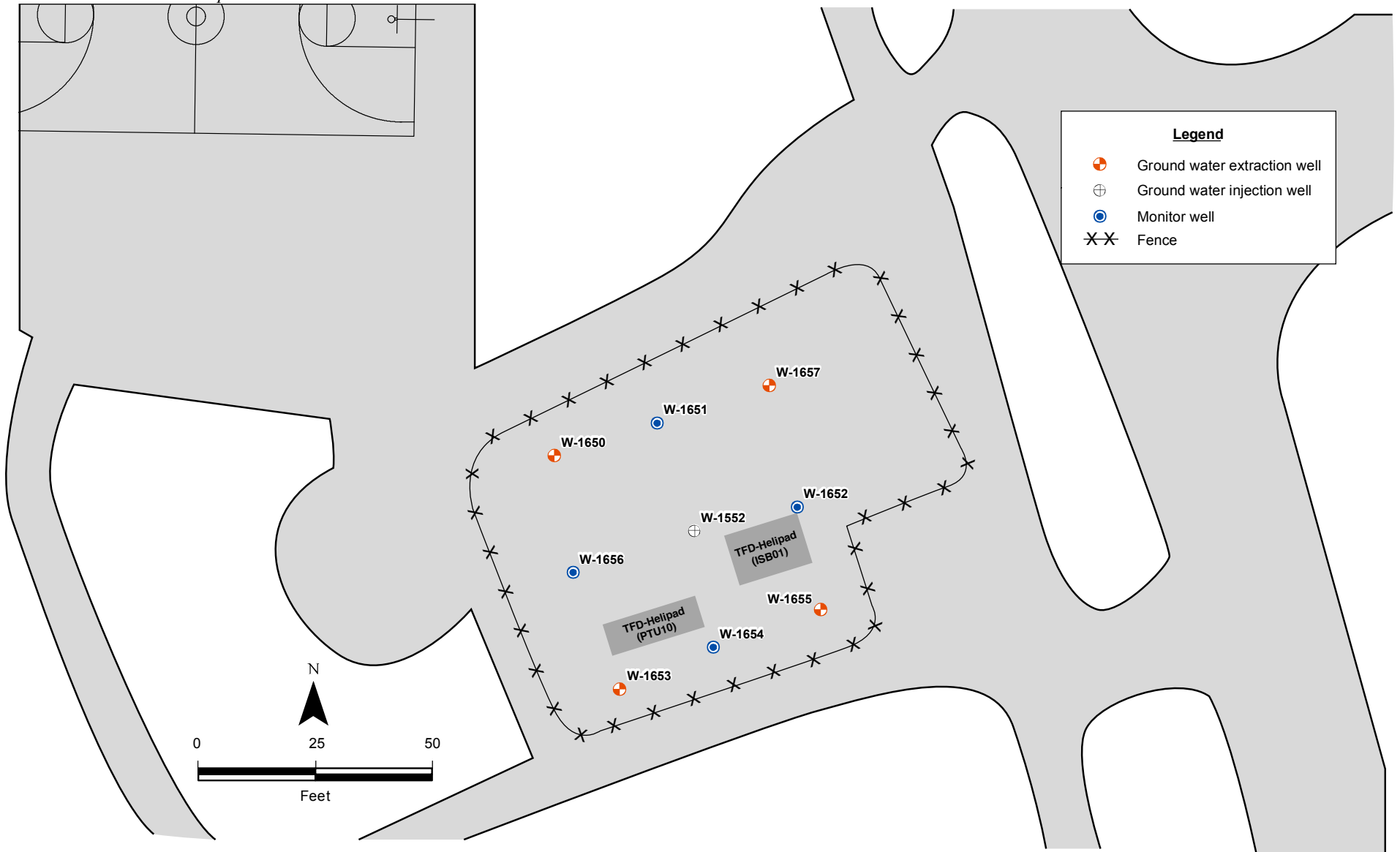
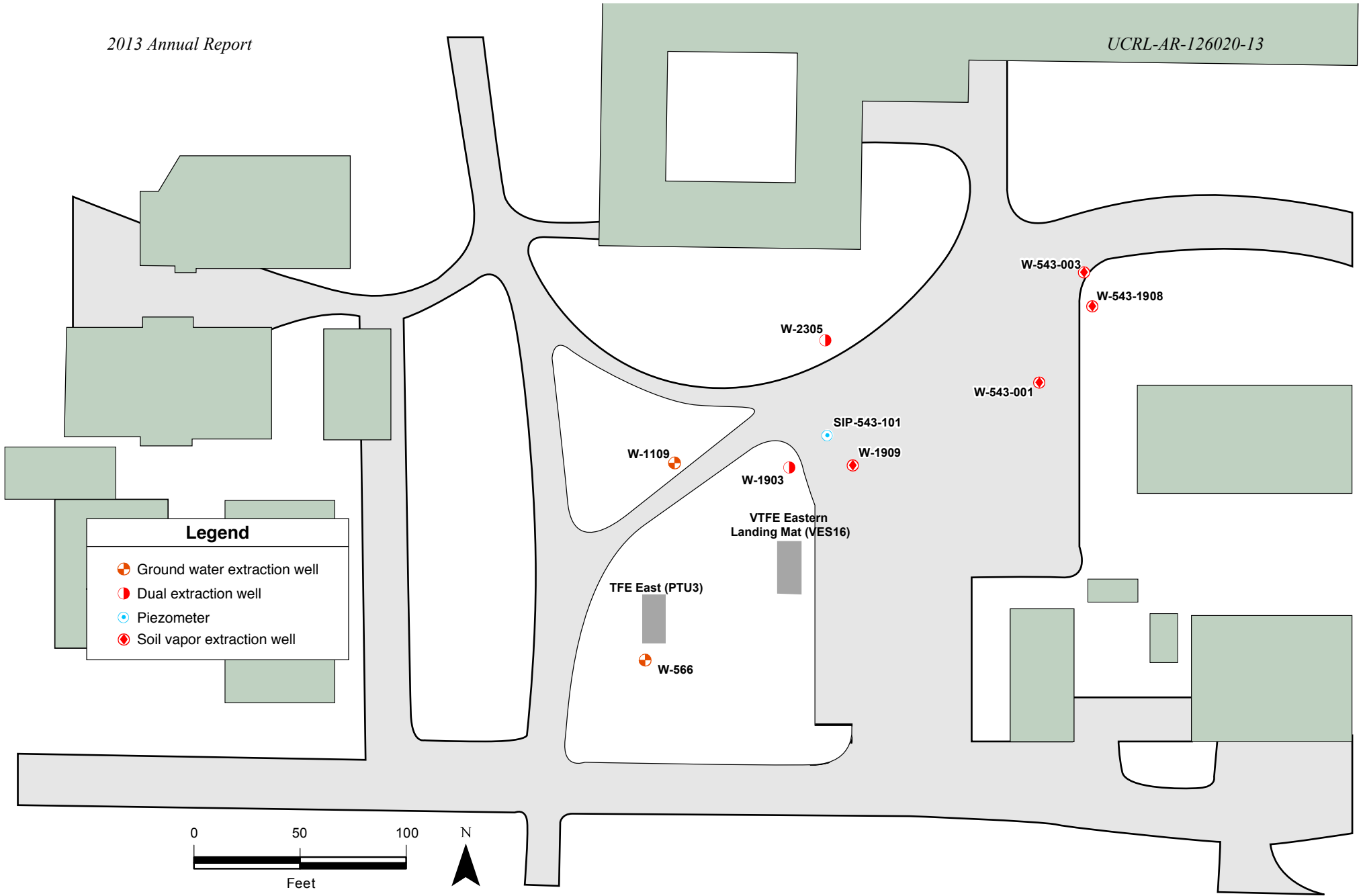


Figure 2. Locations of principal projects conducted at Livermore Site, in 2013.



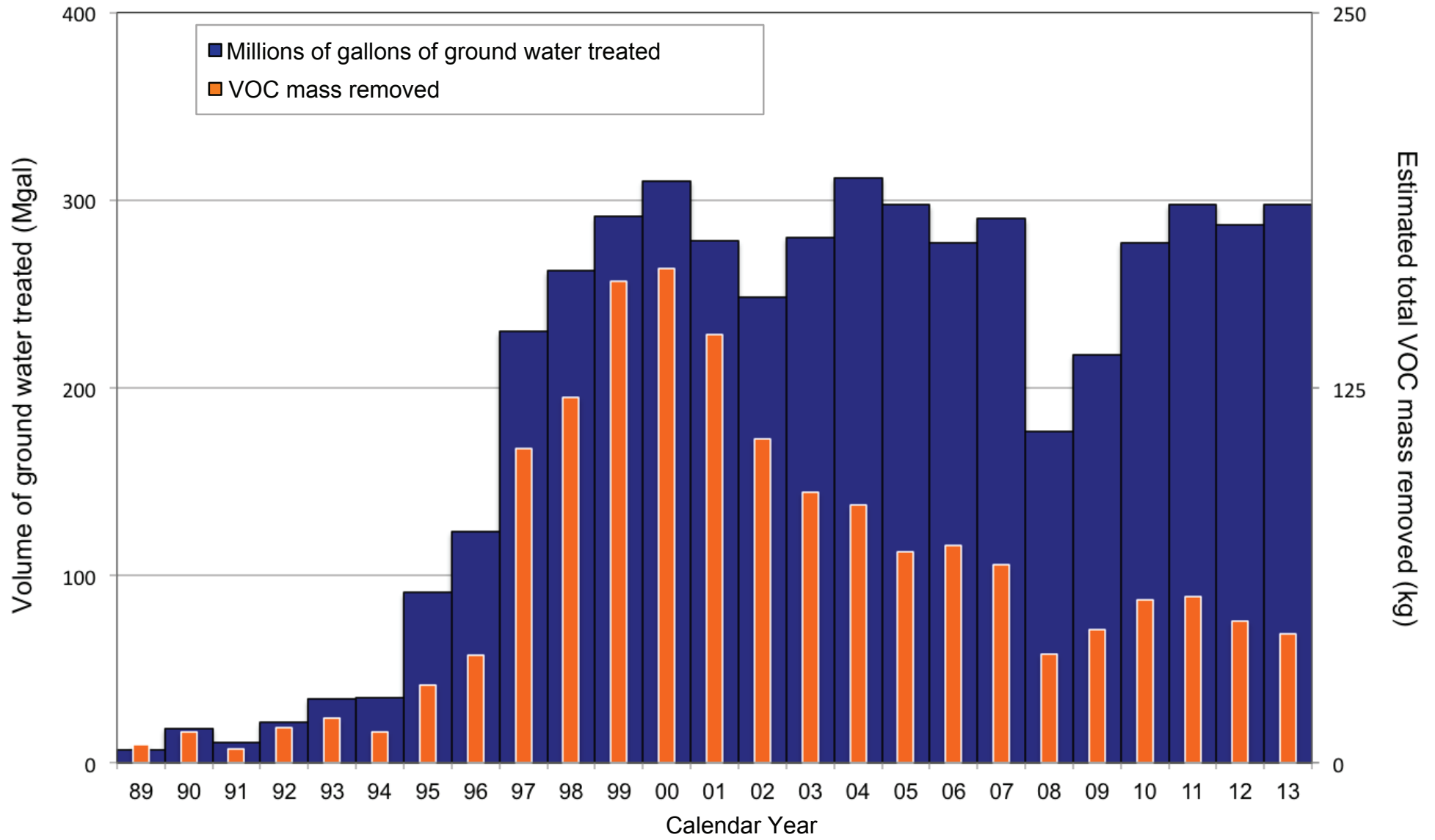
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Figure 3. Locations of wells and treatment facilities in the TFD Helipad *in-situ* bioremediation treatability test area.



