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PRE-LICENSURE NURSING EDUCATION PROGRAMS

SUMMARY OF ANNUAL REPORTS

July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014

Pre-licensure nursing education programs with Full or Provisional Board approval are required to submit an Annual Report to the Ohio Board of Nursing in accordance with Rule 4723-5-05(A), Ohio Administrative Code.

There were 154 pre-licensure nursing education programs that submitted Annual Reports, 86 registered nursing (RN) programs and 68 practical nursing (PN) programs. Of the 86 RN programs, there are 30 baccalaureate degree programs, 46 associate degree programs, 6 diploma programs, and 4 direct entry graduate programs.

This Summary of Annual Reports covers the time period of July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014. The report provides highlights and detailed information/data regarding RN and PN education programs.

Annual Report Highlights

RN education programs

- ➢ Filled to 88% capacity
- Maximum student capacity of 28,562
 - Associate degree programs: 16,269
 - Baccalaureate degree programs: 11,557
 - Diploma programs: 418
 - Direct entry graduate programs: 318
- Planned to admit a total of 14,790
 - Associate degree programs: 9,976
 - Baccalaureate degree programs: 4,335
 - Diploma programs: 276
 - Direct entry graduate programs: 203

- > Admitted a total of 12,439 students
 - Associate degree programs: 7,952
 - Baccalaureate degree programs: 4,117
 - Diploma programs: 172
 - Direct entry graduate programs: 198
- Identified that 219 faculty members and 202 teaching assistants left their positions during this reporting period
 - 35 reported leaving due to compensation
- Projected 334 faculty members and 387 teaching assistants will leave their positions within the next 5 years
- Provided clinical hours ranging from 206 to 1,604 hours; the previous reporting period range was 315 to 1,604 hours
- Reported a peak student enrollment of 25,113
- Reported 8,901 students successfully completed the programs, overall, an increase of 113 from the last reporting period. Direct entry graduate programs reported a decrease of 49 from the last reporting period.
- > Granted advanced standing for newly admitted students with military training:
 - 4 baccalaureate degree program
 - 1 associate degree program
 - 0 diploma and direct entry graduate programs
- Established articulation agreements with higher degree programs enabling graduates to progress to a baccalaureate or higher degree:
 - 32 of the 46 associate degree programs
 - 2 of the 6 diploma programs
- > 67 programs reported accreditation by ACEN, CCNE or both
- Required drug screens for students at any time during enrollment
 - 22 Baccalaureate degree programs
 - 33 Associate degree programs
 - 2 Diploma programs
 - 2 Direct entry graduate programs

PN education programs

- ➢ Filled to 62% capacity
- Reported peak student enrollment of 5,901
- > Did not offer admission to 538 qualified applicants
- Identified that 170 faculty members and 49 teaching assistants left during this reporting period
 - 27 reported leaving due to compensation
- Projected that 145 faculty members and 72 teaching assistants will leave their positions within the next 5 years
- Provided clinical hours ranging from 105 to 609 hours; in the last reporting period, PN programs reported a range of 202 to 609 hours
- > Granted advanced standing and successful completion for:
 - 127 state tested nurse aides (STNAs)
 - 2 emergency medical technicians (EMTs)
 - 2 military trained personnel (MTs)
- 46 programs have established articulation agreements with associate or baccalaureate degree programs
- > Were accredited or considering accreditation:
 - 3 ACEN accredited
 - 17 considering ACEN accreditation
- > 44 programs required drug screens for students at any time during enrollment

Faculty and Teaching Assistant Projections

- > 219 faculty members and 202 teaching assistants left during the reporting period
 - 35 faculty and teaching assistants reported compensation as the reason
- 334 faculty members and 387 teaching assistants anticipate leaving in the next 5 years

> The administrative rules establish parameters and outcomes for clinical experiences but the rules do not establish a minimum number of clinical hours.

