

In October 2010, the Institute of Medicine (IOM), in partnership with the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (RWJF), issued *The Future of Nursing: Leading Change, Advancing Health*, that set forth eight recommendations for nursing. In 2011, the Ohio Action Coalition (Coalition) joined the Future of Nursing Campaign for Action, to work with Coalitions throughout the country and with nursing organizations and interested parties across Ohio for the common goal of developing strategies to implement the IOM recommendations.

The Coalition has established a Steering Committee and five work groups. Board member Sue Morano and Executive Director Betsy Houchen, representing the Board, join representatives from nursing practice, education, administration, and other health care stakeholders, on the Steering Committee. The five work groups are Nursing Education; Scope of Practice; Leadership; Inter-professional Collaboration; and Data and Research.

At the Coalition meeting in June, Patricia Farmer, DNP, FNP-C, RN, Consultant to the Center to Champion Nursing in America (CCNA), presented four models for nursing education progression that were identified by CCNA after holding regional meetings with nurse educators and health care stakeholders from all 48 Coalitions. The presentation was based on Recommendation 4 of the IOM report:

"Increase the proportion of nurses with a baccalaureate degree to 80 percent by 2020. Academic nurse leaders across all schools of nursing

should work together to increase the proportion of nurses with a baccalaureate degree from 50 to 80 percent by 2020. These leaders should partner with education accrediting bodies, private and public funders, and employers to ensure funding, monitor progress, and increase the diversity of students to create a workforce prepared to meet the demands of diverse populations across the lifespan."

The Board strongly supports and encourages higher education for nurses, and is an active participant with the nursing community through the Steering Committee and the Coalition. This is a means by which the Board will continue to hear, discuss, and evaluate various strategies for promoting nurses' education. The Coalition presents an exciting opportunity for nursing collaboration to advance the IOM recommendations.

National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) for providing TERCAP® data and contributing to the development of a national database on nursing practice breakdown. Through this database, patterns of error, risk factors, and system issues that contribute to practice break-

down will be identified, and new approaches for patient safety can be developed.

Ohio is one of seventeen state nursing boards participating in the TERCAP® project this year. On behalf of the Board, Carol Ellensohn, Adjudication Coordinator, and Pam Morse, Compliance Agent, accepted the award at the TERCAP® Award Ceremony during the June NCSBN Attorney Investigator Conference.

TERCAP® (Taxonomy of Error, Root Cause Analysis and Practice-Responsibility) is the tool used to gather data and track cases involving practice breakdown.

The Ohio Board of Nursing is very proud to be one of the three states participating in the national Transition to Practice (TTP) study. The study, conducted by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN), is a longitudinal, multisite, randomized study designed to examine the effect of NCSBN's TTP model on safety and quality outcomes for newly licensed nurses transitioning to practice. The other states participating are Illinois and North Carolina.

The study is a three-year project. Phase I, for newly licensed RNs in acute care facilities, began July 1, 2011 and will continue through December 31, 2012. The primary objective of this Phase is to determine if a standardized transition program for RNs in hospital settings has an effect on patient safety and quality outcomes.

Phase II, which began April 1, 2012, is for RNs and LPNs in nonhospital facilities, such as long-term care, public health, ambulatory care and home health. It continues through September 30, 2013. The objective for Phase II is to determine if the TTP model can be used at various sites of nursing practice. The ultimate goal is to identify a model that works well over time to improve nursing practice and patient safety.

SCHEDULE II PRESCRIBING FAQS

Substitute Senate Bill 83 (SB 83), which became law on June 8, 2012, expands the scope of schedule II prescribing for Advanced Practice Nurses (APNs) who hold a certificate to prescribe (CTP). The following are frequently asked questions related to SB 83 and the requirements for CTP holders.

1. I am an APN with a certificate to prescribe (CTP). Can I begin prescribing schedule II controlled substances, as authorized by SB 83 or must I wait for rules to be adopted?

As of June 8, 2012, the effective date of the bill, APNs with a CTP or CTP-E were authorized to prescribe in accordance with SB 83 and the revised Formulary. The June 8, 2012 revised Formulary includes the schedule II prescribing parameters and is available on the Board web site at www. nursing.ohio.gov (click on Advanced Practice Nurses).