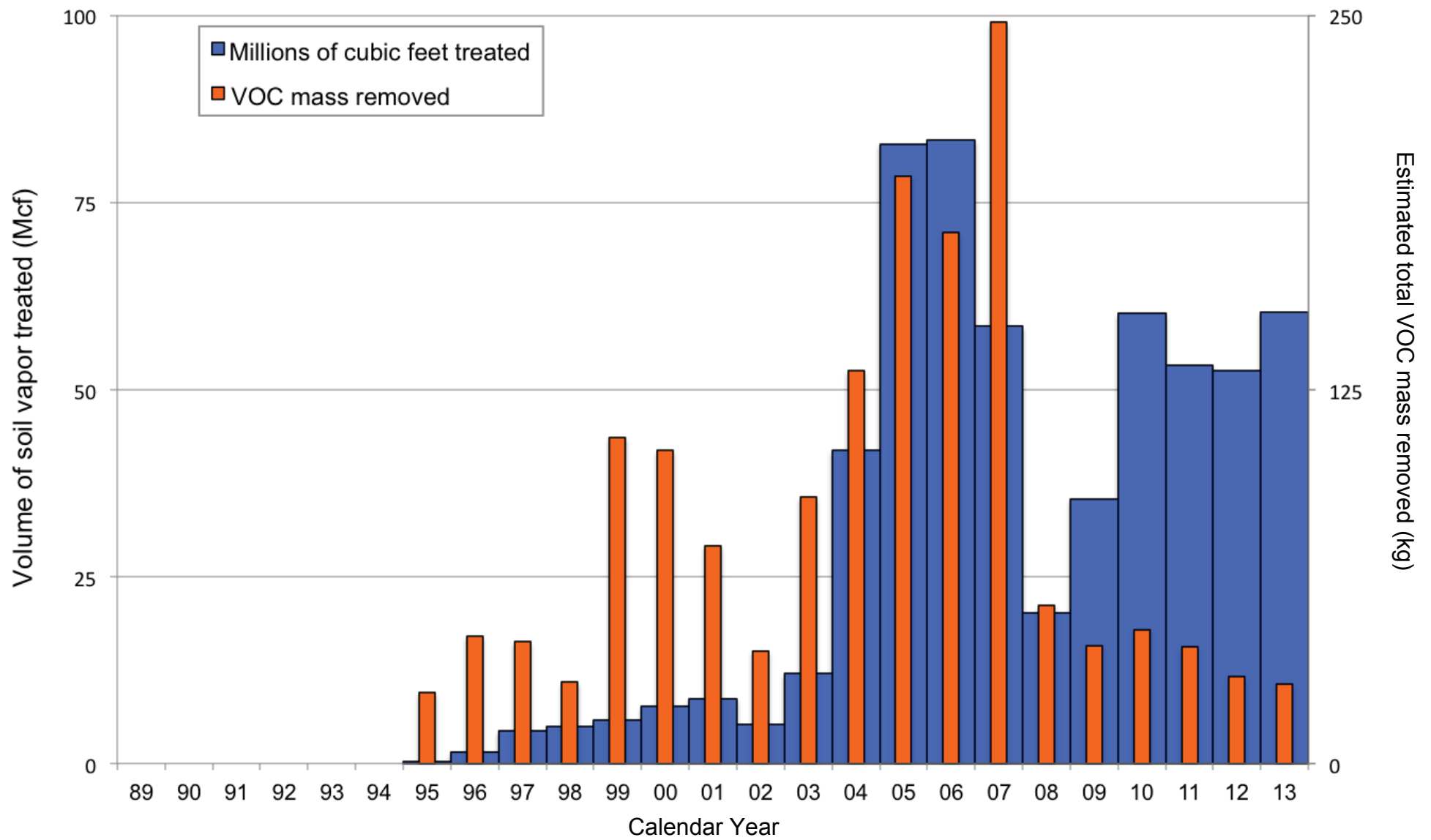
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Figure 4. Locations of wells and treatment facilities in the TFE Eastern Landing Mat thermally-enhanced remediation treatability test area.

Figure 6. Estimated total VOC mass removed from Livermore Site soil vapor since 1989.

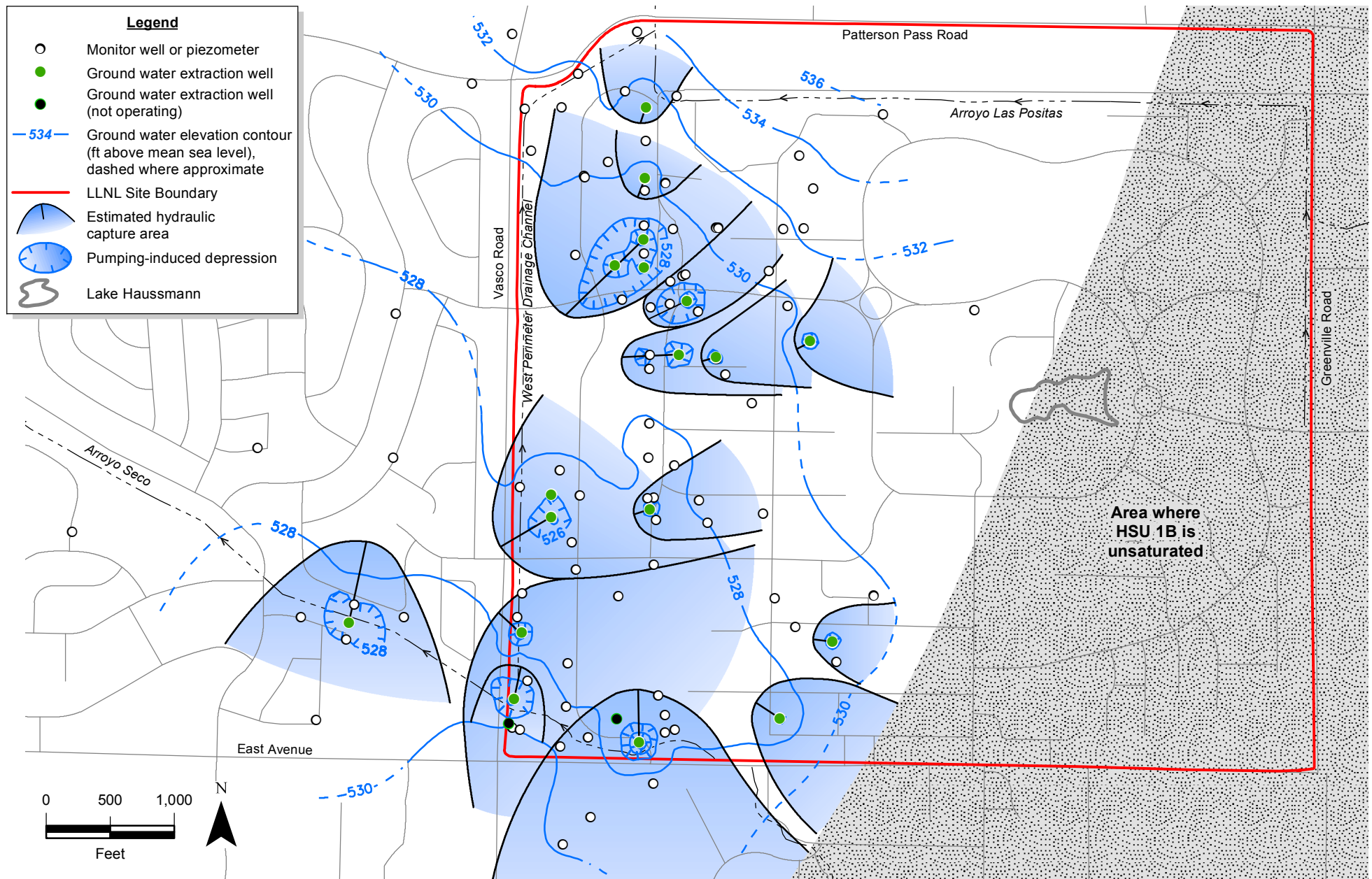


Figure 7. Ground water elevation contour map based on 108 wells completed within HSU-1B showing estimated hydraulic capture areas, LLNL and vicinity, third quarter 2013.