Clinical Supervision: Faculty, Teaching Assistants, Preceptors and Ratios

- 81 programs reported using a combination of graduate and baccalaureate degree prepared nurses to supervise students during clinical experiences
- > 76 programs reported using preceptors to supervise students during clinical experiences
 - 6 Diploma programs
 - 37 Associate degree programs
 - 29 Baccalaureate degree programs
 - 4 Direct entry graduate programs

Faculty or Teaching Assistant Ratios For Clinical Experience

- ➢ 5 programs: 1 to 6
- 12 programs: 1 to 7
- ➢ 47 programs: 1 to 8
- > 10 programs: 1 to 9
- > 12 programs: 1 to 10

Capstone or Practicum Clinical Experience as Part of the Curriculum

70 programs conclude their curriculum with a capstone or practicum course that includes a clinical experience supervised by a preceptor. The clock hours range from 24 to 394

Capstone Examination

- 85 programs reported using a capstone examination and some programs reported using it in multiple ways:
 - 43 examination contributed to the course grade
 - 17 passing exam score required to pass the capstone course
 - 9 passing score required, independent of a course, for successful completion
 - 28 results used for feedback; no impact on course grade or successful completion

Capstone Examination and Student Completion

14 associate degree programs reported a total of 45 students did not successfully complete the program due to failing the capstone exam

Accreditation

> 67 programs reported accreditation by ACEN, CCNE or both

Articulation Agreements

- Programs entered into articulation agreements with other degree granting program for graduates to progress to a baccalaureate or higher academic degree
 - 32 associate degree programs reported established articulation agreements.
 - 2 diploma programs reported established articulation agreements

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Drug Screening and Dismissals

- Programs requiring students to submit to a drug screen at any time during enrollment
 - 33 associate degree programs: 9 students dismissed from 3 programs
 - 22 baccalaureate degree programs: 1 student dismissed
 - 2 diploma programs: 0 dismissed
 - 2 direct entry graduate programs: 0 dismissed

- > 10 programs increase of 224
- > 14 programs decrease of 1,111
 - Net decrease 887

Program Expansion to Another Location and Enrollment Capacity Increase Projection

2 programs may expand to another location which could result in an increase of 220 seats

Teaching Assistants

> 53 programs reported using a total of 332 teaching assistants

Faculty Vacancy and Teaching Assistant Projections

- 144 faculty members and 36 teaching assistants vacated their positions during the reporting period
 - 20 reported compensation as the reason for leaving their positions
- 247 faculty members and 52 teaching assistants anticipate leaving their position in the next 5 years

Articulation Agreements

- > 34 programs have agreements with associate degree programs
 - 216 students completing PN programs in the prior reporting period articulated and enrolled in associate degree programs
- > 12 programs have agreements with baccalaureate degree programs
 - 16 students completing PN programs in the prior reporting period articulated and enrolled in baccalaureate degree programs

Admission and Readmission

- > 538 applicants met program admission, but were not offered admission
- 516 students were readmitted to programs

Student Dismissals

- > 1,048 dismissed for issues related to academic and/or clinical performance
- > 214 dismissed for violations of a student conduct policy; examples include:
 - 67 failure to attend
 - 25 unprofessional conduct
 - 7 substance use/abuse
 - 3 criminal conduct

Clinical Hours

Clinical hours ranged from 105 to 609. The average number of clinical hours was 370, a decrease from the average of 383 reported in the previous reporting period

- > 36 programs use high/moderate fidelity human patient simulators (computerized)
- Simulation laboratory hours range from 2 to 161 hours
 - Average 32 hours
 - Median 20 hours

Clinical Supervision: Faculty, Teaching Assistants, Preceptors and Ratios

- 52 programs use a combination of baccalaureate, associate, and diploma prepared nurses to supervise students during clinical experiences
- > 39 programs use preceptors

Clinical Ratios of Faculty or Teaching Assistant to Students

Capstone or Practicum Clinical Experience within the Curriculum

- 29 programs concluded its curriculum with a capstone course or practicum clinical experience
- Clinical hours for capstone course or practicum clinical experience ranged from 30 to 120 hours

Capstone Examination

- 66 programs reported using a capstone examination and some programs reported using it in multiple ways:
 - 23 contributes to the course grade
 - 14 passing score required to pass the capstone course
 - 4 passing score required, independent of the course, for successful completion
 - 28 results used only for feedback; no impact on the course grade or successful completion
- 14 programs reported a total of 74 students did not successfully complete their program due to failing the required capstone examination as a course or program requirement

Accreditation

- > 3 programs reported current ACEN (formerly NLNAC) accreditation
- > 17 reported they are considering ACEN accreditation

Drug Screening

> 44 programs require a drug screen of students any time during their program