Remember, Ohio law requires that the standard care arrangement include the APN's "scope of prescribing practices." APNs with a CTP or CTP-E who intend to begin prescribing schedule IIs according to the expanded authority set forth in SB 83 will need to update this section of their standard care arrangement as indicated before prescribing schedule IIs. The law also requires that an APN's collaborating physician's practice involve the care and treatment of patients who may require schedule II controlled substances. These requirements have existed for some time and are not new requirements

2. How does the bill change the prescribing of schedule II controlled substances?

As of June 8, 2012, a CTP or CTP-E holder who is practicing in a location The Board encourages APNs and other interested parties to periodically check the Board website for additional information regarding implementation of SB 83, draft administrative rules, and the work of the Committee on Prescriptive Governance (CPG).

specified in the bill is no longer subject to the 24-hour supply restrictions in the preexisting law governing an APN's authority to prescribe schedule II controlled substances. However, CTP and CTP-E holders who are not practicing in one of the specified locations must follow the restrictions: prescribing of schedule II controlled substances is limited to a 24-hour emergency supply of medications, prescribed to terminally ill patients with respect to whom the collaborating physician has previously prescribed the medication.

3. What are the locations specified in SB 83 where CTP holders may prescribe schedule II controlled substances?

The law lists the locations where CTP holders may prescribe schedule II controlled substances in accordance with their specialty certification, standard care arrangement and the Formulary. The list is provided below.

CAUTION: CTP and CTP-E holders are prohibited from prescribing a schedule II $controlled\ substance\ from\ a\ convenience\ care$ clinic even if the clinic is owned or operated by an entity specified in the list below, with the exception of prescriptions limited to a 24-hour supply as set forth in existing law.

CAUTION: CTP and CTP-E holders who are not engaged in practice in one of the listed locations are limited in their prescribing of schedule II controlled substances to a 24 hour emergency supply of medica-

tions to terminally ill patients with respect to whom the collaborating physician has previously prescribed the medication.

The locations specified in law are as follows:

- (1) A hospital registered with the Department of Health;
- (2) An entity owned or controlled, in whole or in part, by a hospital or by an entity that owns or controls, in whole or in part, one or more hospitals;
- (3) A health care facility operated by the Department of Mental Health or the Department of Developmental Disabilities;
- (4) A nursing home licensed by the Department of Health or a political
- (5) A county home or district home that is certified under the Medicare or Medicaid program;
- (6) A hospice care program;
- (7) A community mental health facility;
- (8) An ambulatory surgical facility;
- (9) A freestanding birthing center;
- (10) A federally qualified health center;
- (11) A federally qualified health center look-alike:
- (12) A health care office or facility operated by a board of health or an authority having the duties of a board of health;
- (13) A site where a medical practice is operated, but only if the practice is comprised of one or more physicians who are also owners of the practice, the practice is organized to provide direct

patient care, and the APN providing services at the site has a standard care arrangement and collaborates with at least one of the physician owners who practices primarily at that site. (Entering into a standard care arrangement and practicing in collaboration are requirements of current law governing the practice of APNs).

4. I have heard that convenience care clinics are not one of the locations covered by SB 83.

This is correct. CTP holders are prohibited from prescribing a schedule II controlled substance from a convenience care clinic even if the clinic is owned or operated by an entity specified in the list above, with the exception of prescriptions limited to a 24-hour supply as set forth in existing law.

5. I'm not sure if the facility in which I prescribe is a location covered by the bill?

If you are not certain whether your practice location falls within those identified in SB 83, contact the facility or organization's administrator or legal counsel to advise you. As an APN with prescriptive authority, you are ultimately responsible for knowing and practicing according to the applicable laws and administrative rules.

6. Will there be new rules for prescribing schedule II controlled substances in accordance with SB 83?

The Board will amend the current administrative rules to address the expanded prescribing authority for schedule II drugs. continued on page 10

The Board will also adopt a new rule to specify the continuing education (CE) requirements. These rules are being developed with an anticipated effective date of no later than November 5, 2012. When the new and amended rules are in effect, you must meet those requirements.

7. Since I am currently an APN with a CTP, must I take the required CE course prior to prescribing in accordance with SB 83?

CTP and CTP-E holders are not required to complete the CE course prior to prescribing schedule IIs according to SB 83. However, all CTP and CTP-E holders must complete the CE no later than August 31, 2013.

The Board is planning an effective date of no later than November 5, 2012 for the CE rule, to provide ample time for CTP and CTP-E holders to complete the required six hours of CE before August 31, 2013.

8. The facility where I practice is requiring me to complete the CE course prior to allowing me to prescribe in accordance with SB 83.

Employers or institutions that grant APNs practice privileges may establish their own policies and APNs need to know and follow their employer or institution's policies.