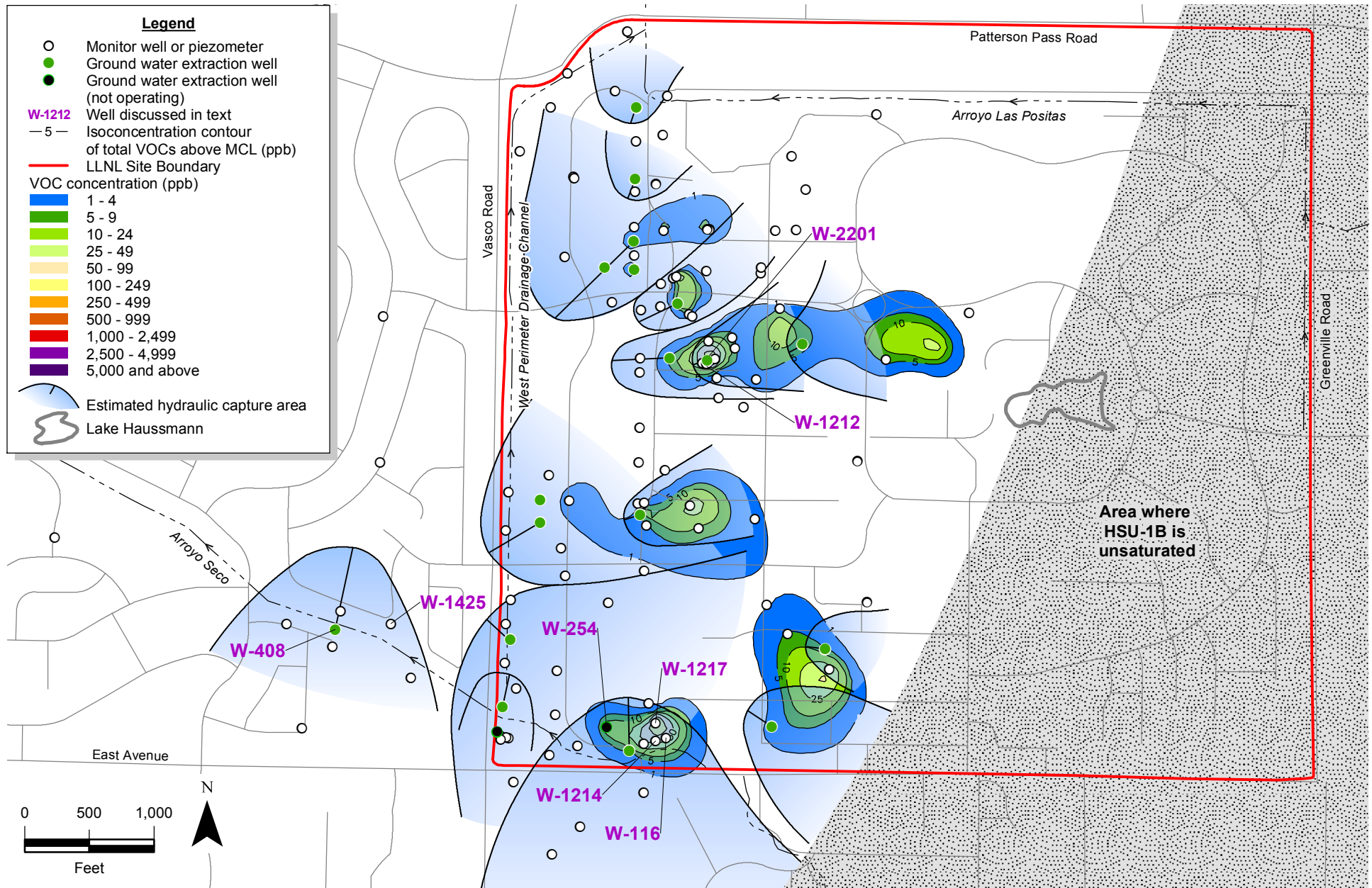


Figure 8. Isoconcentration contour map of total VOCs above MCLs from 129 wells completed within HSU-1B, third quarter 2013 (or the next most recent data), and supplemented with soil chemistry data from 41 borehole locations.

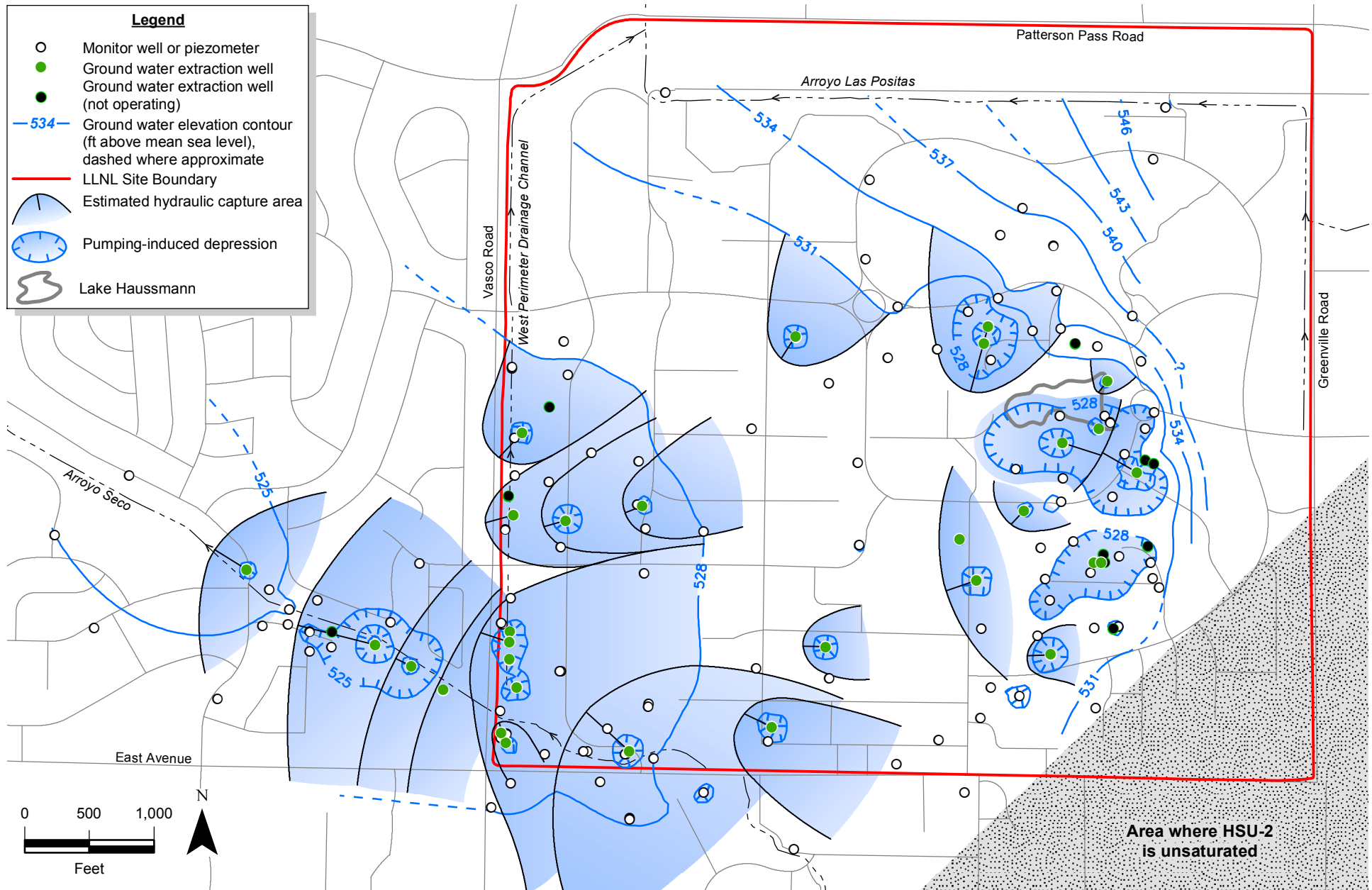


Figure 9. Ground water elevation contour map based on 154 wells completed within HSU-2 showing estimated hydraulic capture areas, LLNL and vicinity, third quarter 2013.

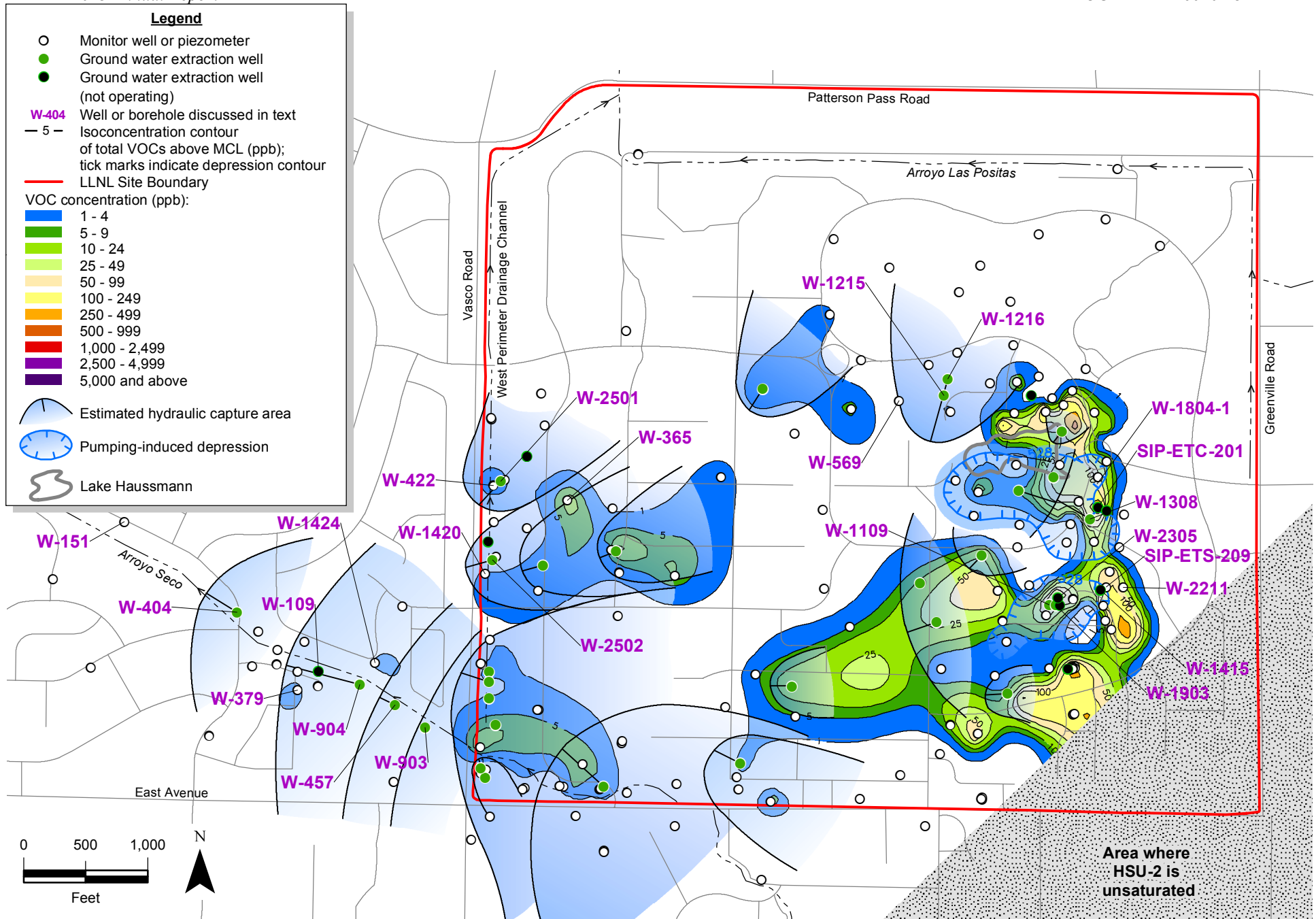


Figure 10. Isoconcentration contour map of total VOCs above MCLs from 202 wells completed within HSU-2, third quarter 2013 (or the next most recent data), and supplemented with soil chemistry data from 94 borehole locations.

