# Ohio Veterans Hall of Fame Class of 2013 include two former National Guard members

(Columbus, Ohio) – On Nov. 7, 2013, at the Franklin County Veterans Memorial in Columbus, Ohio, 15 Ohio Veterans will be inducted into the Hall of Fame Class of 2013. The bronze plaques representing each of the classes inducted are permanently on display at the Vern Riffe Building, second Floor, located at 77 South High Street in Columbus. Two of this year's inductees are former members of the Ohio Army and Air National Guard.

The Veterans Hall of Fame honors Ohio Veterans who made a positive impact in their community after serving in the U.S. Armed Forces.



Steve Butcher (Gulf War Era), retired from the Ohio Air National Guard as a senior master sergeant. Upon his retirement, he and his wife opened a small candy store in Pataskala that is now a thriving full-service restaurant. Twice each year,

on dates close to Memorial Day and Veterans Day, Butcher's Restaurant serves free meals to Veterans all day as a "thank you" to those who have served. Steve also served on various city boards and committees. He was elected mayor of Pataskala in 2005 and was re-elected to a second term in 2009. As mayor, he has been involved in the creation of "Veterans Green," a public green space adjacent to the city's Veterans Memorial. "The Green" is also now the permanent home of the local Chamber of Commerce's farmers market. Steve was also instrumental in raising funds for the renovation of the city's old theater, the establishment of a local museum, and the reopening of a mothballed swimming pool for area children. Steve Butcher's civic leadership and contributions to Veteran advocacy have impacted the Pataskala community in a large and significant

Roger Gardner (Korean War Era and Vietnam War Era) is a Veteran of service both in the active Army and the Ohio Army National Guard. Since 1957, he has been a member the American Legion Post 540 Honor Guard in Cortland, and served as commander and captain since 2000. Under his leadership, the honor guard has participated in 2,281 funerals. Roger is an active participant in Memorial Day and Veterans Day activities each year, to include placing flags on the graves of Veterans in six cemeteries throughout Trumbull County. As commander of American Legion Post 540, Roger was instrumental in the construction of several Veterans' memorials in the area, most notably the Korean War Monument in Trumbull County Veterans Park. He is also a member of the VA's Volunteer Service and volunteers for the Warren Community Based Outpatient Clinic, where he has logged over 2,300 volunteer hours, in addition to nearly 6,000 volunteer hours at the Youngstown VA clinic. Roger is a frequent speaker in the "Tell America" program in six local school districts, sharing his military experiences and encouraging patriotism among young people. Roger was recently named Mahoning County United Veterans Council Veteran of the Year, and has been honored with



the Tri-County Funeral Directors Association Award for Community Service for his work as captain of Post 540's honor guard. He has also received the Warren Tribune-Chronicle Community Star Award for his many contributions to the Warren area. Roger Gardner exemplifies caring and commitment to continue serving the Veterans of Trumbull County.

## TRICARE Pharmacy

TRICARE prescription drug coverage is available to all TRICARE-eligible beneficiaries who are enrolled in the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS).

- Active duty service members and their Families
- Activated National Guard and Reserve members and their Families
- Retired service members and their Families
- Retired National Guard and Reserve Members (age 60 and above and receiving retired pay) and their Families
- Survivors, widows/widowers and certain former spouses
- Medal of Honor recipients and their Families
- Beneficiaries who have purchased care under one of the following programs:
  - ♦ TRICARE Reserve Select
  - ♦ TRICARE Retired Reserve
  - ♦ TRICARE Young Adult
  - ♦ Continued Health Care Benefit Program
- Other beneficiaries listed in DEERS as eligible for TRICARE, including foreign force members and their Families.

When updating DEERS with your personal information, be sure and list a physical address. If living outside of the United States, list your APO/FPO address, if you have one, as your mailing address.