9. How will I find a CE course on schedule II controlled substances?

The CE course must meet the Board's requirements for continuing education, as specified in Rule 4723-14-05 (A), OAC. (For details, go to the Board web site at www. nursing.ohio.gov and click on Laws and Rules.) For example, a CE activity that has been approved by an Ohio Board of Nursing (OBN) Approver is acceptable. A list of OBN Approvers is located on the Board web site (click on Continuing Education). The Board itself will not provide this CE.

10. When will the CE on schedule II controlled substance prescribing be available?

The earliest an approved CE course may be offered would be the effective date of new Rule 4723-9-13, OAC. The Board is expediting the rulemaking process so the new rule should be effective no later than November 5, 2012 to allow ample time to complete the CE course by the required date of August 31, 2013.

While a CE activity cannot be approved prior to the effective date of the rule, a CE provider could develop and verify course content prior to the effective date of the rule, so that it would be possible that final approval for the CE event could be granted on or after the effective date of the rule.

11.Can I take any controlled substance prescribing course for purposes of meeting the **CE** requirement by August 31, 2013?

You must take a CE course that meets the requirements of new Rule 4723-9-13, OAC, (planned to be effective no later than October 31, 2012) and that meets the requirements for CE, as specified in Rule 4723-14-05 (A), OAC. (See www.nursing.ohio. gov and click on Laws and Rules.)

12. I do not currently prescribe controlled substances and have no intention of prescribing schedule II controlled substances. Do I still have to take the six- hour CE course?

Yes, all APNs with a CTP must complete the CE course no later than August 31, 2013 to renew their CTP. APNs with a CTP-E must complete the CE course no later than August 31, 2013.

13. I am presently in a nurse practitioner program at a university and have already completed the Advanced Pharmacology course required for my CTP-E application, but I did not receive my CTP-E until after June 8, 2012 which was the effective date of the new law. Will I need to complete the CE course on schedule II controlled substances?

Yes, due to the timing of your situation, you will be required to complete the six hours of CE on schedule II controlled substances.

14. I am entering a nurse practitioner education program in the fall of 2012 at a local university. Will I need to take

the CE for schedule II prescribing before qualifying for a CTP-E?

As part of the advanced practice nurse education program, you must complete a 45-hour Advanced Pharmacology course that is to be provided during your education program. The Advanced Pharmacology course content is established in Ohio law and rules, and it must be completed within three years of applying for a CTP-E.

SB 83 requires that the Advanced Pharmacology course now include content specific to schedule II controlled substances. The Board will also amend its rule related to the Advanced Pharmacology course to require content related to prescribing schedule II controlled substances. The rule amendment will not increase the required 45-hours, but may require education programs to adjust their course content.

15. Is there anything that I need to do with my current **DEA registration before I begin** prescribing schedule II drugs?

It depends on your current DEA registration. If your current DEA registration limits you to prescribe schedule III - V controlled substances and you plan to incorporate the prescribing of schedule IIs into your practice, you will need to contact the DEA for further instruction on how to revise your registration to include the prescription of schedule II drugs. The DEA website is www.deadiversion.usdoj.gov.

The Board encourages APNs and other interested parties to periodically check the Board website for additional information regarding implementation of SB 83, draft administrative rules, and the work of the Committee on Prescriptive Governance (CPG). A CONVERSATION WITH THE TRANSITION TO PRACTICE[™] (TTP) STUDY STATISTICIAN

[This June 2012 Transition to Practice Newsletter is reprinted with permission of NCSBN. The TTP study is examining the effect of the NCSBN TTP model on safety and quality outcomes for newly licensed nurses transitioning to practice. Below is an interview with Louis Fogg, PhD, the study's statistician. The interview explains how Phase I and Phase II objectives are being tested and measured. In order to better understand the TTP study design from a statistical perspective, we turn to Louis Fogg, PhD, associate professor, Community Systems & Mental In order for the method of differences to work, you literally have to have a control group in your design. Essentially, after we do the first analysis of the TTP study, we will not have another chance.

Health Nursing, Rush University College of Nursing. In this interview, Fogg emphasizes the significance of the control group and the benefit of completing the study in two separate phases with different primary objectives.

Why is the control group so important for the TTP study? Historically, control groups emanated from a theory of science

called the method of differences. With this method, you hold all but one thing the same in two different conditions. Then, if you see changes in the two conditions, it means that the one different thing was the cause of those changes. Most people would agree that the method of differences is the strongest method of drawing causal inference. In order for the method

of differences to work, you literally have to have a control group in your design. Essentially, after we do the first analysis of the TTP study, we will not have another chance. Once the model is instituted, it's very hard to find places where people aren't exposed to it.