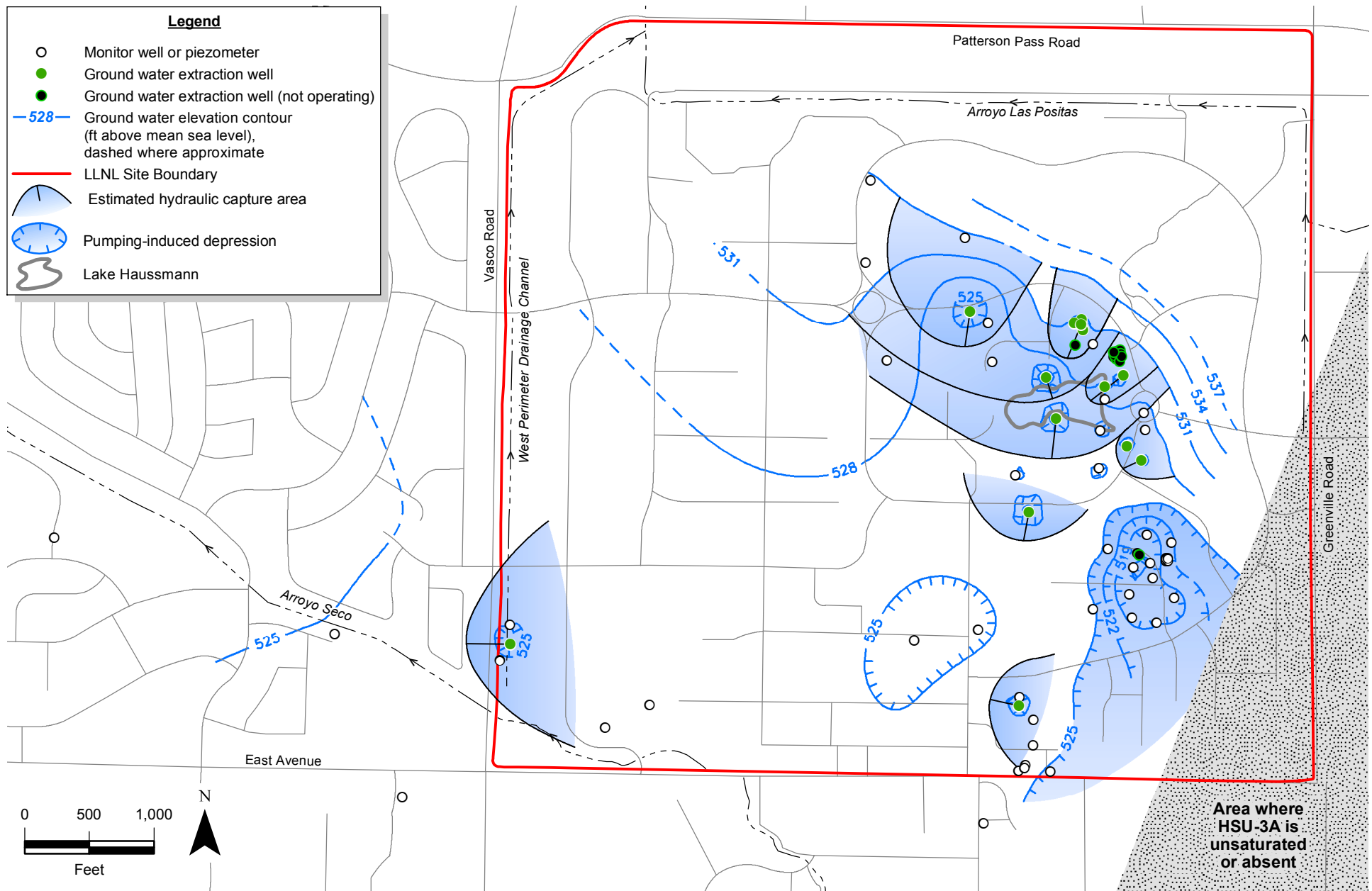


Figure 11. Ground water elevation contour map based on 73 wells completed within HSU-3A showing estimated hydraulic capture areas, LLNL and vicinity, third quarter 2013.

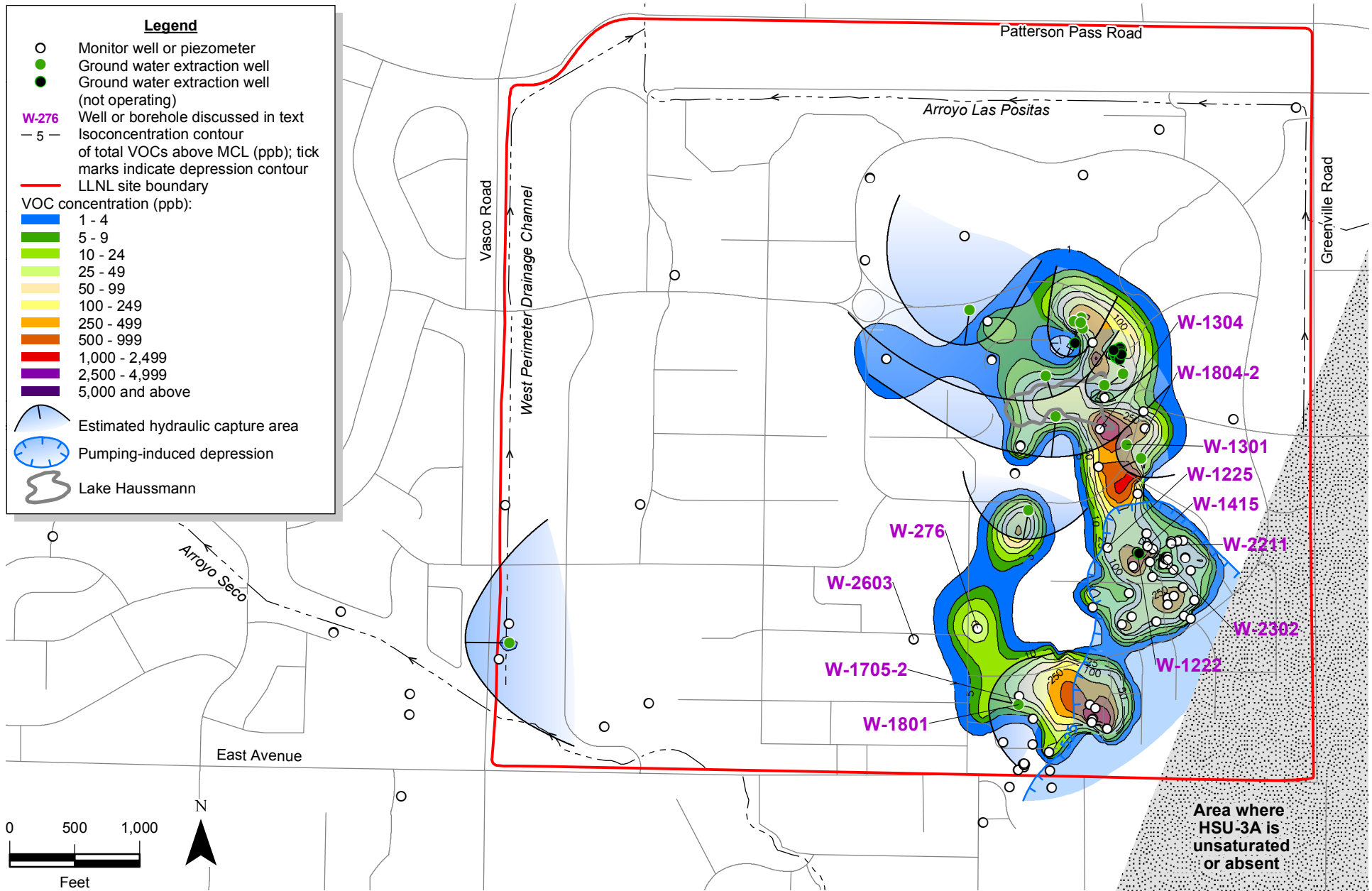


Figure 12. Isoconcentration contour map of total VOCs above MCLs from 119 wells completed within HSU-3A, third quarter 2013 (or the next most recent data), and supplemented with soil chemistry data from 143 borehole locations.

