VA Update: Veteran's First Visit to a VA Medical Center

"Doubts" is a four-minute video of a recent Operation Iraqi Freedom Veteran who reluctantly comes to the Department of Veterans (VA) expecting a negative experience. To his surprise, he encounters a VA staff comprised of compassionate employees focused on his needs who exceed his expectations of VA customer service.

The purpose of this four-minute video reinforces the commitment of the VA: knowing Veterans' specific needs and understands the specifics to deploying in Afghanistan and Iraq. "Doubts" depicts the VA's commitment to today's Veterans. You can enhance the video's impact by sharing your experience to educate staff on your deployment and service through social media outlets.

It features the VA Medical Center in Los Angeles, California.

The first entry point is the reception desk directing the Soldier to their medical screening and then working with VSO to learn about their benefits.

ACAP: New Tools for Army Transition

The Army Career and Alumni Program (ACAP), the Army's long standing transition program, is using cutting edge technology to provide a choice-based service for Soldiers. In addition to traditional walk-in ACAP centers, Soldiers can now receive services through the 24/7 call center and the virtual center.

By calling the ACAP call center at (800) 325-4715, Soldiers and their Family members can connect with qualified ACAP counselors at any point in their transition. The counselors can assist with the completion of the preparation checklist, resume writing and job searching, interview preparation, provide employment readiness training, provide contact information for benefit providers, and so much more.

Soldiers and Family members also have the option of utilizing innovative online technology to meet their transition needs with the ACAP virtual center. The virtual center is an online interactive environment that allows Soldiers to use a character avatar to navigate around the center. Participants can interact with live ACAP counselors through instant messaging, voice capabilities, or even video chat. Counselors are available 24/7 to assist Soldiers and Family members with any transition questions. Regardless of whether Soldiers are posted at a traditional Army facility or in remote locations around the globe, ACAP services are just a phone call or a mouse click away. ACAP services are available to you on your time.