The primary objective of Phase I is to determine whether or not a standardized transition program for registered nurses (RNs) in hospital settings has an effect on patient safety and quality outcomes. Inclusive of both RNs and licensed practical/vocational nurses (LPN/LVNs) in long-term care, home health, ambulatory care and public health settings, the primary objective of Phase II is to determine the feasibility of implementing a standardized transition program for new graduate nurses in nonhospital settings.

How will these differences in primary objectives influence your analysis? There are two ways of testing interventions. One is whether the intervention works in the ideal setting. For instance, if we were testing a medication, we would try to make sure that our patients were the same in both groups because that gives us the best information as to whether the medication works all by itself in one specific context. So that, in a sense, is the first part of our study, Phase I. We are choosing the context where we have lots of information on patient safety that is collected whether we are doing

the study or not. Hospitals collect a lot of interesting information on how well their patients are doing, and how well they are performing. That's one of the reasons why Phase I is going to be a very good test of whether TTP works as a treatment in this idealized setting.

The second question is whether the same thing that works in an idealized setting is generalizable to all settings, including those where it might not be ideal to use the treatment. Again, thinking about a medication, if you try that same medication that worked in the hospital in a remote place where there isn't a lot of medical care and monitoring, does it still work? Will you still be able to get reasonable results even in a context that is less than ideal? That's what Phase II of our study, the feasibility study, is about. It's going into a context where nurses work, where we might not be able to get quite as good data on essentially how well the intervention works, but where we can see if it does work there - if people can use it and if we can show some evidence of beneficial effects. This will give us important information on whether we can take this TTP model and generalize it across the whole scope of nursing practice, or if we have to restrict it to some areas and not others. The ultimate goal is to find a program that works really well and will over time, protect patients and make nursing practice better. •

CAN ACTIONS OUTSIDE THE WORKPLACE RESULT IN PROFESSIONAL DISCIPLINE?

When a nurse puts away her ID badge and steps outside the confines of the workplace, the nurse's conduct can still result in licensure discipline. Criminal conduct, drug use, behaviors that reasonably suggest a mental or physical impairment, and a failure to maintain professional boundaries can result in professional discipline even if they are committed off the clock. Such actions often have an affect on a nurse's ability to practice, and thus require scrutiny from the Board.

The Board can initiate disciplinary proceedings against any nurse who has been convicted of, pled guilty to, or received treatment in lieu of conviction for, any felony or any drug law violation. It does not matter whether the incident involved a bar fight, domestic dispute, retail theft, or smoking marijuana in the privacy of one's home. If the conduct was deemed serious enough to be considered a felony, or if a drug law was violated, then the Board can discipline a licensee. In fact, if the crime was both a felony and was drug-related, the Board is required by law to immediately suspend the nursing license.

Misdemeanor convictions, even those unrelated to drug use, may also result in discipline if the underlying conduct constitutes gross immorality or moral turpitude or are committed in the course of practice. Regarding the former, the Board reviews each case individually and determines whether the underlying facts and circumstances involved in the crime meet this standard. While these determinations require a legal analysis, as a general rule, the greater the depravity involved in the criminal act, the more likely the crime will be considered gross immorality or moral turpitude.

Drug use that does not involve criminal prosecution may also result in discipline. In some instances, law enforcement may determine that incidental drug use is not a significant priority when compared to more serious crimes. However, the Nurse Practice Act prohibits the use of any illegal or prescription drug that is used in any way not in accordance with a legal, valid prescription. Thus, borrowing a friend's Xanax during a stressful time, or taking Vicodin in excess of the prescribed amount is a disciplinary offense. It is not a defense for a nurse to claim that the drug use occurred while on vacation, or that the drugs did not come from a patient or the nurse's place of employment.

Conduct outside the workplace may also suggest that a nurse is engaging in the habitual use of chemical substances, or suffers from a mental or physical disability that may impair the ability to practice. Such examples include: a nurse who has been involved in one or more alcohol related incidents such as DUI, or disorderly conduct where alcohol or drugs were a contributing factor; a nurse may have required a recent hospitalization for mental health treatment; or an intemperate Facebook post such as, "I've just had six shots and I'm ready to go to work," or "Sometimes I just wish I could pull the plug on some of these patients." Such actions will lead to a Board investigation. In most impairment investigations, the Board will require the nurse to obtain a professional evaluation, at the nurse's expense, to determine if the nurse is safe to practice. Like all Board investigations, impairment investigations are confidential, and will not be disclosed unless the Board makes a formal finding that the nurse is impaired.