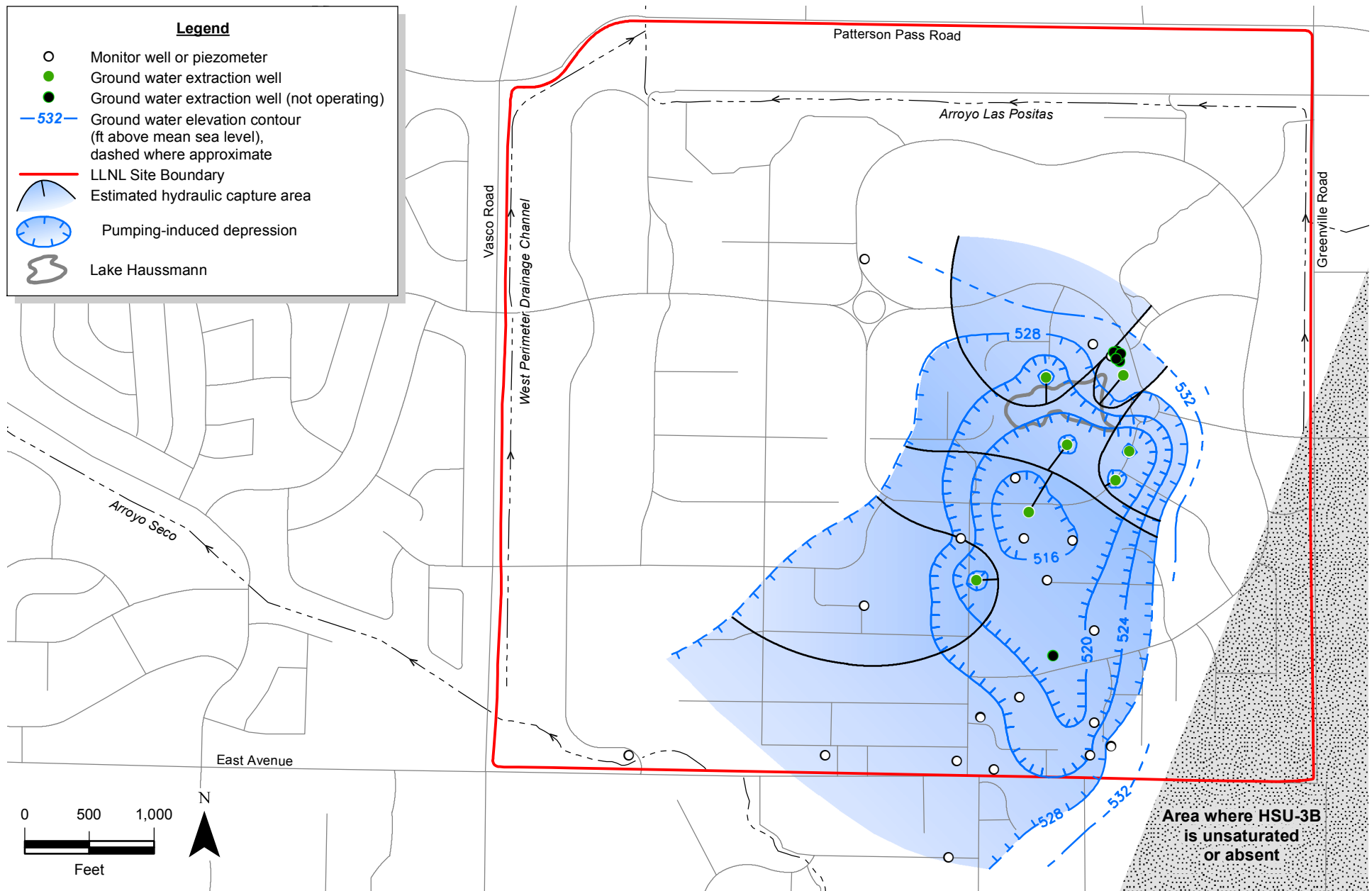


Figure 13. Ground water elevation contour map based on 35 wells completed within HSU-3B showing estimated hydraulic capture areas, LLNL and vicinity, third quarter 2013.

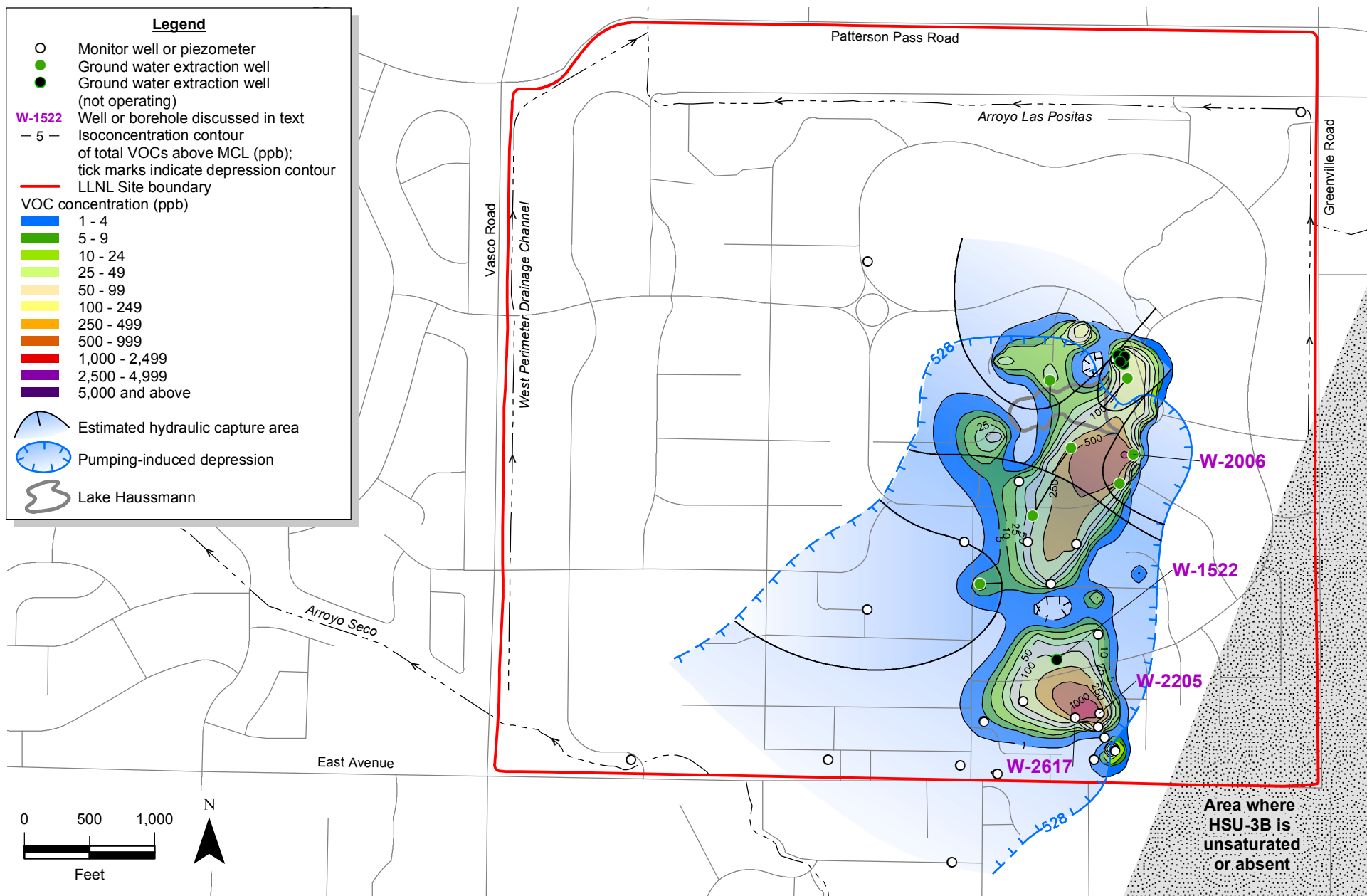


Figure 14. Isoconcentration contour map of total VOCs above MCLs from 42 wells completed within HSU-3B, third quarter 2013 (or the next most recent data), and supplemented with soil chemistry data from 113 borehole locations.

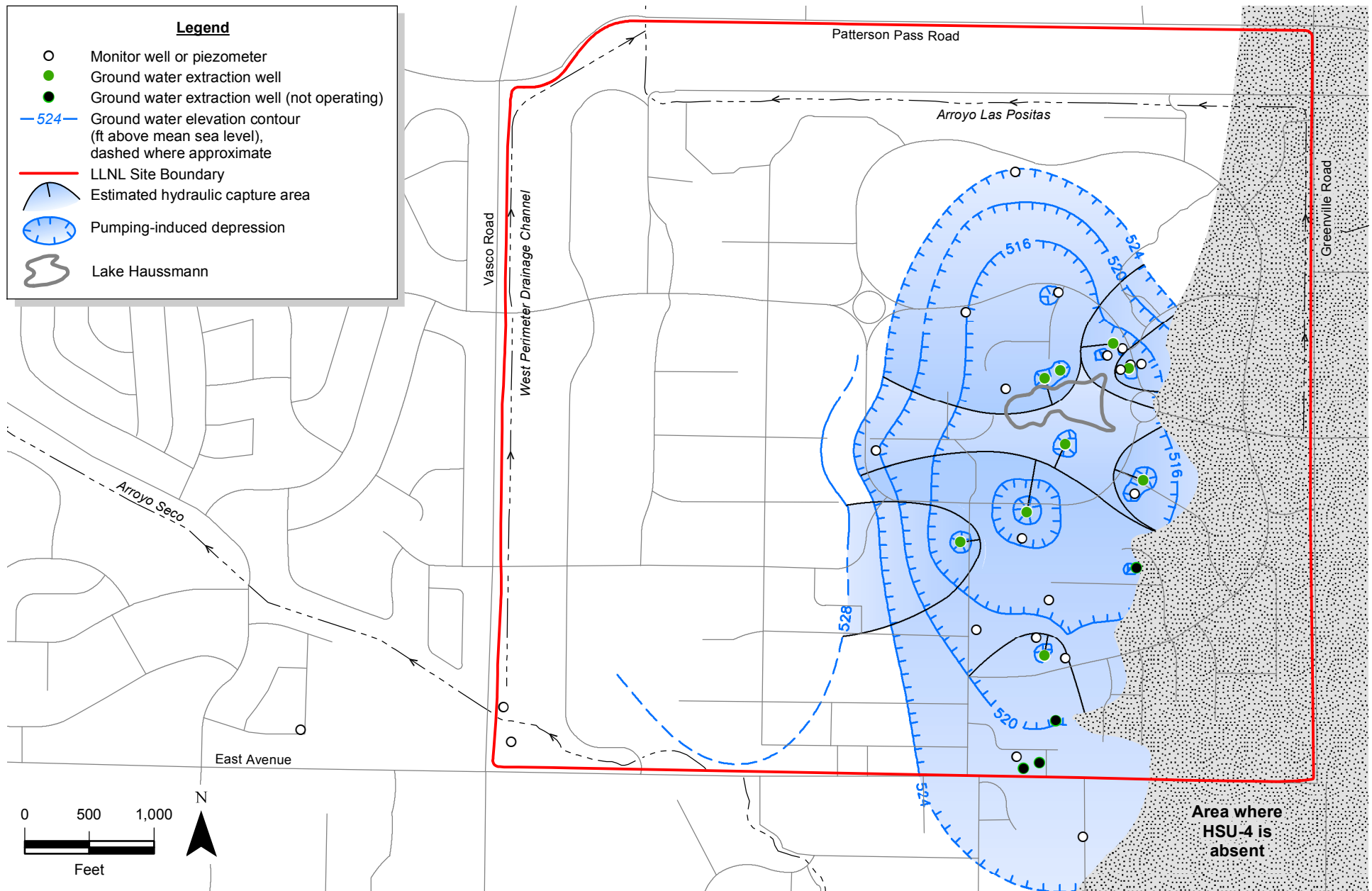


Figure 15. Ground water elevation contour map based on 34 wells completed within HSU-4 showing estimated hydraulic capture areas, LLNL and vicinity, third quarter 2013.



