Jewett: Explained the Executive Summary of the Remedial Investigation and Feasibility Study (RI/FS). See attached	Minter: How does this document align with our recommendation?
It aligns on specific topics. Some are not in the scope.	
We have been meeting with the OEPA for several months. We have developed several drafts. We had a meeting to settle on all the	

questions and comments.

That is correct. The public will not be able to comment until the Proposed Plan is issued and the estimated date is May. The public will get to make their comments probably late summer.

These comments are not from the public, when do they get to comment on the document?

We have certain notices that we are required to do. We will have a meeting to allow them to make their comments. This will allow them to make comments or submit their comments by fax, email, mail, or phone.

How will the public get to make comments on the document?

Carr: The RI/FS does not make the decision of the OSDC.

Galanti: DOE is required to put together a plan. We will agree on the ratio of the disturbance. There are different ways to preserve them. You can put wetlands money in the bank or mitigate streams onsite or offsite. Once the ROD comes out, we can sit down and discuss this.

Huber: What happens about the overall disturbance, such as the wetlands and ponds?
