CAREER & EDUCATION: Everyone Should Have a Mentor

According to Webster's Dictionary a "mentor" is a wise and faithful counselor or monitor. The longer I work for the federal government the more I'm convinced that everyone needs a mentor. This is especially true for AW2 Soldiers entering the workforce after months and sometimes years of healing and rehabilitation and for spouses who have stayed home to raise children or support their spouses during their recovery.

According to Pat Williams and Jim Denney, from their "Secrets of Success" article, there are 10 ways to select a mentor. They are:

1. Look at the people you know

- 2. Consider people you've never met
- 3. Select a mentor who is a good role model
- 4. Select a mentor who is a good listener
- 5. Select a mentor who levels with you
- 6. Look for someone who is unlike you in some important way
- 7. Be open to finding a mentor in unlikely places
- 8. If the person doesn't know you, approach that person with a brief letter of introduction
- 9. Make personal contact
- 10. Remember, you are never too old to be mentored

AW2 Soldiers, Veterans, and Family members have two additional ways to obtain a mentor. They can ask their AW2 Advocate for assistance or ask their Advocate to contact the AW2 Career and Education Section for assistance.

It's never too late to find a mentor and it's definitely never too early to do so either. While becoming a protégé does not guarantee advancement in a career, it may lead to more informed decisions about the future through learning about the mentor's life and career lessons.

CAREER: Illegal and Legal Job Interview Questions

Federal, state, and local laws regulate the questions a prospective employer may ask. An employer's questions must be related to the job. Many illegal questions are about nationality, religion, age, marital and Family status, gender, health and physical abilities, and transportation. The best option when asked an illegal question is to examine the intent behind the question and respond with an answer as it might apply to the job. For an example, an illegal question is, "Do you have any disabilities?" If the interviewer thoroughly described the job, the legal version of that question is, "Are you able to perform the essential functions of this job with or without reasonable accommodations?" MONEY MATTERS: Personal Financial Management Programs

Financial Readiness Program in the Army is a personal financial management program. These programs can help you keep your finances in good shape and

provide counselors who can help you save for the future, improve your credit, and resolve financial problems. The military's personal financial management programs can help you learn how to reduce debt, save more, and keep your finances in order. They can also help you get on your feet, start investing for the future, and be more financially sound.

BENEFITS: Preferred Payment In The Annual CRSC/CRDP Open Season

Retirees eligible for both Concurrent Retirement and Disability Payment (CRDP) and Combat-Related Special Compensation (CRSC) can choose the preferred payment in the annual CRSC/CRDP open season. Federal law states eligible retirees can receive either CRDP or CRSC; not both. Each December, eligible retirees receive a CRDP/CRSC open season election form. The form includes a comparison of the CRDP and CRSC entitlement amounts, as well as information about the collection actions and taxes.

The retiree needs to return the form only if making a change. No action is required to keep things the way they are. The open season ends on January 31. If you have questions on the open season, you can call (800) 321-1080 or (216) 522-5955 from 7 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. ET, Monday through Friday.

MEDICAL BENEFITS: Special Monthly Compensation for Eligible Women Veterans

A special review was conducted of all records of women Veterans granted service connection for injury or disease of the breast and/or reproductive system. The review, completed on April 16, 2009, yielded the names of 1,769 women Veterans who were granted service connection for mastectomy under diagnostic code 7626 and/or hysterectomy under diagnostic codes 7617, 7618, and 7619, but are not receiving special monthly compensation (SMC) as warranted under 38 U.S.C. § 1114(k)/38 C.F.R. § 3.350(a).

VA UPDATE: Emergency Education Benefit Payments on VA Web Site

The VA's 57 regional benefits offices are processing on-the-spot emergency payments up to \$3,000 to students who have applied for their education benefits but who have not yet received a government payment. Veteran-students can

request courtesy transportation to VA regional benefits offices or can now apply online at www.va.gov. The online application will guide Veterans through the process to supply needed information. Online applicants will receive their emergency payments through the mail after processing.

The emergency checks are an advance on each student's education benefits, and the amount will be deducted from future benefits payments. Checks will be written at the regional offices for Veterans who bring a photo ID and evidence of their enrollment. VA officials emphasize that \$3,000 is the maximum payment, with many Veterans receiving smaller payments based upon their likely monthly education benefits.

VA UPDATE: VA Mistakenly Sends ALS Letters to Veterans

VA sent notification letters to Veterans with Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS) advising them of their potential eligibility for disability compensation benefits. On August 13, 2009, VA sent outreach letters to 1,864 Veterans and survivors across the country. Unfortunately, VA made a coding error and a number of Veterans who should not have received this letter did. The Department is reviewing individual claims files for all the recipients of this letter to identify those who received it by mistake.VA employees are calling Veterans and survivors to ensure that they understand the purpose of the letter, explain why they mistakenly received the letter, and express VA's sincere apologies for the distress caused by this unfortunate and regrettable error. FAMILY: New DoD Online Library Resources

New library databases purchased this year greatly enriched the online library content to military servicemembers and Families, regardless of where they live or are stationed. Over the Internet you can borrow, read, and return library materials 24 hours a day/7 days a week. These databases are easily assessable at several military portals including Military OneSource and AKO. The databases offer downloadable e-books and audio books in various subject areas, test preparation including practice tests, resume and college planning, auto repair guides/schematics, home and small engine repair (lawn mowers, motor bikes, etc.) and children's e-books and audio/video material in various languages for reading/listening pleasure and comprehension support.
