While many wounded, ill, and injured servicemembers return to duty, many separate from service and look forward to contributing as productive members of our society. These highly-trained professionals are ready to contribute to your agency. You can help them get there by considering their qualifications matched to your human capital needs.

How do I hire a wounded warrior?

While you can hire wounded, ill, and injured Soldiers and Veterans through the traditional government hiring process, federal hiring authorities and internship opportunities are available to expedite hiring and other opportunities for wounded servicemembers. Additionally, hiring these Veterans helps you meet the intent of two Executive Orders.

- EO13518: Employment of Veterans in the Federal Government
- EO 13548: Increasing Federal Employment of Individuals with Disabilities

FEDERAL INTERNSHIPS

Establishing an internship is exceptionally valuable for both the Soldier and the federal agency.

- Operation Warfighter is a program through the Office of the Secretary of Defense (OSD) allowing wounded, ill, and injured servicemembers to complete internships at federal agency offices. Contact the Operation Warfighter program manager at warriorcare@osd.mil to learn more about creating internship opportunities.
- Non-Paid Work Experience (NPWE) is a Department of Veterans Affairs
 (VA) program that allows federal agencies to provide valuable experience
 to wounded, ill, and injured Veterans. At no cost to the agency and without
 counting against FTEs, NPWE helps Veterans strengthen skills on-the-job,
 with the ultimate goal of helping them obtain full-time permanent employment.
