






## **Study Found \$5.5 Million in Potential Savings**

The Auditor of State's office took a close look at the heavy equipment and vehicles used by the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) across the state's 88 counties. Of the 4,100 pieces of inventory evaluated, the study found that several types of equipment were significantly underused.



Auditor of State Dave Yost recommended ODOT sell the underused equipment for an estimated savings of \$5.2 million. An additional \$312,000 annually would be saved in maintenance costs.

### **Equipment Used As Little As 1 Day A Month**

Auditor of State Dave Yost's first-of-its-kind study in Ohio focused on underused equipment at 24 local governments in Lake County. The analysis revealed that some equipment is used as little as 3% of the time or about one day in a month.

County governments worked with the Auditor of State's office to implement an equipment sharing website (see back page) for cost savings and efficiency.

#### **ODOT Underutilized Vehicles & Equipment**




Light Dump Trucks (10%)



Passenger Cars (19%)








Heavy Equipment (42%)

AOS evaluated the utilization of approximately 4,100 vehicles and pieces of equipment across Ohio. The specific analysis is of 2,522 vocational vehicles, 145 light dump trucks, 458 passenger cars, 560 tractors, and 424 pieces of heavy equipment.

Lake County Equipment Utilization



AOS studied more than 1,000 pieces of equipment in nine cities, nine villages, five townships and Lake County. The study focused on 390 pieces of seasonal and non-seasonal equipment used for road repair, utility

maintenance and construction.