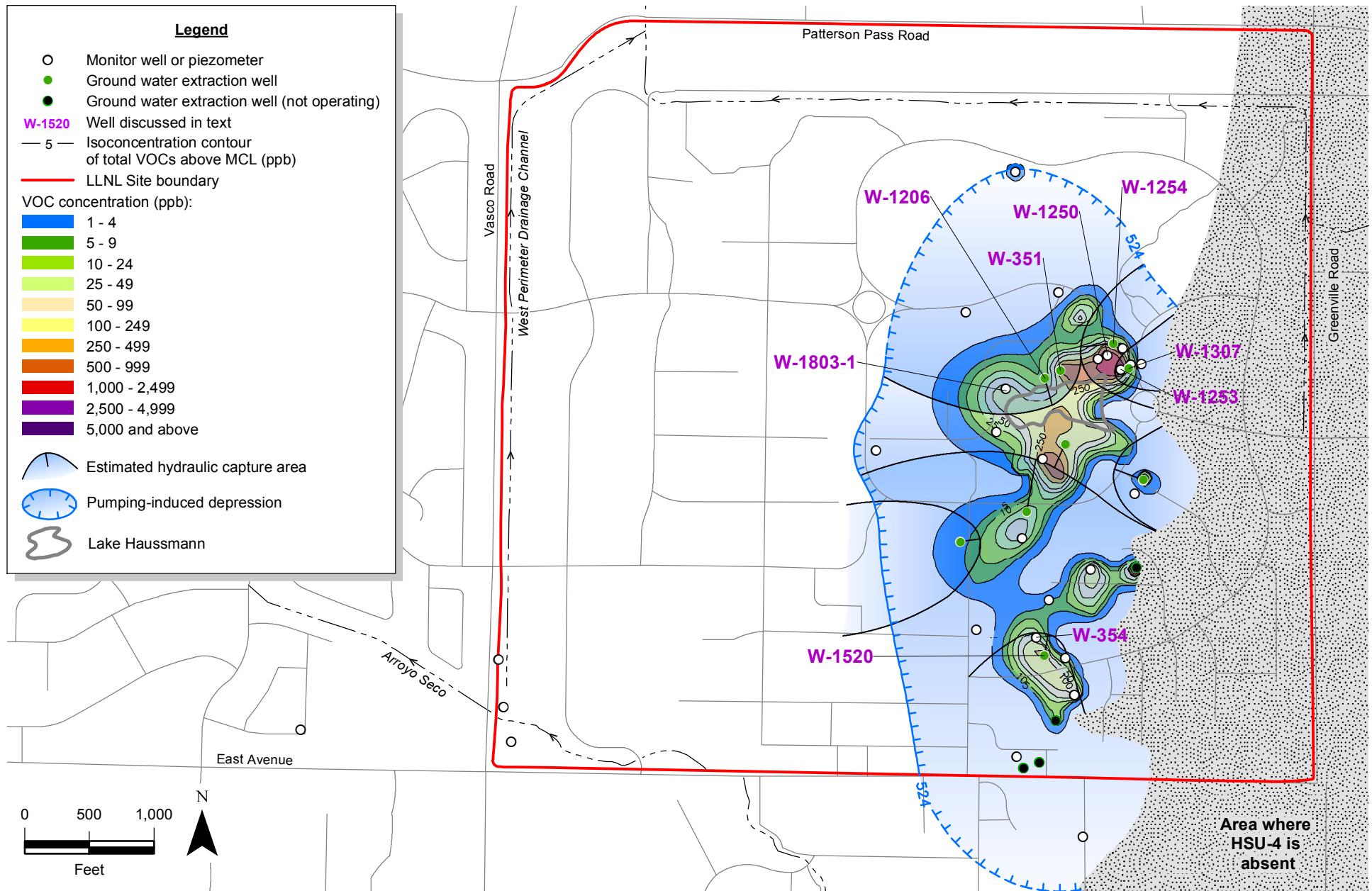


Figure 16. Isoconcentration contour map of total VOCs above MCLs from 43 wells completed within HSU-4, third quarter 2013 (or the next most recent data), and supplemented with soil chemistry data from 62 borehole locations.

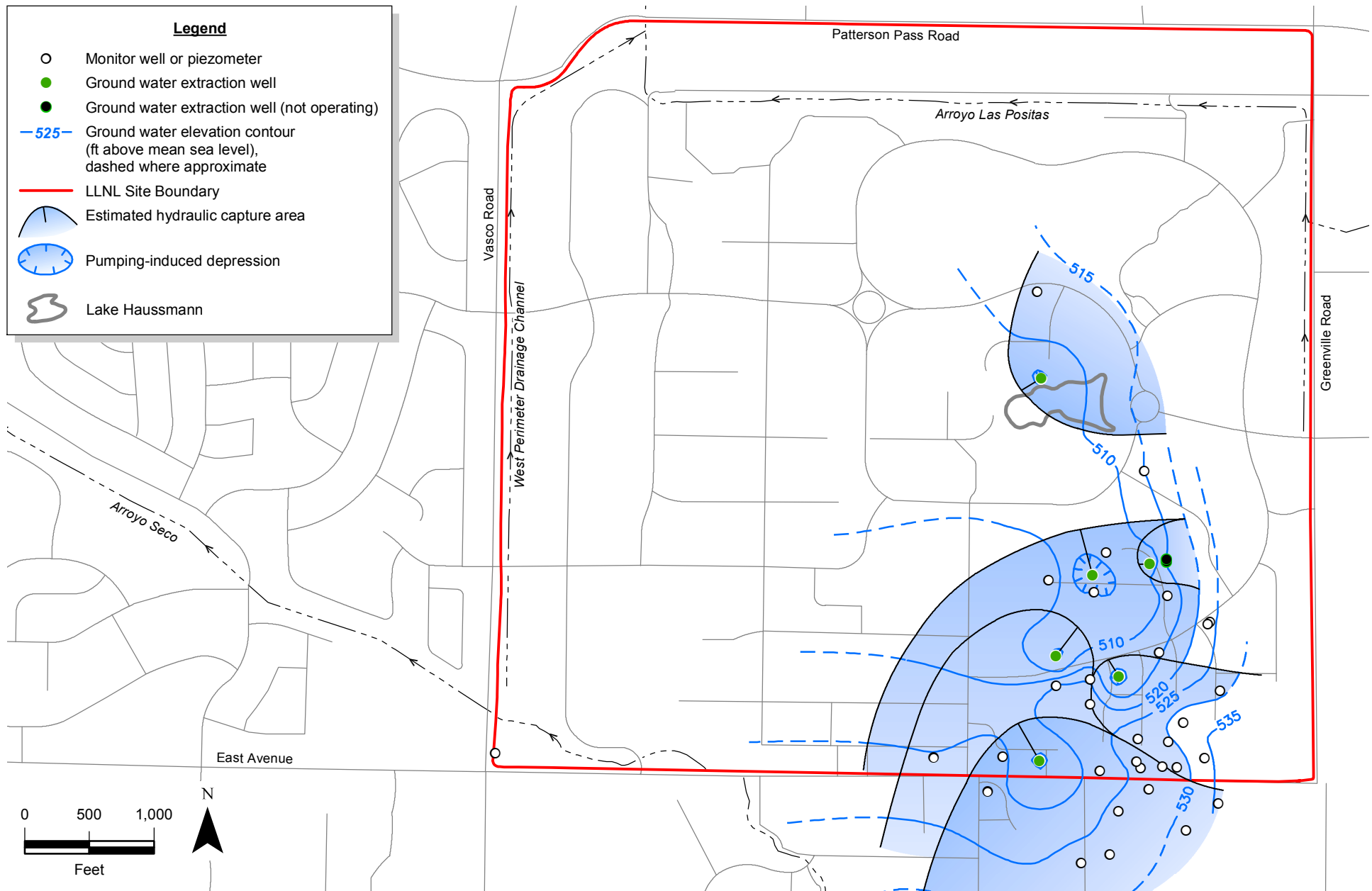


Figure 17. Ground water elevation contour map based on 41 wells completed within HSU-5 showing estimated hydraulic capture areas, LLNL and vicinity, third quarter 2013.