Another disciplinary pitfall involves a failure to maintain professional boundaries with a patient. Obviously a romantic relationship with a patient, even on a nurse's day off, is an ethical violation, but this principle also extends to romantic relationships with family members, particularly members of the patient's household. While patient expressions of thanks in the form of thank-you cards are acceptable, receiving cash loans or other forms of monetary gain that do not involve the practice of nursing are prohibited. Even when these romantic or financial transactions occur with the best of intentions, or with the patient's full consent, they represent a conflict of interest in patient care and, due to actual or perceived impropriety, adversely affect the practice of nursing.

Engaging in drug use, violent or intemperate behavior, or other actions that suggest a nurse cannot be entrusted with the responsibility to care for patients is a serious concern. Even when these actions occur on a nurse's free time. such behaviors often manifest themselves while at work. In order to protect the public, and enforce the conditions of licensure set forth in law, the Board is obligated to investigate, and if necessary, revoke, suspend, or otherwise limit the practice of nurses who fail to adhere to professional standards. •

LPN Renewal

If you hold a current, valid license as an LPN in Ohio, your license will expire after August 31, 2012. All LPNs who are eligible to renew their license in 2012 were sent a renewal notice through the mail at the end of March to the address of record with the Board. If you were notified of an audit of your continuing education for the period of September 1, 2008 through August 31, 2010 and you did not submit the information required by the Board, you will not receive your renewal notice for 2012-2014 until you complete the audit requirements.

The format for the renewal notice is different this year. Instead of a letter, you received a perforated sealed envelope. This included your personal ID, password, and instructions on how to renew your license. When renewing online you can pay the required application fee using Master Card or VISA credit cards, or debit cards with a MC or VISA logo. By utilizing the online renewal process, you may be able to verify the renewal of your license through the Board's website at www.nursing.ohio.gov in as little as three business days after completing the online renewal application. LPNs who do not want to renew their license online must submit a written request for a paper renewal application by e-mail at renewal@nursing.ohio.gov, fax at (614) 466-0388, or by mailing the request to the Board. Telephone requests will not be accepted.

It is strongly recommended that you renew your license as soon as possible. Incomplete applications may result in late or lapsed fee charges, and delay the renewal of your license. Renewal fees are as follows: Before July 1, 2012 - \$65

July 1, 2012 through August 31, 2012 (processing late application fee) - \$115

After August 31, 2012 - you must request a reinstatement packet

If you have had a name and/or address change, please notify the Board immediately. An incorrect name and/or address may delay the renewal of your license. Board staff are available to assist you in taking the necessary steps to renew your license. Name/Address Changes



How do I change my name with the Board?

You must submit a certified document of a name change (marriage certificate/abstract, divorce decree/dissolution, name change document) within thirty days of the change. Certified documents can be obtained from the court where the original record was filed. Photocopies or notarized copies are not acceptable for a name change. Submit your certified document with a "Name/Address Change Form" or with a brief letter which includes your Ohio license/certificate number, your previous name, your new name as you want it to appear on Board records, your current address, county and telephone number. A Name/Address Change Form is available on the Board's website at www.nursing.ohio.gov at the "Change Your Name/Address" link. Any name change documents must be mailed to the Board. The Board will return your certified document. There is no fee for a name change.

How do I change my address with the Board?

Address changes must be submitted in writing within thirty days of the change. Submit your address change with a "Name/Address Change Form" or with a brief letter, which includes your name, Ohio license/certificate number, address, county and telephone number. A Name/Address Change Form is available on the Board's website at www.nursing.ohio. gov at the "Change Your Name/Address" link. If you wish to verify that your address has been changed, call the Board at (614) 466-3947 for verbal verification. There is no fee for an address change.

BOARD DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS

- Permanent Revocation = Prohibited from ever practicing nursing or dialysis care, or working as a certified community health worker or certified medication aide.
- Indefinite Suspension = Indefinitely prohibited from practicing for a specified minimum period of time. The Board will reinstate only if all conditions for reinstatement, set at the time the action was taken, are met.
- Automatic Suspension = Suspension for a violation of a consent agreement or Board order or suspension required by law for commission of a specified felony.
- **Immediate Suspension** = Suspension required by law for a felony drug abuse offense.
- Indefinite suspension with a stay = On "probation." May practice if the license status is active but will be monitored by the Board under conditions and restrictions.
- Restrictions = Limits such as prohibition from passing narcotics or working in certain areas of practice.
- Reprimand = Least amount of discipline, Acknowledgment that what the nurse, dialysis technician or community health worker did was wrong. Does not prohibit practice.
- Voluntary surrender = May not ever practice again. Permanent action following a formal agreement by the nurse, dialysis technician, medication aide or community health worker to give up the license or certificate.
- **Fines** = A fine of up to \$500 imposed for each violation.