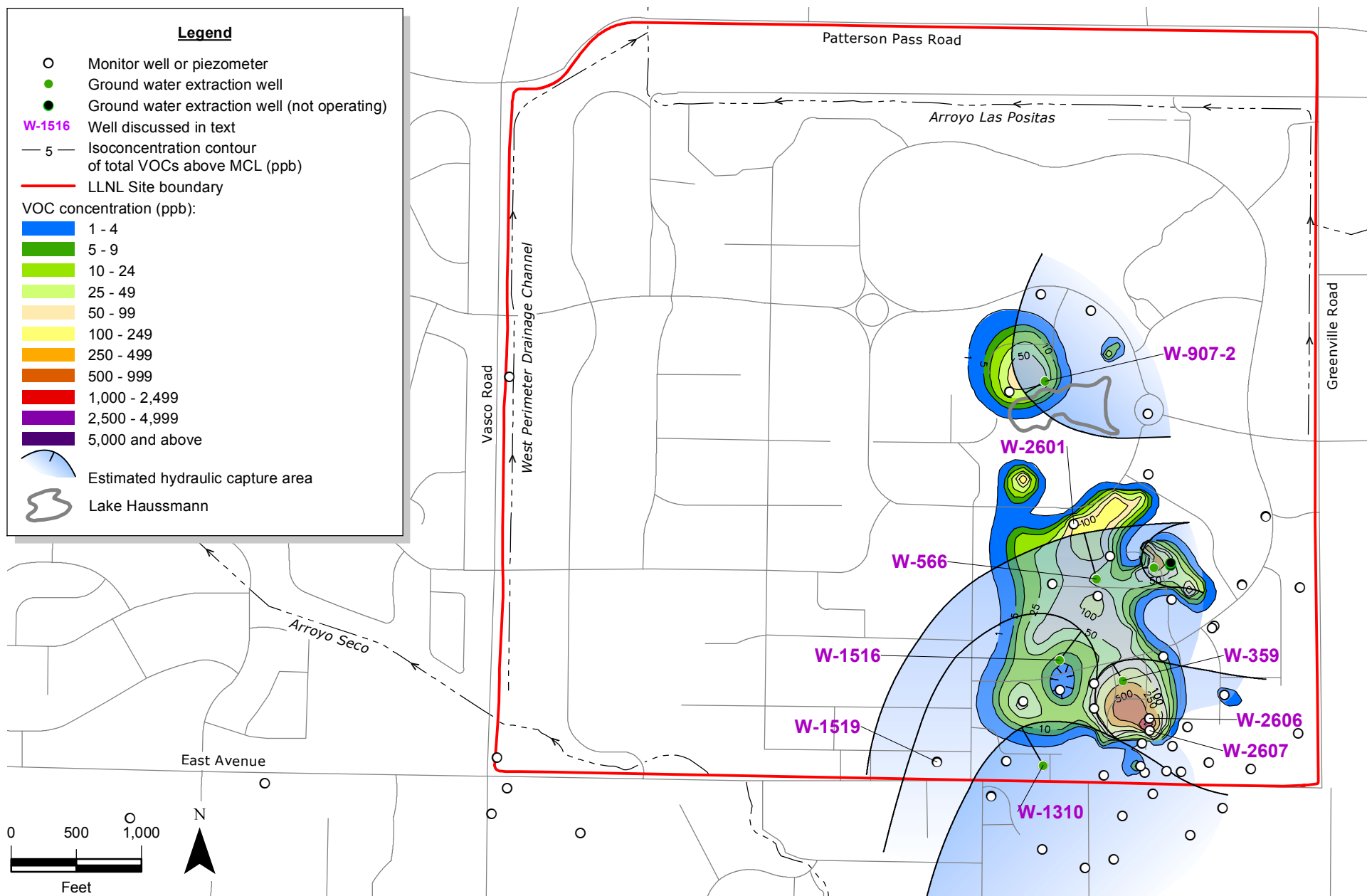


Figure 18. Isoconcentration contour map of total VOCs above MCLs from 61 wells completed within HSU-5, third quarter 2013 (or the next most recent data), and supplemented with soil chemistry data from 99 borehole locations.

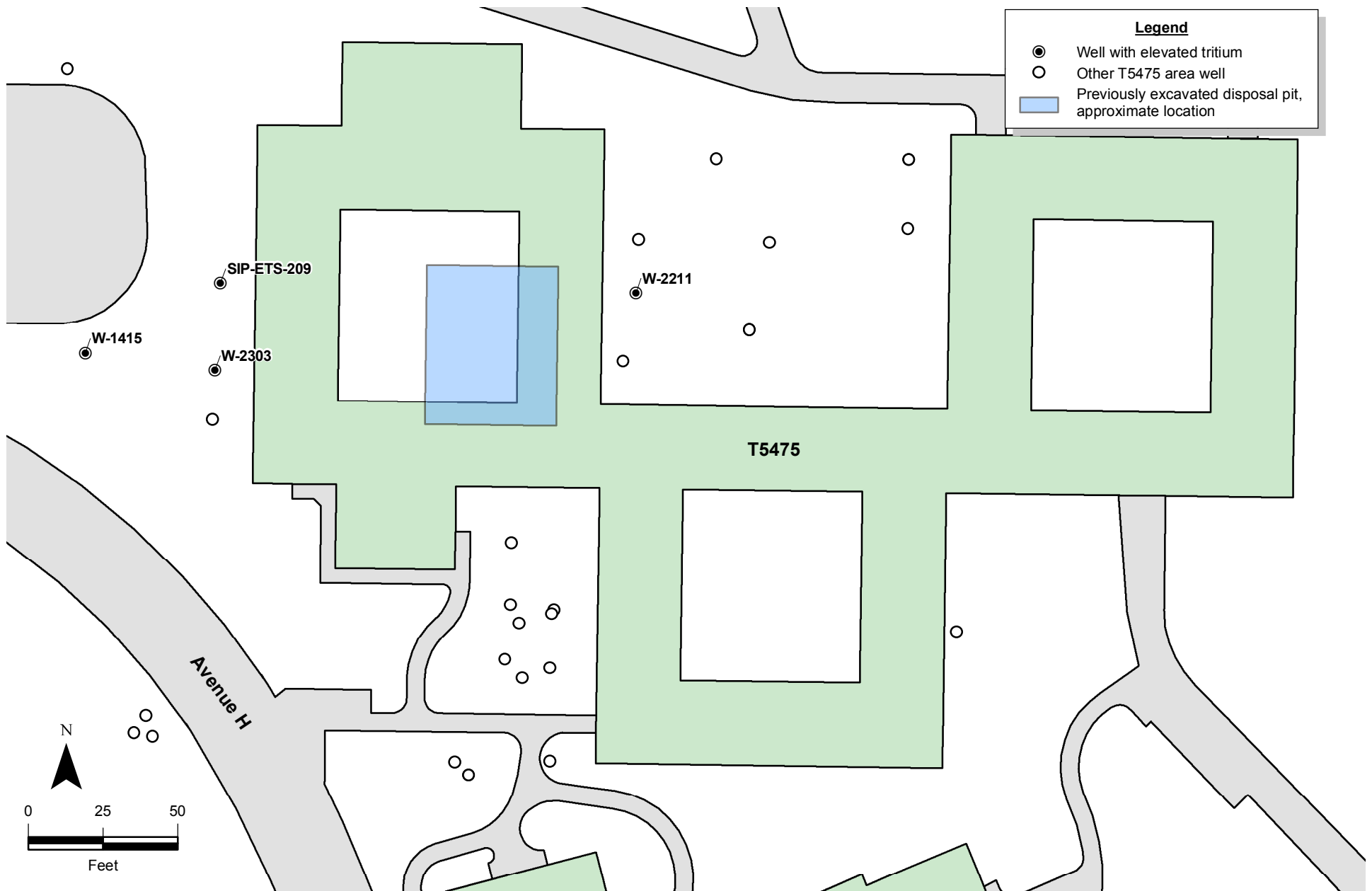

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## Appendix C

### Ground Water Sampling Monitoring Algorithm

#### C-1. Introduction

LLNL uses a statistically based methodology, referred to as the cost-effective sampling (CES) frequency algorithm, to estimate the lowest-frequency sampling schedule for ground water monitoring locations that meets regulatory and cleanup monitoring needs.

The CES algorithm first generates an initial, or “raw”, recommendation separately for each location using a computer program that evaluates patterns in the available data. The raw recommendation at each location may be for quarterly, semi-annual, annual, or biennial (every other year) sampling. Project personnel then review the raw recommendations and are permitted to increase, but not decrease, the sampling frequency based on other (non-statistical) considerations (McConachie, 1993). In some instances the computer program is unable to make a raw recommendation, in which case project personnel choose a sampling frequency.

CES is used quarterly to determine recommendations for the next quarter, e.g., it is run during the first quarter of each year to generate recommendations that will take effect during the second quarter. Thus the sampling frequency determinations are updated regularly as new data are obtained.

The algorithm is a dynamic tool that can be modified as remediation continues and technical advances occur.

#### C-2. Use of the CES Algorithm

The CES algorithm is applied separately to each location, where each concentration trend, variability, and magnitude statistics are calculated separately for each of thirteen key contaminants of concern (COCs): carbon tetrachloride, chloroform, 1,1-DCA, 1,2-DCA, 1,1-DCE, 1,2-DCE (total), Freon 113, PCE, 1,1,1-TCA, 1,1,2-TCA, TCE, Freon 11 (trichlorofluoromethane), and vinyl chloride. The statistics are then evaluated to produce a raw recommended sampling frequency for each COC. The raw CES recommendation for each location is the greatest sampling frequency among the individual COC recommendations at that location.

Two time periods are defined: “recent” and “long-term”. Recent data consist of the most recent 1.5 to 2.5 years and at least 2 data points. Long-term data consist of at least 4.5 to 6 years and at least 4 data points. The time periods are extended if necessary to obtain at least the minimum number of required data points.

##### C-2.1. Analyzing trend, variability, and magnitude

The basic CES principle is that the greater the rate of change, whether up or down, the greater the potential need for more frequent sampling. Where little change is observed, less frequent sampling is warranted. Similarly, the greater the variability in concentrations, the greater the potential need for more frequent sampling.

Trends are obtained by calculating a linear regression of concentration as a function of time. The slope of the regression line represents an average rate of concentration change per year. The magnitude of the concentration affects whether a given rate of change is environmentally significant. For example, a yearly change of 50 ppb is more significant for a well in which concentrations are around 100 ppb than for one in which concentrations are around 1,000 ppb. In a 100 ppb well, a 50 ppb/year rate of change would be considered large, whereas in a 1,000 ppb well it would be considered small. Therefore, trends are categorized as high, medium-high, medium-low, or low, depending on both the slope and their concentration range (as indicated by the median concentration), as shown in Table C-1.

Variability is evaluated by a variability index defined as the concentration range divided by the median concentration (an index of relative variability). For example, data with a range of 50 ppb at a median of 5,000 ppb are considerably less variable than data with a range of 50 ppb at a median of 100 ppb. “High” variability is defined as a variability index greater than 1, and “low” variability is defined as a variability index less than or equal to 1.

Finally, trend and variability are considered together to determine an initial sampling frequency recommendation, as shown in Table C-2.

### C-2.2. Determining a CES raw recommendation

The CES recommendation for an individual COC at a single location is determined in four steps:

**Step 1** consists of applying the trend and variability evaluation of Section C-2.1 to recent data to obtain an initial sampling frequency of quarterly, semi-annual, or annual (this is the “Step 1 frequency”)

**Step 2** consists of applying the trend and variability evaluation of Section C-2.1 to long-term data and comparing with the results of Step 1.

- If the sampling frequency based on recent data (the Step 1 frequency) is semi-annual or annual, it is used for the CES raw recommendation.
- If the recent trend is greater than the overall trend (in absolute value), the Step 1 frequency is used for the CES raw recommendation.
- If recent and long-term trends are in the same category, the Step 1 frequency is used for the CES raw recommendation.

Otherwise, the recent and long-term trends are compared using the absolute value of the ratio of the recent slope to the long-term slope.

- If the ratio is  $\geq 0.25$  then the sampling frequency based on the long-term data is used for the CES raw recommendation.
- If the ratio is  $< 0.25$  and the median recent concentration is  $< 10$  ppb, the Step 1 sampling frequency is used.
- If the ratio is  $< 0.25$  but the median recent concentration is  $\geq 10$  ppb, then CES does not make a recommendation; project personnel review the data and make a determination.

**Step 3** consists of reducing the sampling frequency for the low-risk compounds chloroform, Freon 11, and Freon 113.

Not all compounds in the analytical target list are equally harmful. For example, an average rate of change of 25 ppb per year for TCE (5 ppb MCL) is more significant than the same trend for chloroform, Freon 11 or Freon 113 (100 ppb, 150 ppb, and 1,200 ppb MCL, respectively). If the maximum concentration in the recent data is less than half of the MCL then quarterly and semiannual sampling frequencies are reduced to semi-annual and annual respectively.

**Step 4** consists of reducing the sampling frequency to biennial if the following conditions are met.

- The result of Steps 1 through 3 must be an annual frequency recommendation.
- The average rates of change for both recent and long-term data sets must be in the annual category.

- There must be no indication of upward trend. The recent median concentration must be less than the long-term median concentration plus 2.5 ppb. (Small fluctuations of slopes within the low annual category are expected, but there should be no indication of a larger upward trend.)
- The median recent concentration must be low (less than 20 ppb).

After all four steps have been completed for every analyte at a location, the CES raw recommendation for the location is the greatest sampling frequency among the individual COC recommendations at that location. If the algorithm was unable to determine a sampling frequency (Step 2) for any of the COCs, the CES raw recommendation for the location as a whole is undetermined.

Finally, project personnel then review the raw recommendations and are permitted to increase, but not decrease, the sampling frequency based on other (non-statistical) considerations.

### **C-3. Applicability**

Some locations will have sampling frequencies driven by regulatory or remedial needs regardless of their concentration history. For example, wells located downgradient of the leading edge of a plume can be designated as “guard” wells and will remain on a quarterly sampling schedule regardless of their CES recommendation. Sampling frequencies for ground water extraction wells associated with treatment facilities always remain quarterly to calculate accurate mass removal estimates, and are not included in the CES algorithm. Each quarter, the list of wells evaluated by the CES algorithm is reviewed and adjusted based on such considerations.

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## Appendix E

### The Remediation Evaluation (REVAL) Process

DOE/ERD developed the REVAL process (Table E-1) to systematically evaluate treatment facilities. REVAL ensures that each system operates in a safe and optimal manner to remove and treat contaminated soil vapor and ground water, and ultimately expedite cleanup of the subsurface. The process was designed to ensure that the following procedures and activities are implemented properly at each facility undergoing repairs and upgrades:

- Track maintenance and repair work required for each facility;
- Document existing facility, pipeline and extraction well conditions;
- Standardize equipment, instrumentation, and data acquisition systems;
- When necessary, upgrade and expand system components;
- Collect ground water analytical data from extraction and performance monitoring wells to assess potential rebound during a hiatus in operations;
- Collect information on the specific capacity of extraction wells; and
- Collect subsurface hydraulic and pneumatic interference information during extraction well field startup.

**Table E-1. Summary of the Remedial Evaluation (REVAL) Process.**

<b>REVAL Process Step</b>	<b>Description of Activities</b>
<b>1 - Project Initiation</b>	The project is initiated with a document that identifies the project objectives and personnel and details individual roles and responsibilities. The document also refers to all applicable site safety and security procedures, standard operating procedures, and all relevant regulatory documentation.
<b>2 - Remedial System Review/Design</b>	The hydrogeology team reviews the effectiveness of the extraction well field and recommends adjustments. The engineering team performs a treatment facility assessment to identify necessary repairs, modifications, and upgrades to achieve optimal treatment facility performance. During this step, all facility design, operation, and maintenance documentation is reviewed and updated as necessary. If applicable, well field expansion may be incorporated into the design during this step.
<b>3 - Facility Repairs, Modifications, and Construction</b>	The engineering team performs the necessary repairs and modifications to the facility and documents “as-built” drawings. Repairs and modifications increase data accuracy and reliability, improve treatment facility and extraction well field operations, and standardization of equipment, instrumentation, and control systems.
<b>4 - Initial Well Field Sampling</b>	If applicable, the hydrogeology team identifies the extraction and monitoring wells that require sampling. Field personnel sample these wells prior to the startup of the facility. The analytical results are used to evaluate potential rebound in contaminant concentrations while the facility was shutdown.
<b>5 - Facility Testing and Verification</b>	The engineering team performs testing and verification of the treatment facility components. The facility is then operated on a day-only (test) basis until all facility systems are verified. Once all applicable operational functions and interlocks are verified, the facility can once again run on a 24-hour basis.
<b>6 - Extraction Well Field Startup</b>	The hydrogeology team prepares an extraction well field startup plan using data gathered during the verification and validation step. The startup plan may include specific capacity testing of each well or a phased startup of the entire extraction well field to determine hydraulic or pneumatic interference and achieve stable operations of the extraction well field and treatment facility. Analysis of the test data provides a foundation for evaluating long-term well performance and improving/optimizing extraction well field performance.

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## Appendix F

### **Rule-based algorithms for generating ground water elevation and isoconcentration contour maps**

In 1997, DOE/ERD developed a process to assist hydrogeologists in developing a consistent set of ground water elevation and isoconcentration maps that cover the entire Livermore Site project history. The process is called the Optimized Environmental Restoration Analysis (OPERA) and consists of a set of rule-based algorithms that utilize all site data and knowledge into an automated system for creating representative maps over the project history. It was developed primarily to provide hydrogeologists a means to focus on data analysis rather than data compilation. In addition to being a process to generate representative maps in a short period of time, the process also provides consistent interpolations over time and provides a platform for improved quality assurance and quality control. The process and resulting maps also provided a feedback loop where the database and site conceptual model are continually updated.

The resulting maps are used in regulatory reports, presentations, remediation planning, remedial performance evaluation, numerical modeling input, and most importantly, as an overall communication tool between all stakeholders.

The rules for the algorithms have been developed over time and represent the collective experience of the past and present Livermore Site hydrogeologists. In essence, OPERA is DOE/ERD's knowledge management tool for preserving and improving the site conceptual model by maintaining a record of the interpreted subsurface data.

There are four main parts to the OPERA process: 1) environmental database, 2) site conceptual model (i.e., HSU designations), 3) site and project knowledge, and 4) computer programs that consist of algorithms and visualization packages.

The process is designed to be inherently conservative. For example, the highest observed concentration in a well that was sampled twice in a given quarter (e.g., duplicate samples) is always selected as the representative result. The use of a three-point moving average was incorporated into the rules to prevent concentration fluctuations in a well over time from incorrectly influencing decision-making. As a result, the data set used in generating ground water elevation and isoconcentration maps will not always exactly match the value stored in the database for a given well. OPERA is used to generate the data files and the preliminary maps. The final maps are always generated and reviewed by a hydrogeologist. The resulting ground water elevation and isoconcentration maps have been shown to be significantly more effective in evaluating the progress of remediation progress at the Livermore Site because the change in ground water elevations and isoconcentration contours can be viewed as a time-series and temporal variations are minimized.

The OPERA process is run each quarter and ground water elevation and isoconcentration maps for each HSU are updated. During this process, isoconcentration maps for individual VOCs, total VOCs, and total VOCs above their respective MCLs are generated for each HSU. The primary components of the OPERA process are described in Table F-1.

**Table F-1. Primary components of the Optimized Environmental Restoration Analysis (OPERA) Process.**

<b>OPERA Process Step</b>	<b>Description of Step</b>
<p><b>1 - Hydrostratigraphic Unit and Hydraulics Analysis (HSUHA)</b></p>	<p>A structural representation of the site conceptual model is developed using all the information from site boreholes and wells. The HSU picks are determined using lithological, geophysical, soil chemistry, water level, and hydraulic testing data. Using these data, the boundaries, extent, and thickness of each HSU are defined. In addition, distribution of hydraulic parameters within an HSU, isopachs for different lithological types, and well-specific parameters such as well losses are also determined in this step.</p>
<p><b>2 - Ground Water Elevation History Analysis (GWELHA)</b></p>	<p>The ground water elevation history of each well is reviewed and data are interpolated using rule-based algorithms where there is less than adequate areal and temporal coverage. The well loss information is incorporated into the data set for extraction wells. The hydraulic test results are used to generate cones of depression around each extraction well that honors Darcy's Law of ground water flow through porous media. The resulting ground water elevation surfaces are used to define the extent of saturation when combined with the HSU information from step number one above.</p>
<p><b>3 - Plume History Analysis (PLUHA)</b></p>	<p>The concentration history of each volatile organic compound is reviewed and data are interpolated using conservative assumptions and a rule-based algorithm where there is less than adequate areal and temporal coverage. Ground water chemistry data are augmented with data from bailed ground water and soil samples collected during drilling of a borehole. The extent of HSUs and extent of saturation information from the two steps above are also incorporated into the data files to generate representative plume maps.</p>


